Health & Well-Being

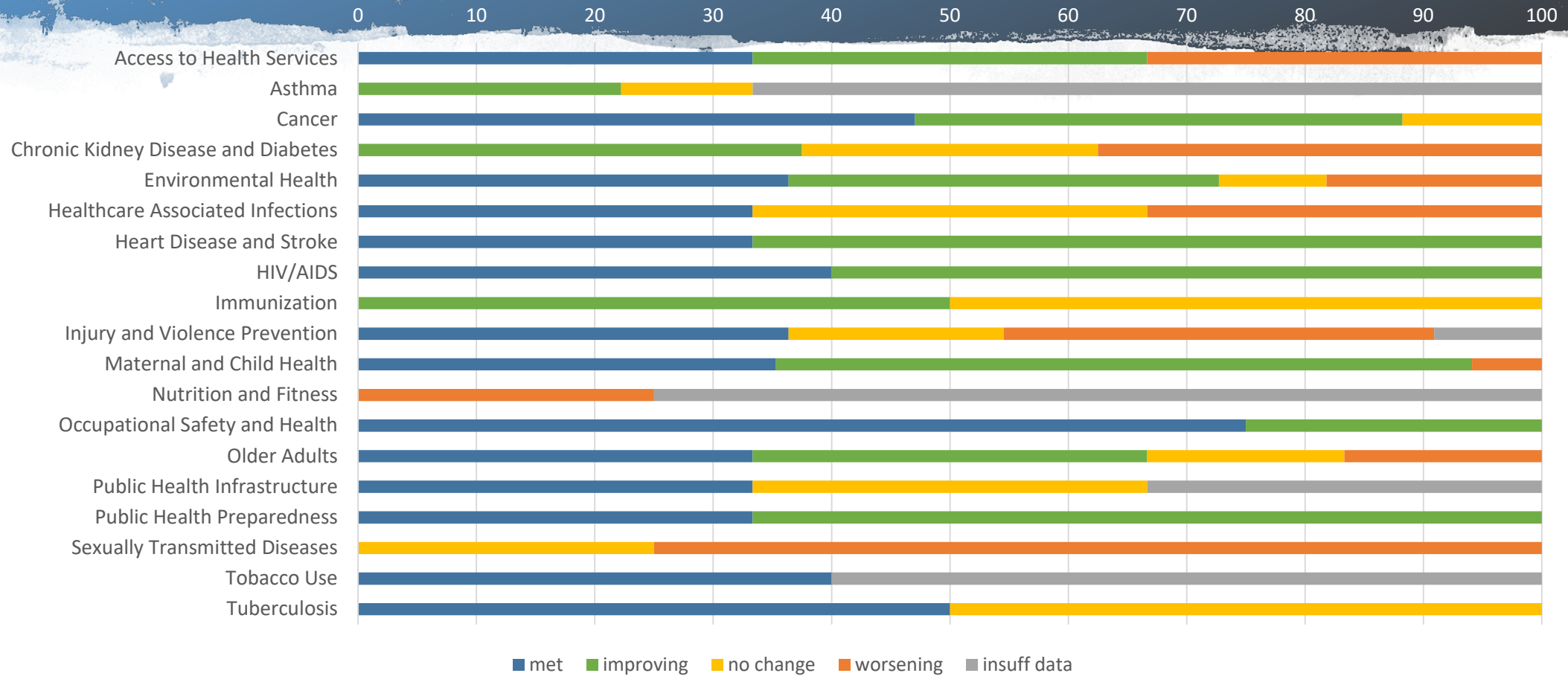
Health refers to a person's physical and mental condition.

Well-being encompasses many aspects of life, including physical, mental, emotional, social, financial, occupational, intellectual, and spiritual.

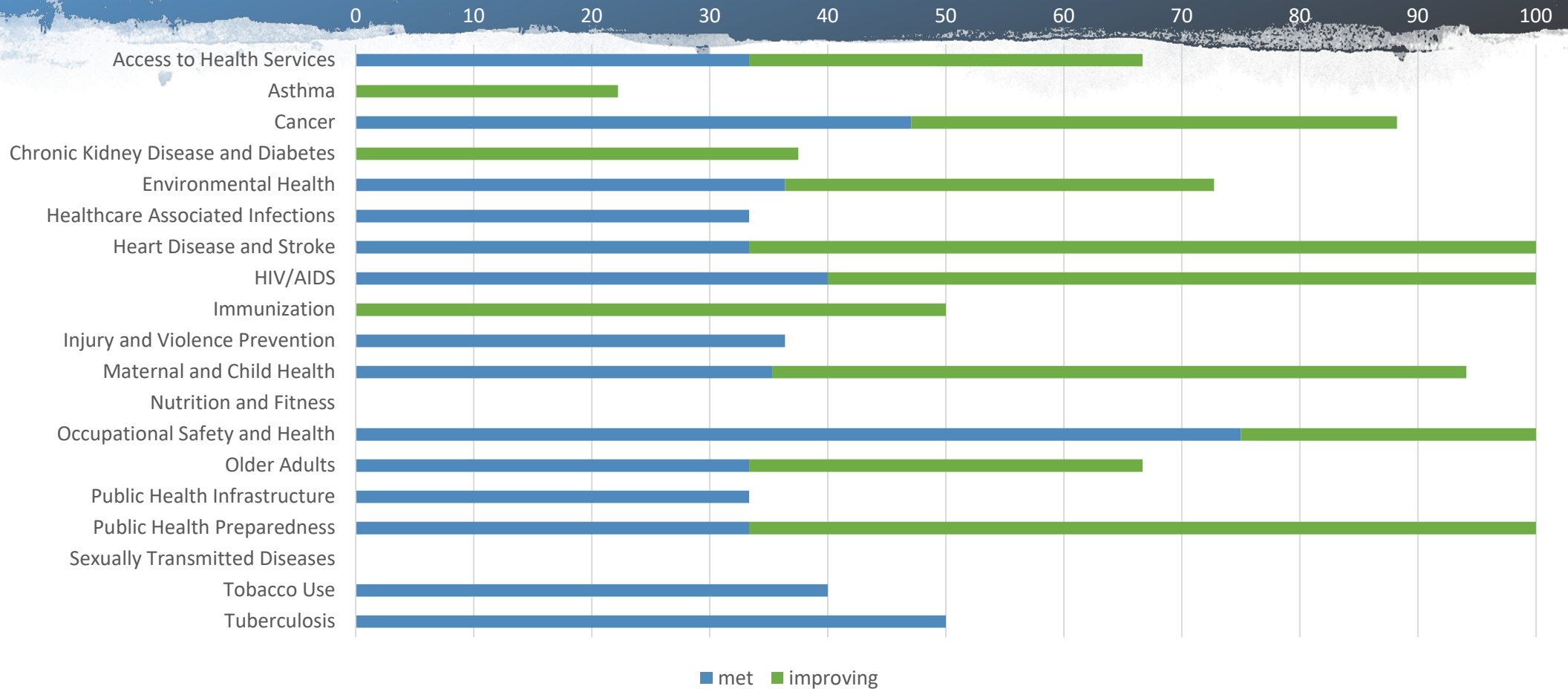

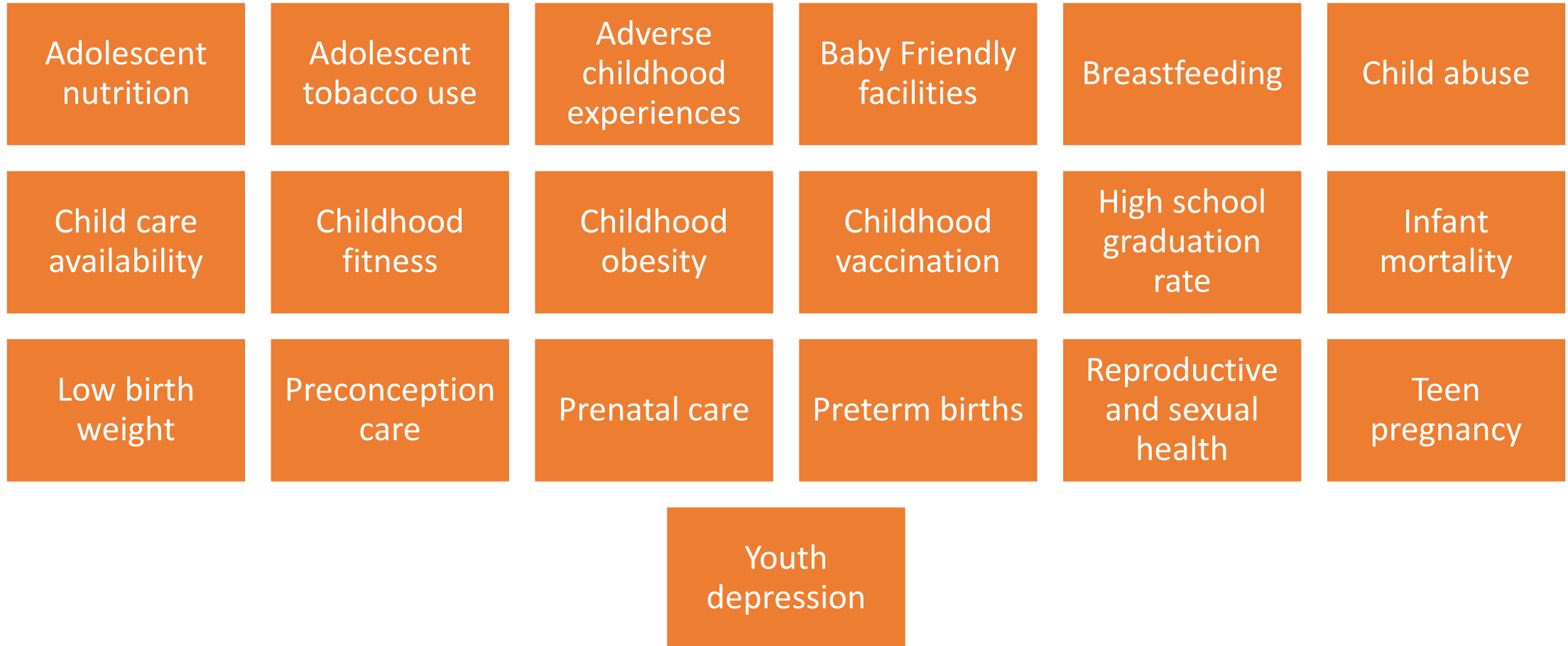
