<p>Under supervision of the Chemical Terrorism (CT) Laboratory supervisor, this position will perform the sample preparation of emerging contaminants Per- and Poly Fluorinated Alkyl Substances (PFAS) in serum and plasma for the University of Arizona (U of A) Public Health and Environmental Laboratories (PHEL) for the project titled "PFAS, Antibodies, and COVID-19 Epidemiology (PACE) Study", a COVID-19 vaccine efficacy project in relation to subjects with PFAS exposure and the Johns Hopkins University "Maternal Prenatal Exposure to PFAS on Perinatal and Child Health Outcomes: A Prospective Birth Cohort Study" as well as the University of Arizona Polycyclic Aromatic Hydrocarbon (PAH) metabolite Epigenetics study.</p> <p>Sample accessioning, laboratory supply ordering, or other duties as required are expectations of this position.</p>

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If you are a candidate for a position in our Public Health and Environmental Laboratories, you may be subject to pre- and /or post-employment alcohol and drug testing.

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If you are a candidate for a position that involves direct client care in one of the State facilities/programs, you may be subject to pre- and/or post-employment drug testing/screening. The cost of any pre-employment testing will be at the candidate's expense. Candidates with a positive drug test result, or those who refuse to be tested and/or cooperate with the testing requirement, will not be hired.
