New Jersey Marks 25 Years of GEAR UP College Readiness Programs

Middle and High School Students in 12 Urban Centers Served as GEAR UP Partner Network Expands in 2024 to Include Schools in Asbury Park, Elizabeth, and New Brunswick

TRENTON – Today, during <u>National GEAR UP Week</u>, the Office of the Secretary of Higher Education (OSHE) is proud to mark 25 years of impact through <u>Gaining Early Awareness and</u> <u>Readiness for Undergraduate Programs</u> ("GEAR UP"). Since New Jersey received its <u>first</u> <u>award</u> of the federal grant in 1999, the statewide reach of college readiness programs has grown from four to 12 urban centers. Today, GEAR UP in New Jersey serves over 2,000 lowincome middle and high school students each academic year, helping to expose them to college and financial aid opportunities.

Among the academic and enrichment support services offered are after-school and Saturday tutoring, 6-week summer programming, mentoring, academic counseling, test preparation, information sessions about financial aid, college visits, and support to GEAR UP students during their first year in college. For the 2022-23 academic year, 96 percent of participating New Jersey students graduated from high school with 79 percent enrolling in college. In addition to student-focused support, GEAR UP provides families with college-going information and resources, empowering them to become active partners in their child's academic and career journey.

"The GEAR UP grant plays an important role in educating and engaging students and families about their higher education options in New Jersey, ensuring that students from all backgrounds have access to these opportunities," **said New Jersey Secretary of Higher Education Brian K. Bridges.** "As a first-generation college student myself, I understand the profound impact that discussions about college can have on broadening one's aspirations. This year's expansion with new institutional partners has allowed us to offer even broader support. We are thankful to our New Jersey congressional delegation for their advocacy in securing this federal funding and are optimistic about future investments to ensure students from underrepresented backgrounds continue to realize their potential through postsecondary paths."

"We are thrilled to be partnering with Brookdale CC, Kean University, and Rutgers to expand GEAR UP services to students and their parents in select target schools in Asbury Park, Elizabeth, and New Brunswick," **said New Jersey GEAR UP State Director Errol Bruce Jr.** "Through our expansion efforts, we will continue our mission of increasing the number of New Jersey youth prepared to enter and succeed in postsecondary education. We are excited to continue having a positive impact on many communities and grateful for the support of our institutional partners, their staffs, and the continued engagement of GEAR UP alumni."

New partnerships with three institutions of higher education this year have expanded GEAR UP's reach in New Jersey to students in grade 7 through 12 at the following schools:

The expansion adds to the GEAR UP network of eight partner institutions of higher education in New Jersey that are providing services in schools across nine of the state's urban centers. These are Mercer County Community College (Trenton), New Jersey City University (Jersey City), New Jersey Institute of Technology (Newark), Passaic County Community College (Paterson), Rowan College of South Jersey (Bridgeton), Rowan University (Camden), Stockton University (Atlantic City and Pleasantville) and Salem Community College (Penns Grove Carneys Point).
