A youth-focused educator by trade, in training and passion, Robert works to impact the lives of young people, their families and communities through advocacy, allyship and facilitated learning. Focused on creating new and inclusive opportunities for learning and engaging, Robert and his wife, Melissa, built MNMR, LLC to further their passions, merging entertaining performances and opportunities to learn through immersive storytelling — Talking Differences. Each Talking Differences experience, program and initiative had been designed to engage an audience, and in doing so, provide lasting, memorable, and tangible moments of brilliance.

Robert currently leads diversity, health, equity and inclusion efforts at Children's Hospital Colorado. The work of his position involves challenging an entire health system to realize the impacts of the differences that create significant change on work and care in our communities.
