DEFINITION

Percentage of children with IEPs ages 3, 4 and 5 (who are enrolled in a preschool program) and receive special education and related services in the following settings:

- Indicator 6A. Regular preschool setting.
- Indicator 6B. Separate special education setting (class, school, or residential facility).
- Indicator 6C. Home setting.

States must report five-year-old children with disabilities who are enrolled in kindergarten in this indicator. Five-year-old children with disabilities who are enrolled in preschool programs are included in Indicator 6. (20 U.S.C. 1416(a)(3) (A))
