## **Updates from New Jersey Office of the Attorney General**

June 9, 2025— Twenty-one attorneys general filed an amicus brief supporting Harvard University following the termination of federal funding to the University. The amicus brief argues that research universities are essential to state economies and funding freezes or cancellations would have numerous consequences. June 5, 2025— A judge has granted a preliminary injunction in the case, <u>filed by a coalition of 23 attorneys general including New Jersey</u>, that challenges the dismantling of AmeriCorps. The injunction requires grants and projects in plaintiff states to be restored. May 28, 2025— A coalition of 15 attorneys general, including New Jersey Attorney General Matthew J. Platkin joined a lawsuit challenging the Trump Administration's cut to National Science Foundation (NSF) programs, particularly projects focused on increasing participation of women, minorities, and people with disabilities in science, technology, engineering, and math (STEM). May 22, 2025— New Jersey Attorney General Platkin and a coalition of 20 other attorneys general won a preliminary injunction stopping the Trump Administration's attempt to dismantle the U.S. Department of Education and ordering the reinstatement of all employees who were fired.
