

HPV Vaccination is Cancer Prevention

- HPV (Human Papillomavirus) is a group of common viruses that can be spread by intimate skin-to-skin contact during sexual activity with an infected person.

 85% of people will get an HI
- ► HPV can lead to cancer of the cervix, vulva, vagina, penis, mouth/throat, and anus.
- ► HPV vaccination is safe and effective.

85% of people will get an HPV infection in their lifetime regardless of sex assigned at birth, gender identity, or sexual orientation.

HPV vaccination can help prevent more than 90% of cancers caused by HPV. The vaccine is recommended through age 26 years for everyone who is not fully vaccinated.*



- > You can get HPV even if you only have one sexual partner.
- Even if you've already contracted one strain of the virus, vaccination will help protect against the other strains.
- Condoms and dental dams can help lower, but will not eliminate, the risk of spreading HPV.

Most insurance companies will cover the cost of vaccines. If you are not insured, check to see if you qualify for free or low-cost vaccines.

*People 27 through 45 years should discuss the benefits of vaccination with their doctor.
