

## Transportation & Warehousing Sector (NAICS 48-49)

### Occupation

Ninety percent (n=353) of the victims of fatal work-related injuries in the Transportation and Warehousing sector had Transportation and Material Moving occupations; followed by Installation, Maintenance, and Repair occupations (n=12, 3%); and Construction and Extraction occupations (n=5, 1%) – see detailed description on page 2.
