Dear Ms. Martin:

Attached you will find a copy of a recent memorandum received from the U.S. Air Force EMS Program Manager. This communication states that your eligibility to practice as an EMT has been removed following your recent Special Court Martial conviction.

Under NREMT rules, all NREMTs must be eligible and not barred from practice by any licensing agency or any state in order to maintain National EMS Certification. Because of the action taken against you by the office of Air Force EMS, the NREMT is proposing revocation of your National EMS Certification as an EMT.

The NREMT does have an appeal process. If you wish to appeal this proposed revocation, you have 45 days after the date of this letter to do so in writing. However, the decision to re-instate any NREMT certification will weigh heavily upon restoration of your right to practice. You may mail, or fax your appeal to: 614 / 888 - 8920.

If we do not receive your appeal within 45 days the NREMT will automatically revoke your certification.
