**Subject:** Notice of Grant Opportunity FY23: Lifelong Learning Accounts (LiLA)

As a part of Governor Murphy's Future of Work initiative, the Office of Innovation and the New Jersey Department of Labor and Workforce Development (NJDOL) established the <u>Lifelong Learning Accounts (LiLA)</u> program. This initiative was built to empower participants to drive their own career development by providing job-coaching, training, and employment support for jobless or chronically unemployed New Jersey residents. This two-year pilot program, funded at \$10 million in FY 2023, will be managed by NJDOL and begins in March 2023.

Eligibility for the grant program requires being a non-profit or for-profit entity, a government agency, or an institution of higher education. The expected goal is to identify and serve at least 100 low-income adults who are willing and able to complete training and obtain work. Each approved grantee is estimated to receive up to \$750,000 per year, if performance goals and expenditures are met. Upon acceptance to the program, each resident will receive a \$9,600 learning credit that can be used towards training, career development, childcare, or other expenses related to gaining meaningful employment.
