CURRENT PROGRAM STATISTICS

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Each month the Division of Family Development publishes its program statistics for: WFNJ/TANF, NJ SNAP, Emergency Assistance, General Assistance, and Child Support Services. When possible, information is provided separately for children and adults. Many tables also provide trend data with information broken down by county for readers to consider. This report is compiled and prepared by The Bureau of Research & Reporting.

WFNJ/TANF

- As of the end of January, the TANF caseload had decreased by 3,435 cases, from 15,097 in January 2018 to 11,662 in January 2019, a decrease of 22.8%.
- The county where the family caseload percentage increased since January 2018 was Hunterdon (30.4%).
- The counties with caseloads that decreased the most since January 2018 were Salem (-27.7%), Sussex (-27.9%) and Atlantic (-31.2%).
- Of the WFNJ/TANF cases, 4,093 or 35.1% were child-only in January 2019.
- The counties with the most child-only cases were Camden (664), Essex (534) and Hudson (433).
- Essex (5,031), Camden (3,836), Hudson (3,601), Passaic (3,393) and Atlantic (1,921) counties had the greatest number of persons receiving TANF in January 2019.

NJ SNAP (formerly FOOD STAMPS)

- In January 2019, there were 358,572 households receiving NJ SNAP benefits. The number of NJ SNAP households decreased by 22,094 or 5.8%, since January 2018.
- There were 712,478 persons receiving NJ SNAP benefits as of January 2019, a decrease of 46,050 or 6.1% since January 2018.
- The counties having the highest caseload decrease since January 2018 are Union (-8.0%), Atlantic (-9.7%) and Somerset (-10.0%).

EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE

- There were 1,527 TANF families receiving Emergency Assistance (EA) in January 2019, a decrease of 272 or 15.1% since January 2018.
- In January 2019, EA payments were made for 377 SSI recipients.

- There were 1,904 GA cases with Emergency Assistance payments in January 2019, a decrease of 193 or 9.2% since January 2018.
 - The counties that showed the highest percent increase in Emergency Assistance payments were Hudson (36.4%), Gloucester (70.0%) and Somerset (80.0%).
 - The counties that showed the highest percent decrease in Emergency Assistance payments were Salem (-40.0%), Essex (-54.0%) and Sussex (-64.5%).

GENERAL ASSISTANCE

- The total numbers of cases receiving GA has decreased from 12,839 to 10,669 since January 2018, a decrease of 16.9%.
- There were 4,216 Employable GA and 6,453 Unemployable GA cases in January 2019.
- The counties that showed a percent increase for GA cases were Monmouth (9.2%) and Somerset (22.7%) since January 2018.
- The counties that showed the highest percent decrease for GA cases since January 2018 were Camden (-24.4%), Cumberland (-26.8%) and Sussex (-36.2%).
- In January 2019, GA cases showed a 0% change since December 2018.

CHILD SUPPORT SERVICES (Quarterly Report)

- The total collection for the Child Support Services Program was about \$308 million from October 2018 to December 2018, an increase of 2.6 percent over the same period for FFY 2018.
- Total distributions increased 1.4% from December 2017.


WORK FIRST NEW JERSEY (WFNJ)

- During the report month of January 2019, there were 1,166 families in which at least one member was employed and an additional 242 families whose WFNJ assistance cases were closed due to employment related earnings.
- The three counties with the greatest number of employed active WFNJ recipients were: Essex (289), Camden (154) and Hudson (116).
- There were 1,276 former TANF cases receiving post-TANF support in the form of child care assistance.





Work Participation Rates Achieved Over 12 Month Period Ending With JANUARY 2019












ACRONYMS

EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE (EA) - Payments to those eligible for WFNJ/TANF or WFNJ/GA, authorized during the 30 consecutive days immediately following the emergency (defined as a substantial loss of shelter, food, clothing, or household furnishings by fire, flood or other similar disaster) or if eligible individual or family is an imminent or actual state of homelessness.

NJ SNAP - Formerly the Food Stamp Program, now known as **NJ SNAP** (NJ Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program) authorized by Congress as a nutritional supplement program to provide low income households with more food of greater variety and better nutrition. Program eligibility is based on household income, resources, and expenses for medical, shelter, and dependent care. CWA staff refers certain recipients to the New Jersey Department of Labor for participation in the Food Stamp Employment and Training Program.

FAMIS: Family Assistance Management Information System

GAAS: General Assistance Automated System

NJKiDS: New Jersey Kids Deserve Support (Child Support Information Management System)

NJ MMIS SHARED DATA WAREHOUSE: The Shared Data Warehouse (SDW) is the repository for New Jersey's DFD and Medicaid data. Since 2003, OptumInsight has administered the SDW and provided access to the data through a reporting tool known as Business Objects.

OMEGA: Online Management of Economic Goal Achievement

SSI-EA: Supplemental Security Income-Emergency Assistance

WFNJ: Work First New Jersey - Fully implemented July 1, 1997, this is New Jersey's welfare reform program which responds to the requirements of the Federal Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act (**PRWORA**) of 1996. PRWORA established Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (**TANF**) as the replacement for AFDC cash assistance. WFNJ includes two segments, **WFNJ/TANF** for families with children, and **WFNJ/GA** (General Assistance) for single adults and couples without dependent children. WFNJ emphasizes achieving self-sufficiency and limits lifetime receipt of financial assistance to a total of five years.

EXPLANATORY NOTES

The Department of Human Services Division of Family Development provides basic income and an opportunity to achieve self-sufficiency for individuals and families served by the Division's programs. The Division provides leadership, direction and supervision to those public agencies responsible for administering those programs and plans for and develops policies to promote self-sufficiency.
