Dear Health Care Provider,

Immunization is one of the most successful and cost-effective public health interventions, yet vaccination rates have declined recently. As their patients' most trusted messengers, health care providers can increase vaccination rates by delivering reliable and evidence-based information that incorporates each patient's unique circumstances, such as barriers to vaccination, diverse cultural preferences, and health literacy.

Building patient-centered relationships based on trust, respect, and collaboration is essential for increasing vaccination rates. Promoting a culture of immunization in the workplace is necessary for all employees--not just the medical staff. Consistent messaging across the practice can increase patient confidence and enhance the patient-provider relationship.

The New Jersey Department of Health created the Health Care Provider Vaccine Confidence Toolkit available at nj.gov/health/cd/vpdp.shtml to aid practitioners in implementing tailored practices that can help maintain or boost vaccination coverage. The toolkit covers a range of topics, including:
