<p>Under direction of the Communicable Disease Service, responsible for providing consultation to public health educators, local health agencies and departmental programs in the planning, organizing, and promoting of public health education or in the planning and organization of educational programs focused on CDC's Infection Prevention and Control (IPC) curriculum in New Jersey, targeting front-line healthcare providers; focus will be on prevention of COVID-19 transmission in healthcare settings. The Public Health Consultant 2, Health Educator, will act as local health department liaison to help organize trainings, demonstrations, facility visits, and webinars regarding CDC's IPC training. The Health Educator will build upon the previously established regional approach to infection prevention capacity. Evaluates program activities to assess effectiveness and provide future planning and direction.</p>
