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# DIVISION OF FAMILY DEVELOPMENT CURRENT PROGRAM STATISTICS JUNE 2012

Each month the Division of Family Development publishes its program statistics for: WFNJ/TANF, NJ SNAP, Emergency Assistance, General Assistance, and Child Support Services. When possible, information is provided separately for children and adults. Many tables also provide trend data with information broken down by county for readers to consider. This report is compiled and prepared by The Bureau of Research & Reporting.

### WFNJ/TANF

- As of the end of June, the TANF caseload had decreased by 952 cases, from 41,010 in June 2011 to 40,058 in June 2012.
- The counties with the highest family caseload percentage increase since June 2011 include Passaic (8.0%), Sussex (6.0%), and Warren (3.6%).
- The counties with caseloads that decreased since June 2011 were Cumberland (-10.0%), Morris (-11.2%), and Monmouth (-12.0%).
- Of the WFNJ/TANF cases, 8,755 or 21.9% were child-only in June 2012.
- The counties with the most child-only cases were Essex (1,406), Hudson (1,142), and Camden (1,154).
- Essex (21,278), Passaic (12,312), and Camden (11,677) counties had the greatest number of persons receiving TANF in June 2012.

### **NJ SNAP (formerly FOOD STAMPS)**

- In June 2012, there were 410,257 households receiving NJ SNAP benefits. The number of NJ SNAP households increased by 34,099, or 9.1%, since June 2011.
- There were 824,236 persons receiving NJ SNAP benefits as of June 2012, an increase of 64,240 or 8.5% since June 2011.
- The three counties having the highest caseload increase since June 2011 are Camden (14.7%), Monmouth (14.0%), and Middlesex (13.5%).

### **EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE**

- There were 6,489 families receiving Emergency Assistance (EA) in June 2012, a decrease of 850 or 11.6% since June 2011.
- In June 2012, EA payments were made for 1,414 SSI recipients.

# DIVISION OF FAMILY DEVELOPMENT CURRENT PROGRAM STATISTICS JUNE 2012

### **GENERAL ASSISTANCE**

### **GA Emergency Assistance**

- There were 6,767 Emergency Assistance payments made to GA cases in June 2012, a decrease of 1,865 or 21.6% since June 2011.
- The two counties that show an annual percent increase in emergency assistance payments are Mercer (12.3%) and Middlesex (12.0%).

### **GA Program**

- The total numbers of cases receiving GA has decreased from 55,523 to 44,132 since June 2011, a decrease of 20.5%.
- There were 30,652 Employable GA and 13,480 Unemployable GA cases in June 2012.
- In June 2012, GA cases showed a 0.8 percent decrease since May 2012.

# **CHILD SUPPORT SERVICES (Quarterly Report)**

- The total collection for the Child Support Services Program was about \$325 million from April 2012 to June 2012, an increase of 1 percent over the same period for FFY 2011.
- Total distributions increased over 0.8% from June 2011.


# **WORK FIRST NEW JERSEY (WFNJ)**

- During the report month of June 2012, there were 4,301 families in which at least one member was employed and an additional 635 families whose WFNJ assistance cases were closed due to employment related earnings.
- The three counties with the greatest number of employed active WFNJ recipients were: Essex (939), Camden (525), and Hudson (498).















# Total NJ SNAP Recipients JUNE 2012 By County






# **ACRONYMS**

**CASS**: Consolidated Assistance and Support System

**EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE (EA)** - Payments to those eligible for WFNJ/TANF or WFNJ/GA, authorized during the 30 consecutive days immediately following the emergency (defined as a substantial loss of shelter, food, clothing, or household furnishings by fire, flood or other similar disaster) or if eligible individual or family is an imminent or actual state of homelessness.

**NJ SNAP** - Formerly the Food Stamp Program, now known as **NJ SNAP** (NJ Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program) authorized by Congress as a nutritional supplement program to provide low income households with more food of greater variety and better nutrition. Program eligibility is based on household income, resources, and expenses for medical, shelter, and dependent care. CWA staff refers certain recipients to the New Jersey Department of Labor for participation in the Food Stamp Employment and Training Program.

**FAMIS**: Family Assistance Management Information System

**GAAS**: General Assistance Automated System

**NJKiDS**: New Jersey Kids Deserve Support (Child Support Information Management System)

**NJ MMIS SHARED DATA WAREHOUSE**: The Shared Data Warehouse (SDW) is the repository for New Jersey's DFD and Medicaid data. Since 2003, OptumInsight has administered the SDW and provided access to the data through a reporting tool known as Business Objects.

**OMEGA**: Online Management of Economic Goal Achievement

**SSI-EA**: Supplemental Security Income-Emergency Assistance

**WFNJ**: Work First New Jersey - Fully implemented July 1, 1997, this is New Jersey's welfare reform program which responds to the requirements of the Federal Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act (**PRWORA**) of 1996. PRWORA established Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (**TANF**) as the replacement for AFDC cash assistance. WFNJ includes two segments, **WFNJ/TANF** for families with children, and **WFNJ/GA** (General Assistance) for single adults and couples without dependent children. WFNJ emphasizes achieving self-sufficiency and limits lifetime receipt of financial assistance to a total of five years.
