Status updates were given on: Comprehensive Coordinated Early Intervening Services (CCEIS), Mediators, Ombudsman, Dyslexia and the Dyslexia Handbook, IEP Tool Sheets, Telepractice, DLM Science, IEP Facilitation (data and statistics), and Complaint Investigation. Lorelei Drew-Nevola, Director of the Office of Special Education Professional Development (OSEPD) will present her update at the November SSEAC meeting.

VI. COUNCIL DISCUSSION

The Council discussed potential topics for future monthly meetings. Suggestions were: Communications Accessibility Standards, Use of Robots, DLM Science requirements, Child Study Teams (CSTs), Paraprofessionals, Dyslexia Handbook, Career Readiness, Dare to Dream, and Restorative Justice.
