Announcement of 2020-2021 Challenge Winner

For the 2020-2021 flu season, the New Jersey Department of Health (NJDOH) Vaccine Preventable Disease Program (VPDP) continued the fourth annual New Jersey College & University Flu Challenge.

The Challenge aims to increase awareness surrounding the importance of flu vaccination for students attending facilities of higher education. Young adults have been shown to have lower flu immunization coverage rates as compared to other age groups. Although many students attended classes virtually due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the importance of flu vaccination remained.

In New Jersey's fourth Challenge, eight schools participated in the campaign (listed below), divided into three categories (small, medium, and large schools). The winners of the Challenge were determined based on the highest percentage of students self-reporting that they received the flu vaccine for the current flu season. We are happy to announce the winners of this year's Challenge: **The College of New Jersey** (large schools), **Seton Hall University** (medium schools), and **Centenary University** (small schools).
