Common Heart Attack Warning Signs



Chest Discomfort

Uncomfortable pressure, squeezing, fullness, or pain. Feeling may go away and return.



Other Discomfort

Pain or discomfort in one or both arms, shoulder, back, neck, jaw, or stomach.



Shortness of Breath

This can happen with or without chest pain.



Other Signs

Lightheadedness, nausea, vomiting, or cold sweats

Standards for firefighter medical screening and fitness-for-duty evaluations.

- 29 CFR 1910.134(e) Medical evaluations under OSHA and NJDOH PEOSH are required before fit testing and use, and repeated when medically necessary.
- National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) 1582, Standard on Comprehensive Occupational Medical Program for Fire Departments - Preplacement and annual medical evaluations shall be provided to firefighters to determine their medical ability to perform their duties so they do not present a risk to the safety and health of themselves or others.
- NFPA 1583, Standard on Health-Related Fitness Programs for Firefighters A health-related fitness program shall be established to ensure firefighters can safely perform their assigned duties.
- NFPA 1500, Fire Department Occupational Safety and Health Program Standby emergency medical care is required at a minimum of basic life support level at certain incidents and at all incidents for the incident commander to evaluate the need for emergency medical care and patient transportation.
