Below are key points summarizing my testimony on Friday for the clean and renewable power stakeholder meeting. The points will be backed up with detail and data.

Strong support of the Governor's commitment to 100% clean energy economy by 2050 for all the reasons laid out in EO 28 and then some-good for the economy, the environment, jobs, public health, private property, consumers' pocketbooks,... . Clean means clean, nuclear free and carbon free.

The definition of clean needs to be flexible between now and 2050 to the degree necessary for existing sources but not for sources of carbon or nuclear. We can't afford the latter.

The most significant obstacles getting to 100% clean energy by 2050 are inertia and fossil fuel and nuclear interests. The state needs to provide strong leadership to counter and address this.

The state needs to implement aggressively the renewable and energy efficiency portfolio standards, community solar, battery storage, offshore wind goals, mass transit, etc. policies as articulated in EO 28 and the zero emission vehicle standards from New Jersey's 2003 clean car law.

Environmental justice is critical. Overburdened communities need to get their fair share and then some of economic and environmental benefits to begin to offset past discrimination
