CURRENT PROGRAM STATISTICS

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Each month the Division of Family Development publishes its program statistics for: WFNJ/TANF, NJ SNAP, Emergency Assistance, General Assistance, and Child Support Services. When possible, information is provided separately for children and adults. Many tables also provide trend data with information broken down by county for readers to consider. This report is compiled and prepared by The Bureau of Research & Reporting.

WFNJ/TANF

- As of the end of January, the TANF caseload had decreased by 1,581 cases, from 33,355 in January 2014 to 31,774 in January 2015, a decrease of 4.7%.
- The counties where the family caseload percentage increased since January 2014 were Burlington (22.5%), Morris (9.3%), and Atlantic (2.4%).
- The counties with caseloads that decreased the most since January 2014 were Warren (-18.8%), Salem (-23.4%), and Monmouth (-25.1%).
- Of the WFNJ/TANF cases, 7,486 or 23.6% were child-only in January 2015.
- The counties with the most child-only cases were Essex (1,160), Camden (1,013), and Hudson (826).
- Essex (17,109), Hudson (9,099), Passaic (8,980), Camden (8,359), and Atlantic (5,562) counties had the greatest number of persons receiving TANF in January 2015.

NJ SNAP (formerly FOOD STAMPS)

- In January 2015, there were 454,246 households receiving NJ SNAP benefits. The number of NJ SNAP households increased by 27,623, or 6.5%, since January 2014.
- There were 904,418 persons receiving NJ SNAP benefits as of January 2015, an increase of 50,993 or 6.0% since January 2014.
- The three counties having the highest caseload increase since January 2014 are Union (14.1%), Burlington (13.4%), and Monmouth (13.1%).

EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE

- There were 5,888 families receiving Emergency Assistance (EA) in January 2015, a decrease of 232 or 3.8% since January 2014.
- In January 2015, EA payments were made for 1,440 SSI recipients.

GENERAL ASSISTANCE

GA Emergency Assistance

- There were 5,177 Emergency Assistance payments made to GA cases in January 2015, an increase of 141 or 2.8% since January 2014.
- The three counties that show an annual percent increase in emergency assistance payments are Burlington (166.1%), Hudson (36.0%), and Somerset (34.4%).

GA Program

- The total numbers of cases receiving GA has decreased from 32,582 to 28,499 since January 2014, a decrease of 12.5%.
- There were 16,810 Employable GA and 11,689 Unemployable GA cases in January 2015.
- Bergen (26.6%), Burlington (24.9%) and Atlantic (9.7%) counties showed the highest percent increase for GA cases since January 2014.
- In January 2015, GA cases showed a 1.6 percent decrease since December 2014.

CHILD SUPPORT SERVICES (Quarterly Report)

- The total collection for the Child Support Services Program was about \$317 million from October 2014 to December 2014, a decrease of 0.3 percent over the same period for FFY 2014.
- Total distributions decreased 1.2% from December 2013.


WORK FIRST NEW JERSEY (WFNJ)

- During the report month of January 2015, there were 2,794 families in which at least one member was employed and an additional 596 families whose WFNJ assistance cases were closed due to employment related earnings.
- The three counties with the greatest number of employed active WFNJ recipients were: Essex (765), Hudson (301), and Camden (263).
- There were 3,193 former TANF cases receiving post-TANF support in the form of child care assistance.





Work Participation Rates Achieved Over 12 Month Period Ending With JANUARY 2015










EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE (EA) - Payments to those eligible for WFNJ/TANF or WFNJ/GA, authorized during the 30 consecutive days immediately following the emergency (defined as a substantial loss of shelter, food, clothing, or household furnishings by fire, flood or other similar disaster) or if eligible individual or family is an imminent or actual state of homelessness.

NJ SNAP - Formerly the Food Stamp Program, now known as **NJ SNAP** (NJ Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program) authorized by Congress as a nutritional supplement program to provide low income households with more food of greater variety and better nutrition. Program eligibility is based on household income, resources, and expenses for medical, shelter, and dependent care. CWA staff refers certain recipients to the New Jersey Department of Labor for participation in the Food Stamp Employment and Training Program.

FAMIS: Family Assistance Management Information System

GAAS: General Assistance Automated System

NJKiDS: New Jersey Kids Deserve Support (Child Support Information Management System)

NJ MMIS SHARED DATA WAREHOUSE: The Shared Data Warehouse (SDW) is the repository for New Jersey's DFD and Medicaid data. Since 2003, OptumInsight has administered the SDW and provided access to the data through a reporting tool known as Business Objects.

OMEGA: Online Management of Economic Goal Achievement

SSI-EA: Supplemental Security Income-Emergency Assistance

WFNJ: Work First New Jersey - Fully implemented July 1, 1997, this is New Jersey's welfare reform program which responds to the requirements of the Federal Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act (PRWORA) of 1996. PRWORA established Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) as the replacement for AFDC cash assistance. WFNJ includes two segments, WFNJ/TANF for families with children, and WFNJ/GA (General Assistance) for single adults and couples without dependent children. WFNJ emphasizes achieving self-sufficiency and limits lifetime receipt of financial assistance to a total of five years.

EXPLANATORY NOTES

The Department of Human Services Division of Family Development provides basic income and an opportunity to achieve self-sufficiency for individuals and families served by the Division's programs. The Division provides leadership, direction and supervision to those public agencies responsible for administering those programs and plans for and develops policies to promote self-sufficiency.
