

Sexually Transmitted Disease (STD) Reporting Requirements in New Jersey

(see New Jersey Administrative Code Title 8, Chapters 57 and 58)



Who is Required to Report STDs?

- Physicians
- Advanced practice nurses
- Physicians Assistants
- Persons having control or supervision over a hospital/health care facility, correctional facility, school, summer camp, childcare center, preschool, or institution of higher education
- Laboratories (for specific guidelines for labs, please see NJAC 8:57-1.7)

Reportable STDs

- Chancroid (*Haemophilus ducreyi*)
- Chlamydial Infections, sexually transmitted (*Chlamydia trachomatis*)
- Chlamydial Infections, neonatal (*Chlamydia trachomatis*)
- Gonorrhea (*Neisseria gonorrhoeae*)
- Granuloma inguinale (*Calymmatobacterium granulomatis*)
- Lymphogranuloma venereum (*Chlamydia trachomatis*)
- Syphilis, primary and secondary (*Treponema pallidum*)
- Syphilis, congenital

Report Requirements

- Name of disease
- Personal information for the person infected to include:
 - Name
 - Age and date of birth
 - Address and telephone number
 - Gender
 - Race
 - Ethnicity
- Date of onset of illness
- Name, address, direct phone number, and institution of the reporting official

How to Report an STD to the NJ DOH

- STD reports should be made directly into the Communicable Disease and Surveillance System (CDRSS):
