Recent Federal Actions Regarding Higher Education

Forthcoming Public Comment Deadlines

Several forthcoming proposed rules impacting higher education are now available for review and have public comment deadlines approaching. These include:

- Department of Education, Proposed Rule on Public Service Loan Forgiveness: Comments due by September 17
- Department of Homeland Security, Proposed Duration of Status Rule: <u>Comments due by September 29</u>
- Department of Education, Proposed IPEDS Data Collection: <u>Comments due by October</u> 14, 2025

US Department of Education

US ED released a new press release confirming the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) form will be available by the October 1 deadline. More information about FAFSA and the press release are available.

On September 10, US ED announced the Department is ending discretionary funding to several of the agency's Minority-Serving Institution (MSI) grant programs. Details about their actions are available in their <u>press release</u>.

New Jersey Updates

Attorney General Platkin Secures Preliminary Injunction Preserving Access to Key Social Services

On September 10, 2025, NJ Attorney General Platkin secured a preliminary injunction blocking new rules under the Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act (PRWORA). Programs under this act cover public health, education and anti-poverty programs, including Head Start, food banks, adult education, career and technical education and more. As a result, these new directives are halted currently in the plaintiff states. For the full press release,
