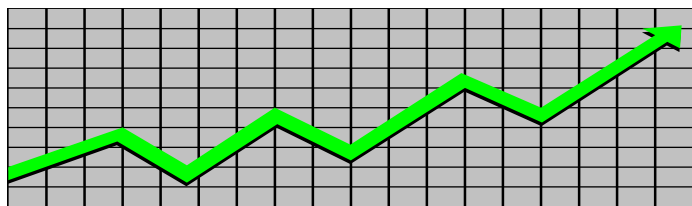

JULY 2019

Each month the Division of Family Development publishes its program statistics for: WFNJ/TANF, NJ SNAP, Emergency Assistance, General Assistance, and Child Support Services. When possible, information is provided separately for children and adults. Many tables also provide trend data with information broken down by county for readers to consider. This report is compiled and prepared by The Bureau of Research & Reporting.

WFNJ/TANF

- As of the end of July, the TANF caseload had decreased by 2,321 cases, from 12,915 in July 2018 to 10,594 in July 2019, a decrease of 18.0%.
- The counties with caseloads that decreased the most since July 2018 were Bergen (-22.4%), Essex (-22.4%), Hunterdon (-29.4%) and Atlantic (-29.6%).
- Of the WFNJ/TANF cases, 3,710 or 35.0% were child-only in July 2019.
- The counties with the most child-only cases were Camden (618), Essex (459) and Passaic (393).
- Essex (4,359), Camden (3,475), Hudson (3,401), Passaic (2,904) and Atlantic (1,655) counties had the greatest number of persons receiving TANF in July 2019.

NJ SNAP (formerly FOOD STAMPS)

- In July 2019, there were 343,853 households receiving NJ SNAP benefits. The number of NJ SNAP households decreased by 23,449 or 6.4%, since July 2018.
- There were 679,486 persons receiving NJ SNAP benefits as of July 2019, a decrease of 52,677 or 7.2% since July 2018.
- The county having the highest caseload increase since July 2018 was Hunterdon (0.1%).
- The counties having the highest caseload decrease since July 2018 are Hudson (-8.0%), Atlantic (-11.6%) and Somerset (-11.7%).

EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE

- There were 1,511 TANF families receiving Emergency Assistance (EA) in July 2019, a decrease of 155 or 9.3% since July 2018.
- In July 2019, EA payments were made for 542 SSI recipients.

DIVISION OF FAMILY DEVELOPMENT CURRENT PROGRAM STATISTICS JULY 2019

- There were 1,994 GA cases with Emergency Assistance payments in July 2019, a decrease of 23 or 1.1% since July 2018.
- The counties that showed the highest percent increase in Emergency Assistance payments were Warren (53.8%), Gloucester (112.9%) and Monmouth (156.3%).
- The counties that showed the highest percent decrease in Emergency Assistance payments were Burlington (-30.6%), Atlantic (-31.1%) and Salem (-75.0%).

GENERAL ASSISTANCE

- The total numbers of cases receiving GA has decreased from 11,754 to 10,127 since July 2018, a decrease of 13.8%.
- There were 4,050 Employable GA and 6,077 Unemployable GA cases in July 2019.
- The counties that showed a percent increase for GA cases were Monmouth (15.4%), Warren (19.8%) and Hunterdon (51.7%) since July 2018.
- The counties that showed the highest percent decrease for GA cases since July 2018 were Burlington (-21.2%), Atlantic (-26.7%) and Hudson (-29.4%).
- In July 2019, GA cases showed a 0.7% decrease since June 2019.

CHILD SUPPORT SERVICES (Quarterly Report)

- The total collection for the Child Support Services Program was about \$322 million from April 2019 to June 2019, a decrease of 0.6 percent over the same period for FFY 2018.
- Total distributions decreased 1.5% from June 2018.

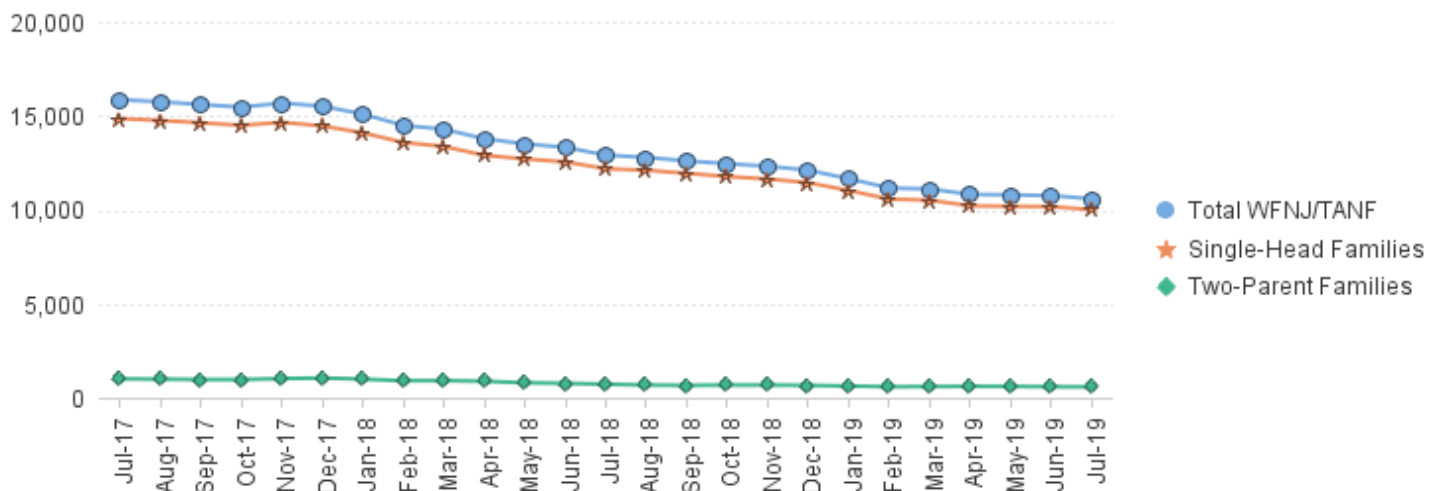
WORK FIRST NEW JERSEY (WFNJ)

- During the report month of July 2019, there were 1,003 families in which at least one member was employed and an additional 143 families whose WFNJ assistance cases were closed due to employment - related earnings.
- The three counties with the greatest number of employed active WFNJ recipients were: Essex (238), Camden (132) and Hudson (119).
- There were 1,140 former TANF cases receiving post-TANF support in the form of child care assistance.

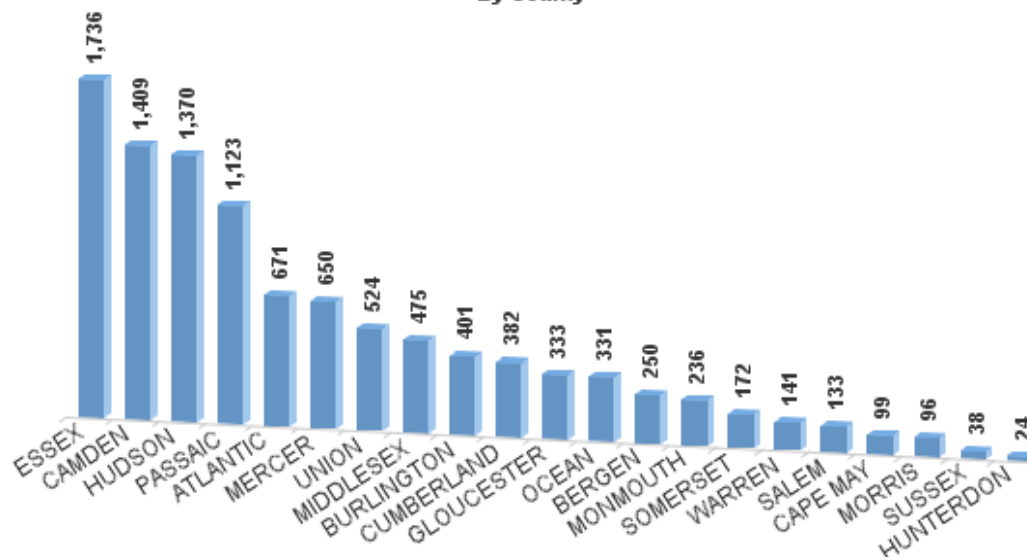

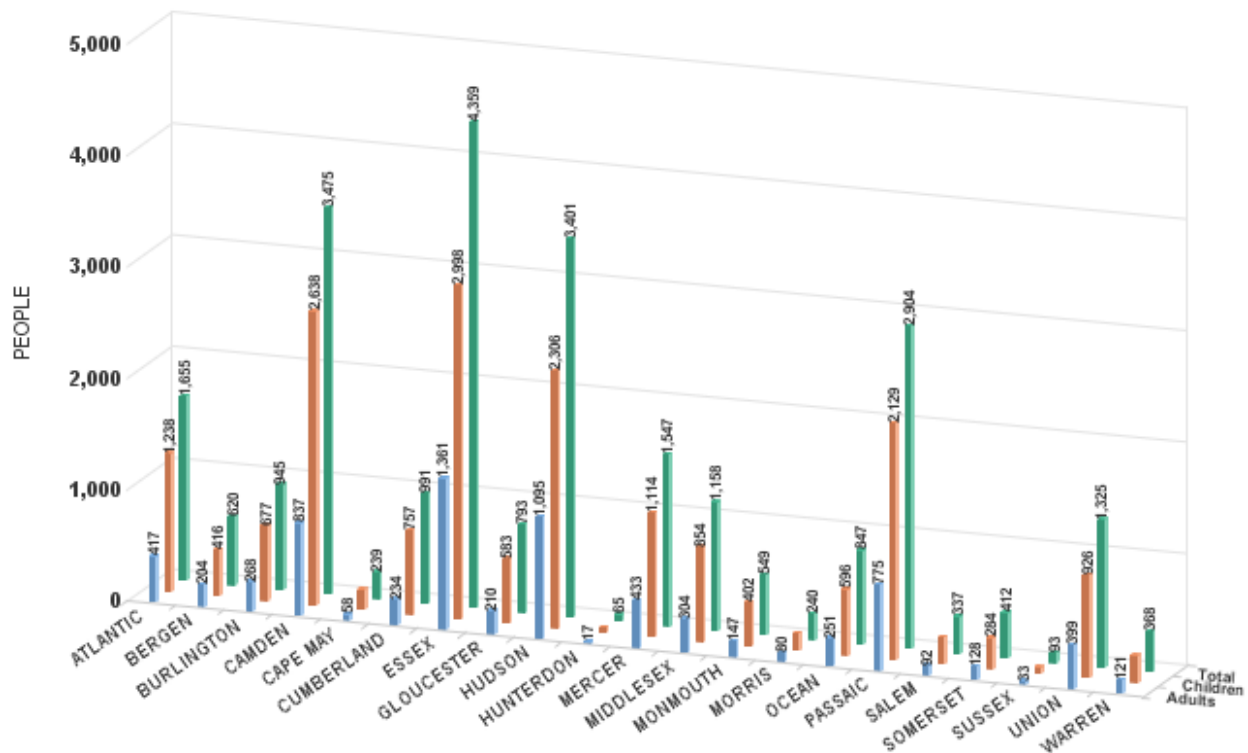

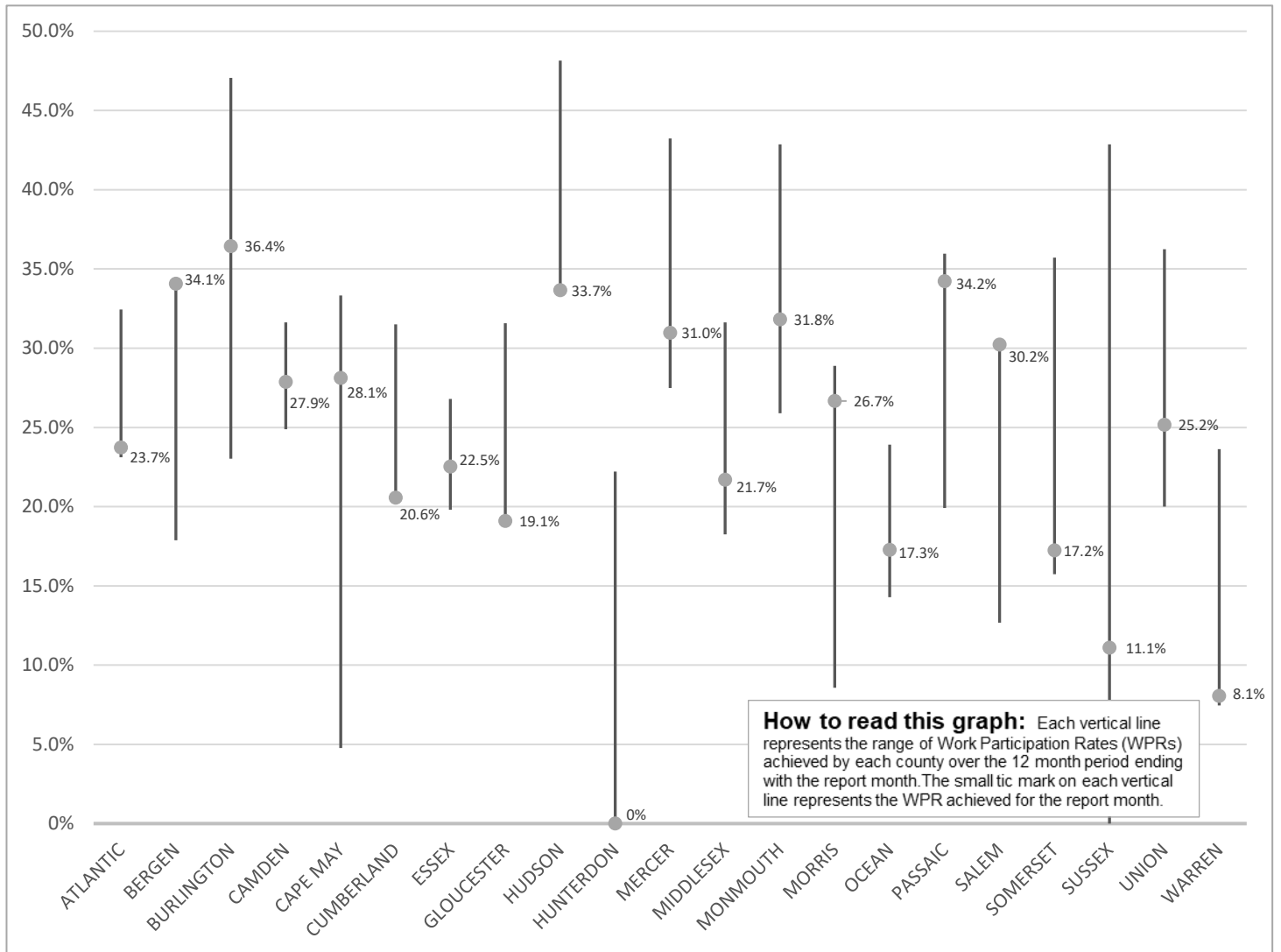

Ending with JULY 2019

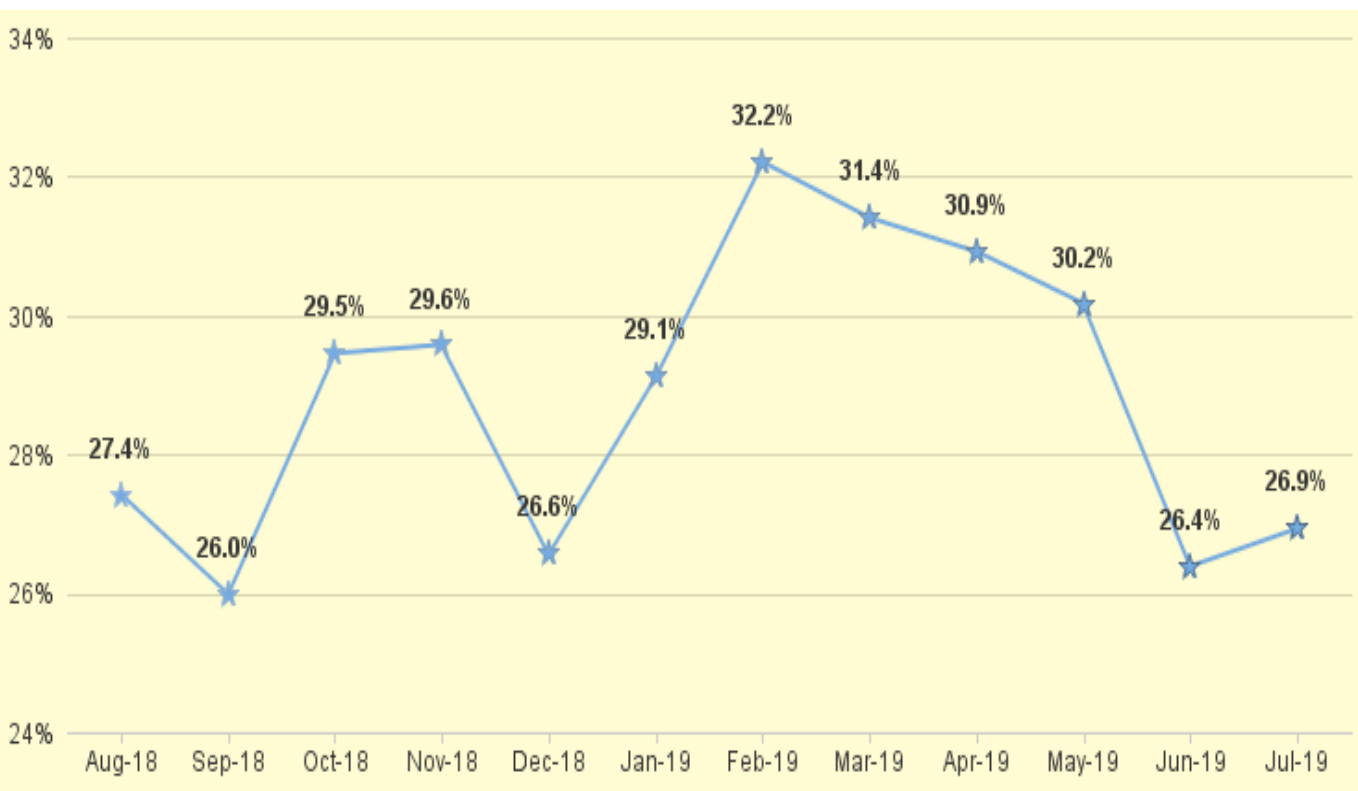

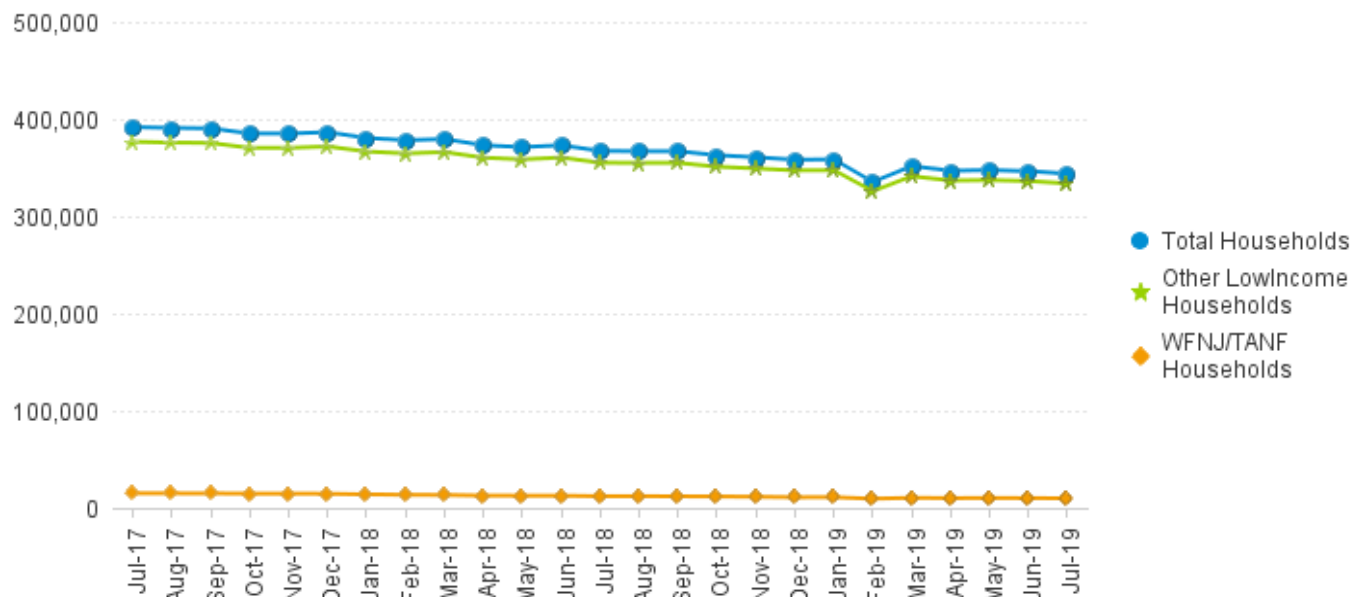

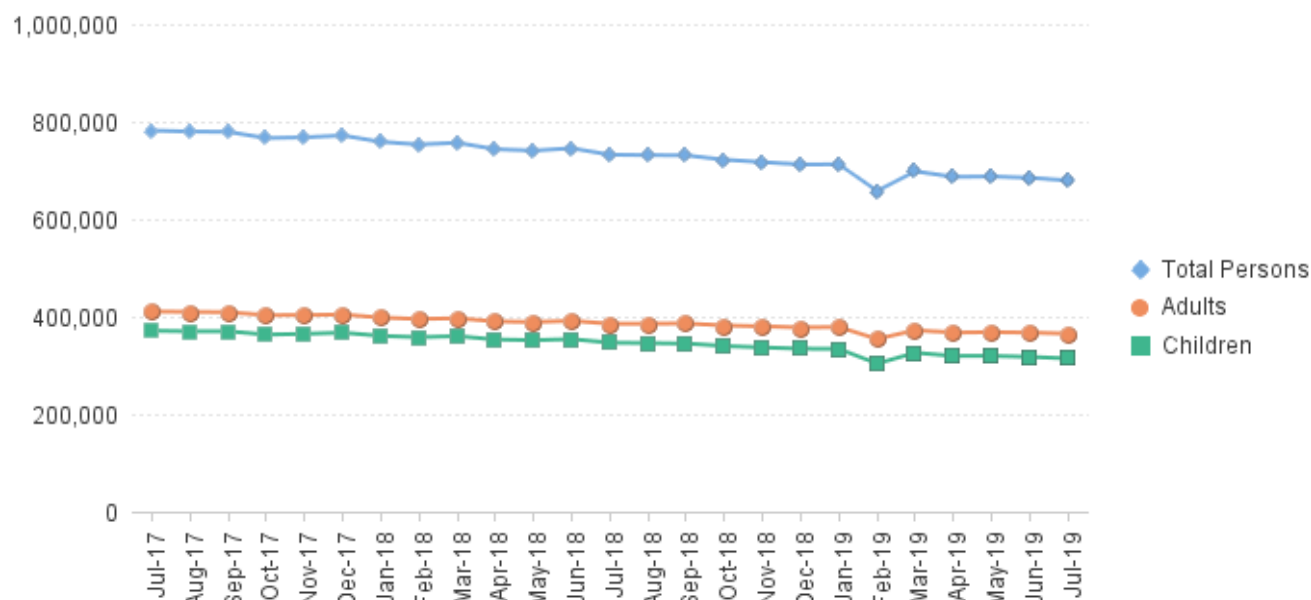

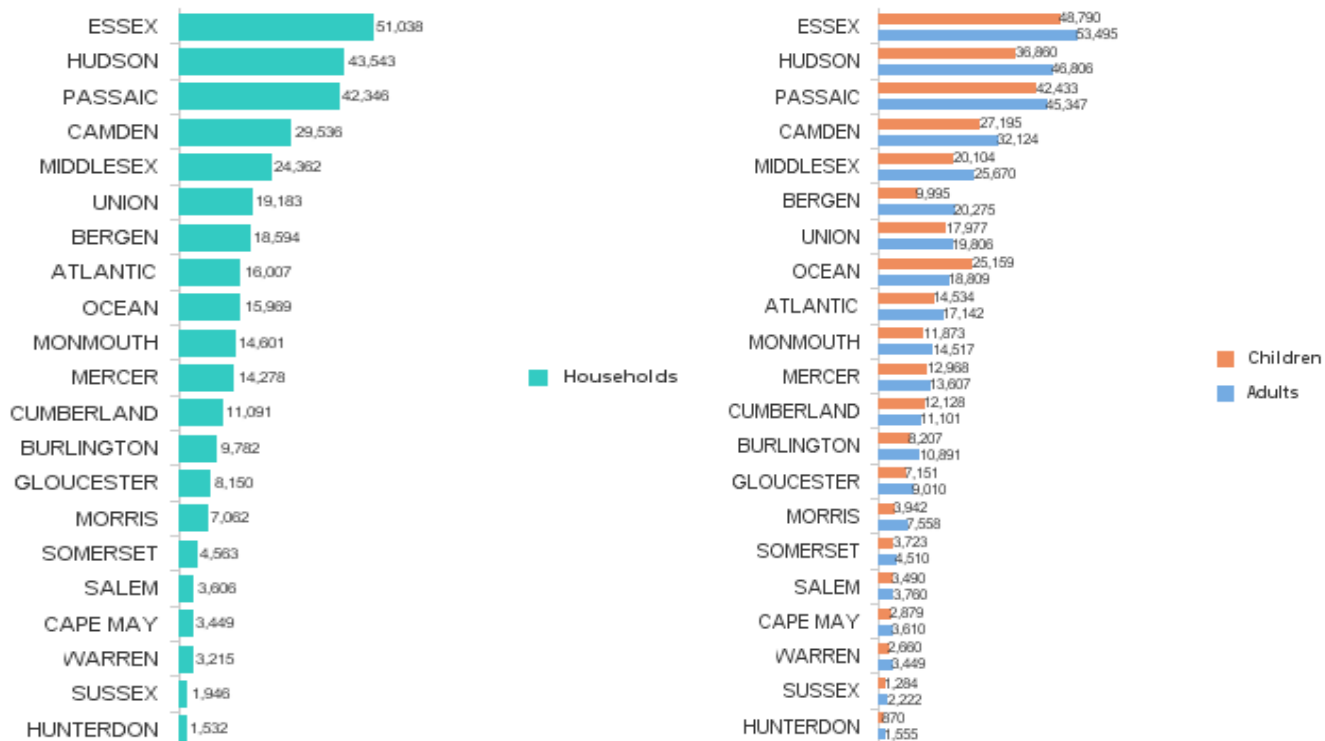

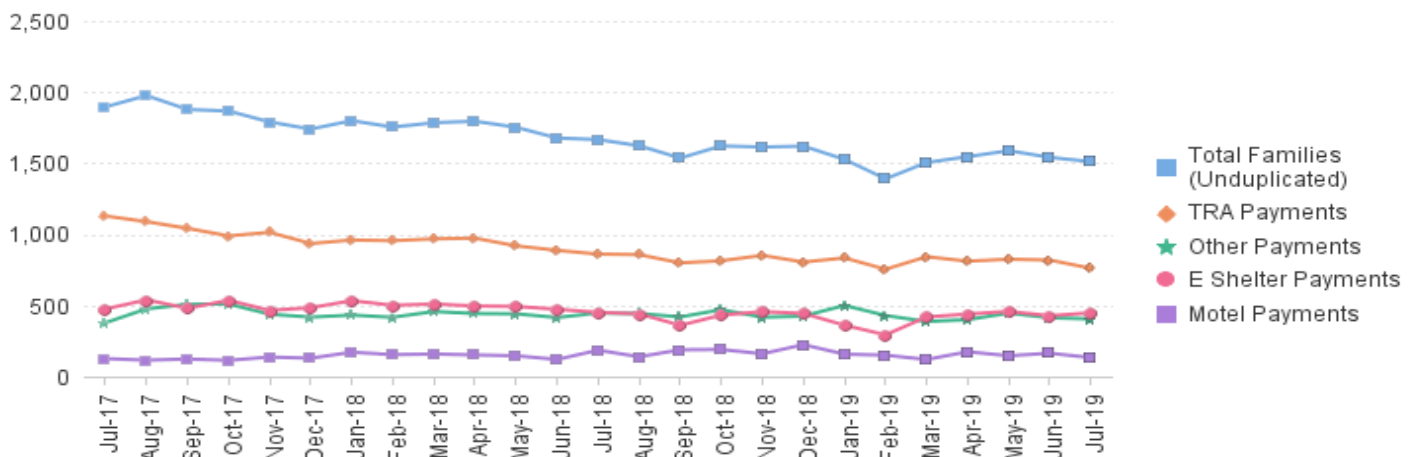

ACRONYMS

EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE (EA) - Payments to those eligible for WFNJ/TANF or WFNJ/GA, authorized during the 30 consecutive days immediately following the emergency (defined as a substantial loss of shelter, food, clothing, or household furnishings by fire, flood or other similar disaster) or if eligible individual or family is in an imminent or actual state of homelessness.

NJ SNAP - Formerly the Food Stamp Program, now known as **NJ SNAP** (NJ Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program) authorized by Congress as a nutritional supplement program to provide low income households with more food of greater variety and better nutrition. Program eligibility is based on household income, resources, and expenses for medical, shelter, and dependent care. CWA staff refers certain recipients to the New Jersey Department of Labor for participation in the Food Stamp Employment and Training Program.

FAMIS: Family Assistance Management Information System

GAAS: General Assistance Automated System

NJKIDS: New Jersey Kids Deserve Support (Child Support Information Management System)

NJ MMIS SHARED DATA WAREHOUSE: The Shared Data Warehouse (SDW) is the repository for New Jersey's DFD and Medicaid data. Since 2003, OptumInsight has administered the SDW and provided access to the data through a reporting tool known as Business Objects.

OMEGA: Online Management of Economic Goal Achievement

SSI-EA: Supplemental Security Income-Emergency Assistance

WFNJ: Work First New Jersey - Fully implemented July 1, 1997, this is New Jersey's welfare reform program which responds to the requirements of the Federal Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act (**PRWORA**) of 1996. PRWORA established Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (**TANF**) as the replacement for AFDC cash assistance. WFNJ includes two segments, **WFNJ/TANF** for families with children, and **WFNJ/GA** (General Assistance) for single adults and couples without dependent children. WFNJ emphasizes achieving self-sufficiency and limits lifetime receipt of financial assistance to a total of five years.
