CURRENT PROGRAM Statistics

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Each month the Division of Family Development publishes its program statistics for: WFNJ/TANF, NJ SNAP, Emergency Assistance, General Assistance, and Child Support Services. When possible, information is provided separately for children and adults. Many tables also provide trend data with information broken down by county for readers to consider. This report is compiled and prepared by The Bureau of Research & Reporting.

WFNJ/TANF

- As of the end of December, the TANF caseload had decreased by 7,299 cases, from 32,424 in December 2014 to 25,195 in December 2015, a decrease of 22.3%.
- The counties with caseloads that decreased the most since December 2014 were Sussex (-39.6%), Warren (-37.2%), and Salem (-34.5%).
- Of the WFNJ/TANF cases, 6,690 or 26.6% were child-only in December 2015.
- The counties with the most child-only cases were Essex (991), Camden (951), and Hudson (726).
- Essex (12,616), Passaic (7,928), Camden (7,363), Hudson (7,121), and Atlantic (4,571) counties had the greatest number of persons receiving TANF in December 2015.

NJ SNAP (formerly FOOD STAMPS)

- In December 2015, there were 445,688 households receiving NJ SNAP benefits. The number of NJ SNAP households decreased by 9,228, or 2.0%, since December 2014.
- There were 884,937 persons receiving NJ SNAP benefits as of December 2015, a decrease of 21,486 or 2.4% since December 2014.
- The two counties having the highest caseload increase since December 2014 are Bergen (2.8%) and Middlesex (0.9%).

EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE

- There were 3,853 families receiving Emergency Assistance (EA) in December 2015, a decrease of 2,345 or 37.8% since December 2014.
- In December 2015, EA payments were made for 1,131 SSI recipients.

GENERAL ASSISTANCE

GA Emergency Assistance

- There were 3,732 Emergency Assistance payments made to GA cases in December 2015, a decrease of 1,468 or 28.2% since December 2014.
- The county that showed a percent increase in emergency assistance payments is Burlington (34.3%).

GA Program

- The total numbers of cases receiving GA has decreased from 28,967 to 21,779 since December 2014, a decrease of 24.8%.
- There were 11,825 Employable GA and 9,954 Unemployable GA cases in December 2015.
- The county that showed a percent increase for GA cases since December 2014 was Bergen (52.5%).
- In December 2015, GA cases showed a 0.9 percent decrease since November 2015.

CHILD SUPPORT SERVICES (Quarterly Report)

- The total collection for the Child Support Services Program was about \$320 million from October 2015 to December 2015, an increase of 0.9 percent over the same period for FFY 2015.
- Total distributions decreased 3.9% from December 2014.

WORK FIRST NEW JERSEY (WFNJ)

- During the report month of December 2015, there were 3,236 families in which at least one member was employed and an additional 528 families whose WFNJ assistance cases were closed due to employment related earnings.
- The three counties with the greatest number of employed active WFNJ recipients were: Essex (884), Camden (412), and Hudson (330).
- There were 3,151 former TANF cases receiving post-TANF support in the form of child care assistance.







Work Participation Rates Achieved Over 12 Month Period Ending With DECEMBER 2015







Total NJ SNAP Recipients DECEMBER 2015 By County








NJ SNAP - Formerly the Food Stamp Program, now known as **NJ SNAP** (NJ Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program) authorized by Congress as a nutritional supplement program to provide low income households with more food of greater variety and better nutrition. Program eligibility is based on household income, resources, and expenses for medical, shelter, and dependent care. CWA staff refers certain recipients to the New Jersey Department of Labor for participation in the Food Stamp Employment and Training Program.

FAMIS: Family Assistance Management Information System

GAAS: General Assistance Automated System

NJKiDS: New Jersey Kids Deserve Support (Child Support Information Management System)

NJ MMIS SHARED DATA WAREHOUSE: The Shared Data Warehouse (SDW) is the repository for New Jersey's DFD and Medicaid data. Since 2003, OptumInsight has administered the SDW and provided access to the data through a reporting tool known as Business Objects.

OMEGA: Online Management of Economic Goal Achievement

SSI-EA: Supplemental Security Income-Emergency Assistance

WFNJ: Work First New Jersey - Fully implemented July 1, 1997, this is New Jersey's welfare reform program which responds to the requirements of the Federal Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act (**PRWORA**) of 1996. PRWORA established Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (**TANF**) as the replacement for AFDC cash assistance. WFNJ includes two segments, **WFNJ/TANF** for families with children, and **WFNJ/GA** (General Assistance) for single adults and couples without dependent children. WFNJ emphasizes achieving self-sufficiency and limits lifetime receipt of financial assistance to a total of five years.

EXPLANATORY NOTES

The Department of Human Services Division of Family Development provides basic income and an opportunity to achieve self-sufficiency for individuals and families served by the Division's programs. The Division provides leadership, direction and supervision to those public agencies responsible for administering those programs and plans for and develops policies to promote self-sufficiency.
