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DIVISION OF FAMILY DEVELOPMENT CURRENT PROGRAM STATISTICS JUNE 2011

Each month the Division of Family Development publishes its program statistics for: WFNJ/TANF, NJ SNAP, Emergency Assistance, General Assistance, and Child Support Services. When possible, information is provided separately for children and adults. Many tables also provide trend data with information broken down by county for readers to consider. This report is compiled and prepared by The Bureau of Research & Statistics.

WFNJ/TANF

- As of the end of June, the TANF caseload had increased by 1,914 cases, from 39,096 in June 2010 to 41,010 in June 2011, a 4.9% increase.
- The counties with the highest family caseload percentage increase since June 2010 include Ocean (24.5%), Atlantic (20.0%), and Salem (18.2%).
- The counties with caseloads that decreased since June 2010 were Sussex (-4.8%), Hunterdon (-4.9%), and Monmouth (-8.5%).
- Of the WFNJ/TANF cases, 9,539 or 23.3% were child-only in June 2011.
- The counties with the most child-only cases were Essex (1,586), Hudson (1,227), and Camden (1,161).
- Essex (21,901), Hudson (11,751), and Camden (11,664) counties had the greatest number of persons receiving TANF in June 2011.

NJ SNAP (formerly FOOD STAMPS)

- In June 2011, there were 376,158 households receiving NJ SNAP benefits. The number of NJ SNAP households increased by 62,230, or 19.8%, since June 2010.
- There were 759,996 persons receiving NJ SNAP benefits as of June 2011, an increase of 120,985 or 18.9% since June 2010.
- The three counties having the highest caseload increase since June 2010 are Morris (33.1%), Hunterdon (31.0%), and Sussex (30.9%).

EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE

- There were 7,339 families receiving Emergency Assistance (EA) in June 2011, an increase of 1,188 or 19.3% since June 2010.
- In June 2011, EA payments were made for 1,950 SSI recipients.

GENERAL ASSISTANCE

GA Emergency Assistance

- There were 8,632 Emergency Assistance payments made to GA recipients in June 2011, a decrease of 48 or -0.6% since June 2010.
- The three counties that show an annual percent increase in emergency assistance payments are Passaic (50.3%), Somerset (42.0%), and Union (29.9%).

GA Program

- The total numbers of persons receiving GA has increased from 53,720 to 55,523 since June 2010, an increase of 3.4%.
- There were 39,420 Employable GA and 16,103 Unemployable GA recipients in June 2011.
- Gloucester (16.2%), Ocean (15.6%), and Atlantic (15.4%) counties showed the highest percent increase for GA persons since June 2010.

CHILD SUPPORT SERVICES (Quarterly Report)

- The total collection for the Child Support Services Program was about \$321 million from January 2010 to March 2011, an increase of 2.1 percent over the same period for FFY 2010.
- Total distributions increased over 1.7% from March 2010.


WORK FIRST NEW JERSEY (WFNJ)

- During the report month of June 2011, there were 4,159 families in which at least one member was employed and an additional 524 families whose WFNJ assistance cases were closed due to employment related earnings.
- The three counties with the greatest number of employed active WFNJ recipients were: Essex (959), Hudson (487), and Camden (390).
- There were 3,451 former TANF cases receiving post-TANF support in the form of child care assistance.





Work Participation Rates Achieved Over 12 Month Period Ending With JUNE 2011




Total NJ SNAP Recipients JUNE 2011 By County




ACRONYMS

CASS: Consolidated Assistance and Support System

EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE (EA) - Payments to those eligible for WFNJ/TANF or WFNJ/GA, authorized during the 30 consecutive days immediately following the emergency (defined as a substantial loss of shelter, food, clothing, or household furnishings by fire, flood or other similar disaster) or if eligible individual or family is an imminent or actual state of homelessness.

NJ SNAP - Formerly the Food Stamp Program, now known as **NJ SNAP** (NJ Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program) authorized by Congress as a nutritional supplement program to provide low income households with more food of greater variety and better nutrition. Program eligibility is based on household income, resources, and expenses for medical, shelter, and dependent care. CWA staff refers certain recipients to the New Jersey Department of Labor for participation in the Food Stamp Employment and Training Program.

FAMIS: Family Assistance Management Information System

GAAS: General Assistance Automated System

NJKiDS: New Jersey Kids Deserve Support (Child Support Information Management System)

NJ MMIS SHARED DATA WAREHOUSE: The Shared Data Warehouse (SDW) is the repository for New Jersey's DFD and Medicaid data. Since 2003, Optum has administered the SDW and provided access to the data through a reporting tool known as Business Objects.

OMEGA: Online Management of Economic Goal Achievement

SSI-EA: Supplemental Security Income-Emergency Assistance

WFNJ: Work First New Jersey - Fully implemented July 1, 1997, this is New Jersey's welfare reform program which responds to the requirements of the Federal Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act (PRWORA) of 1996. PRWORA established Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) as the replacement for AFDC cash assistance. WFNJ includes two segments, WFNJ/TANF for families with children, and WFNJ/GA (General Assistance) for single adults and couples without dependent children. WFNJ emphasizes achieving self-sufficiency and limits lifetime receipt of financial assistance to a total of five years.
