Frequently Asked Questions Regarding the COVID-19 Vaccines

Download document

Q: How do COVID-19 vaccines work?

A: Vaccines work by triggering a person's immune system to develop protection against a disease.

Q: Are COVID-19 vaccines safe and effective? How were they tested and approved?

A: COVID-19 vaccines that are authorized for use have gone through clinical trials involving tens of thousands of participants to determine their safety and efficacy. The known and potential benefits of approved vaccines outweigh the known and potential harms of becoming infected with COVID-19. The U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) has granted Emergency Use Authorizations (EUAs) for COVID-19 vaccines which have been shown to be safe and effective as determined by data from the manufacturers and findings from clinical trials. Q: Why would a vaccine be needed if we can do other things, like social distancing and wearing masks, to prevent the virus that causes COVID-19 from spreading?

A: Stopping a pandemic requires using all the tools available. Vaccines work with your immune system so your body will be ready to fight the virus if you are exposed. Other steps, like covering your mouth and nose with a mask and staying at least six feet away from others, help reduce your chance of being exposed to the virus or spreading it to others. Together, COVID-19 vaccination and following the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's recommendations to protect yourself and others will offer the best protection from COVID-19.1

Q: How will New Jersey distribute a COVID-19 vaccine? Is there a plan?

A: New Jersey is following a phased approach for rolling out COVID-19 vaccines to serve all adults who live, work, or are being educated in the state. The State's goal is to vaccinate 70 percent of the adult population – or 4.7 million adults – within six months. Q: Will the [insert your company name] pay for the vaccine?

A: No one will have to pay for the vaccine itself. The COVID-19 vaccine is available without cost- sharing barriers. Based on the CDC COVID-19 Vaccination Program Provider Agreement, all providers must vaccinate individuals regardless of whether they have health insurance coverage or what type of coverage they have, and are prohibited from balance billing or otherwise charging vaccine recipients. Q: If I decide to get the vaccine, how do I sign up?

A: Individuals can also visit https://covid19.nj.gov/vaccine to pre-register in the state scheduling system or find designated vaccination sites.

Q: Is the [your company name] tracking employees who get vaccinated (and those who do not)?

Q: Can I use my NJ Earned Sick Leave to get my vaccine?

A: Yes, employees can use their NJ Earned Sick Leave to get their COVID-19 vaccine, including for travel to and from their appointment and recovery from side effects. Under NJ state law, employers must provide up to 40 hours of paid earned sick leave per year to most full- and part-time employees, including migrant and seasonal employees. Q: I'm worried it will take too long to receive my pay if I use my NJ Earned Sick Leave to get the COVID-19 vaccine. How do I receive it and how long does it take?

A: Your employer must pay you when you use any NJ Earned Sick Leave to which you are entitled. They are required to pay you in the same or next pay period, and the pay must come with your regular pay check or another method that can be deposited or cashed easily. Q: Should I get vaccinated if I've already had COVID-19?

A: Getting COVID-19 might offer some natural protection or immunity from reinfection with the virus that causes COVID-19. But it's not clear how long this protection lasts. Because reinfection is possible and COVID-19 can cause severe medical complications, it's recommended that people who have already had COVID-19 get a COVID-19 vaccine. If you've had COVID-19, wait until 90 days after your diagnosis to get a COVID-19 vaccine.

Q: What is the update on the Johnson & Johnson's Janssen COVID-19 Vaccine?

A: CDC and FDA have recommended that use of Johnson & Johnson's Janssen (J&J/Janssen) COVID-19 Vaccine resume in the United States, effective April 23, 2021. However, women younger than 50 years old especially should be aware of the rare risk of blood clots with low platelets after vaccination, and that other COVID-19 vaccines are available where this risk has not been seen. If you received a J&J/Janssen vaccine, here is what you need to know. Read the CDC/FDA statement.

Once you register, you'll be notified when and how to make an appointment. Help is always available at the phone number above or online at covid19.nj.gov/vaccinehelp.

Even after you're vaccinated, follow guidance from public health experts and wear a mask, practice social distancing, and wash your hands frequently. And remember, two vaccine doses are required to fully protect yourself, your co-workers, family, and friends from COVID-19. News and information about the vaccine is continuously updated at the New Jersey Department of Health's COVID-19 website at bit.ly/NJVaccine.
