MICU Advisory – Barbara Schreibman

- A presentation was made for a research trial on the use of pre-hospital Ketamine and Fentanyl.
 - MICU Advisory approved the trial for review by the New Jersey Department of Health.
- Discussed procedures for BLS arriving on scene of an obvious death
 - Based on the discussion, it can vary based on county.
- Bylaws for the MICU Advisory Council are being rewritten as required by P.L. 2022, c118.
- Updated and voted on New Jersey Protocols.
 - Removed any BLS-level care that has not been authorized by the Department.
- Discussion ensued.

OEMS – Candace Gardner

- EMTTF
 - The timeliness of reimbursement submissions needs to be more concise to provide more accurate reporting and processing
 - Many continuing education providers are not uploading student information onto rosters to update the completion status
 - OEMS will not be updating rosters, offenders will be required to meet with OEMS in Trenton to rectify
- Working to re-establish the Specialty Care Transport Unit (SCTU) Committee to ensure they have a seat at the table
- OEMS Staffing
 - Andrew Rivera is no longer with OEMS and has taken a job out of state.
 We wish him the best of luck
 - Judy Faulkner has joined the team as an Agency Service Representative
 - Christian Rios and Fatima Manzoor have joined the team as Public Health Representative's working primarily with the Emergency Medical Services for Children (EMSC) Program
 - OEMS still has several openings, anyone interested in joining the team should reach out to OEMS directly
- Guidelines for Trauma Triage have been disseminated to the EMS community

- The State Trauma System Advisory Committee is seeking recommendations for a paid ALS provider, BLS provider, and a representative from the Emergency Nurses Association (ENA)
- The state website has been updated with recommendations for donning and doffing of PPE in a suspected Ebola case. EMS should have a heightened level of awareness
- EMSC has received \$205,000 in grant funding for educational programs, safety initiatives, school nurse in-services, newsletters, etc.
 - The next online educational class on Pediatric Holiday Hazards by Dr. Lisa Drago is scheduled for December 15, 2022.
- The Department continues to work towards transitioning from NEMSIS v3.4 to v3.5. All agencies should work with their vendors to transition in 2023
- P.L. 2022, c.118 was published and is geared toward redesigning Advanced Life Support in New Jersey and the development of a Mobile Integrated Health Program.
- The Department will be hosting stakeholder meetings to start to facilitate dialog on what the community would like to see in the next generation of regulations
- One regionalized EMT-Instructor screening was canceled due to a lack of interest
- Changes to the CEU values assigned to specific canned classes are being reevaluated and assigned according to the applicability to providing service as an EMT. The Department is recommending EMTs focus on clinical education instead of classes with a high CEU value focused on operations
- Discussion ensued.

New Jersey EMS Task Force – Michael Bascom

- Updates were made to all the ambulance buses and communication equipment
- 115 members completed a three-day training in October
- Approximately 750,000 vaccinations have been transferred
