# Are students with disabilities receiving equitable services and supports?

#### DEFINITION

This Performance Indicator displays whether the NJDOE identified the local educational agency (LEA) for significant discrepancy in the rate of suspensions and expulsions of greater than 10 days in a school year for students with disabilities (SWD).

The New Jersey Department of Education (NJDOE) defines significant discrepancy as having a rate of suspensions and expulsions of greater than 10 days in a school year for children with IEPs that is more than three times the State average. Additionally, a LEA must serve at least 30 children (n-size\*) with IEPs and issue 10 or more days of out-of-school suspensions or expulsions to at least 10 children with individualized education programs (IEPs) in a school year to be considered for significant discrepancy, as LEAs with small numbers of children with IEPs were found to distort percentages.
