GENERAL DESCRIPTION			
<p>The duties include the provision of consultation, review and oversight of prehospital operational activities. Conduct comprehensive complaint investigations and prepare reports with conclusions and recommendations. Evaluate clinical care practices of basic and advanced life support, specialty care, and air medical services for changes and improvements. Prepare written reports containing findings, conclusions and recommendations. Support the enforcement actions taken by the Office of the Attorney General on the Department's behalf. Schedule and conduct field site visits of both agencies and vehicles for regulatory compliance. Audit the records of prehospital agency staff to ensure the provision of quality clinical care and the competency of staff.</p> <p>Preference will be given to candidates who are currently certified as a paramedic by either the NJ Department of Health or the National Registry of Emergency Medical Technicians or will be eligible for and obtain such within six months from the date of appointment. EMT-Instructor certification a plus.</p>
