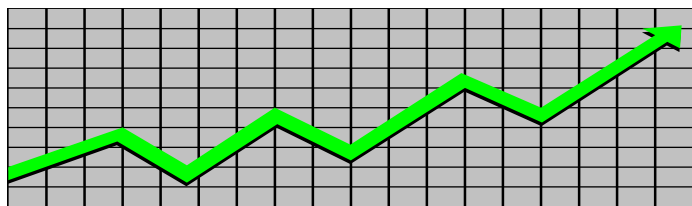

DIVISION OF FAMILY DEVELOPMENT CURRENT PROGRAM STATISTICS
JUNE 2019

Each month the Division of Family Development publishes its program statistics for: WFNJ/TANF, NJ SNAP, Emergency Assistance, General Assistance, and Child Support Services. When possible, information is provided separately for children and adults. Many tables also provide trend data with information broken down by county for readers to consider. This report is compiled and prepared by The Bureau of Research & Reporting.

WFNJ/TANF

- As of the end of June, the TANF caseload had decreased by 2,568 cases, from 13,331 in June 2018 to 10,763 in June 2019, a decrease of 19.3%.
- The county where the family caseload percentage increased since June 2018 was Warren (2.1%).
- The counties with caseloads that decreased the most since June 2018 were Sussex (-22.9%), Cumberland (-25.0%) and Atlantic (-32.7%).
- Of the WFNJ/TANF cases, 3,790 or 35.2% were child-only in June 2019.
- The counties with the most child-only cases were Camden (626), Essex (475) and Passaic (407).
- Essex (4,494), Camden (3,497), Hudson (3,363), Passaic (2,979) and Atlantic (1,675) counties had the greatest number of persons receiving TANF in June 2019.

NJ SNAP (formerly FOOD STAMPS)

- In June 2019, there were 346,450 households receiving NJ SNAP benefits. The number of NJ SNAP households decreased by 26,717 or 7.2%, since June 2018.
- There were 684,845 persons receiving NJ SNAP benefits as of June 2019, a decrease of 60,493 or 8.1% since June 2018.
- The counties having the highest caseload decrease since June 2018 are Burlington (-8.8%), Atlantic (-11.9%) and Somerset (-11.9%).

EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE

- There were 1,541 TANF families receiving Emergency Assistance (EA) in June 2019, a decrease of 136 or 8.1% since June 2018.
- In June 2019, EA payments were made for 493 SSI recipients.

DIVISION OF FAMILY DEVELOPMENT CURRENT PROGRAM STATISTICS JUNE 2019

- There were 2,086 GA cases with Emergency Assistance payments in June 2019, an increase of 70 or 3.5% since June 2018.
- The counties that showed the highest percent increase in Emergency Assistance payments were Warren (144.4%), Monmouth (208.3%) and Cumberland (300.0%).
- The counties that showed the highest percent decrease in Emergency Assistance payments were Atlantic (-23.0%), Burlington (-29.8%) and Salem (-66.7%).

GENERAL ASSISTANCE

- The total numbers of cases receiving GA has decreased from 11,944 to 10,194 since June 2018, a decrease of 14.7%.
- There were 4,047 Employable GA and 6,147 Unemployable GA cases in June 2019.
- The counties that showed a percent increase for GA cases were Monmouth (12.7%), Hunterdon (16.0%) and Warren (20.1%) since June 2018.
- The counties that showed the highest percent decrease for GA cases since June 2018 were Gloucester (-22.5%), Hudson (-25.5%) and Atlantic (-26.1%).
- In June 2019, GA cases showed a 1.7% decrease since May 2019.

CHILD SUPPORT SERVICES (Quarterly Report)

- The total collection for the Child Support Services Program was about \$322 million from April 2019 to June 2019, a decrease of 0.6 percent over the same period for FFY 2018.
- Total distributions decreased 1.5% from June 2018.

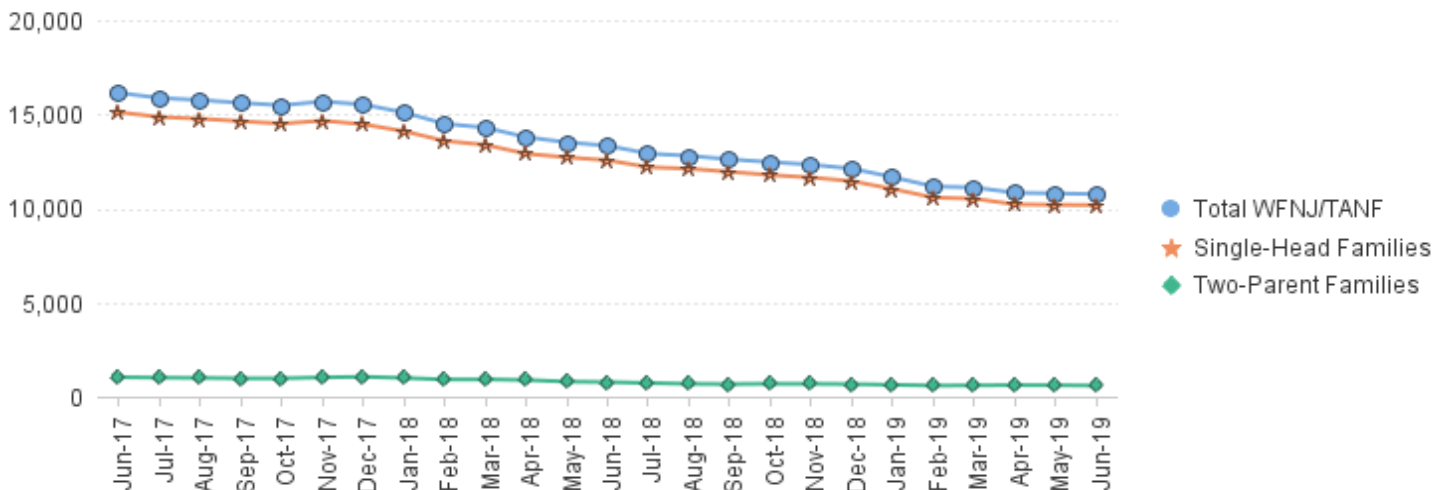
WORK FIRST NEW JERSEY (WFNJ)

- During the report month of June 2019, there were 962 families in which at least one member was employed and an additional 193 families whose WFNJ assistance cases were closed due to employment - related earnings.
- The three counties with the greatest number of employed active WFNJ recipients were: Essex (219), Camden (139) and Hudson (101).
- There were 1,247 former TANF cases receiving post-TANF support in the form of child care assistance.

JUNE 2017 THROUGH JUNE 2019



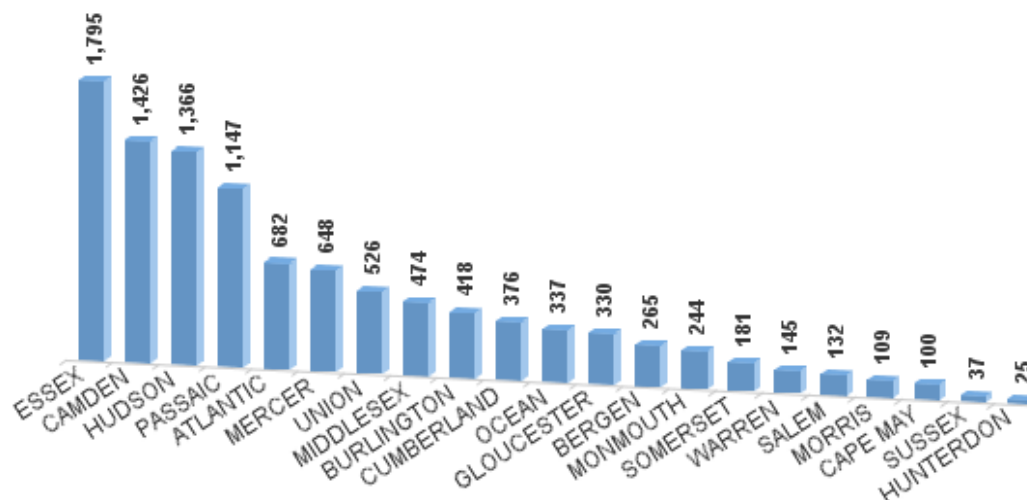

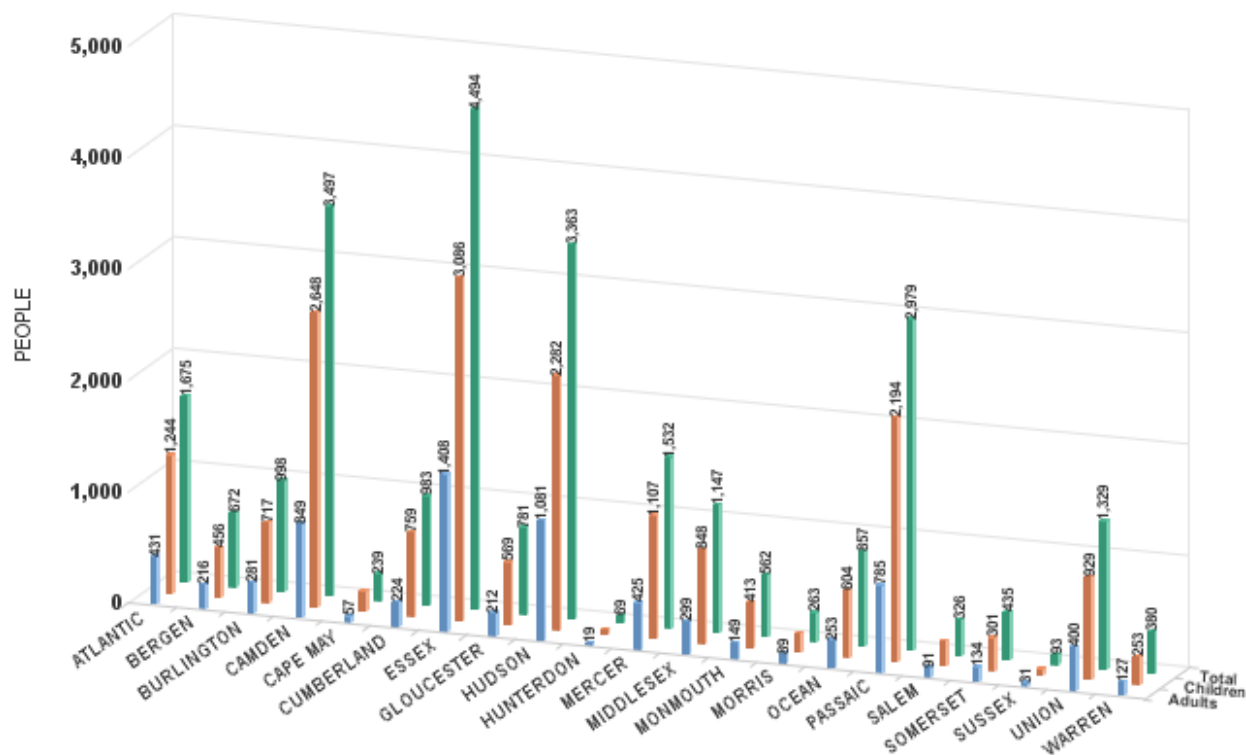

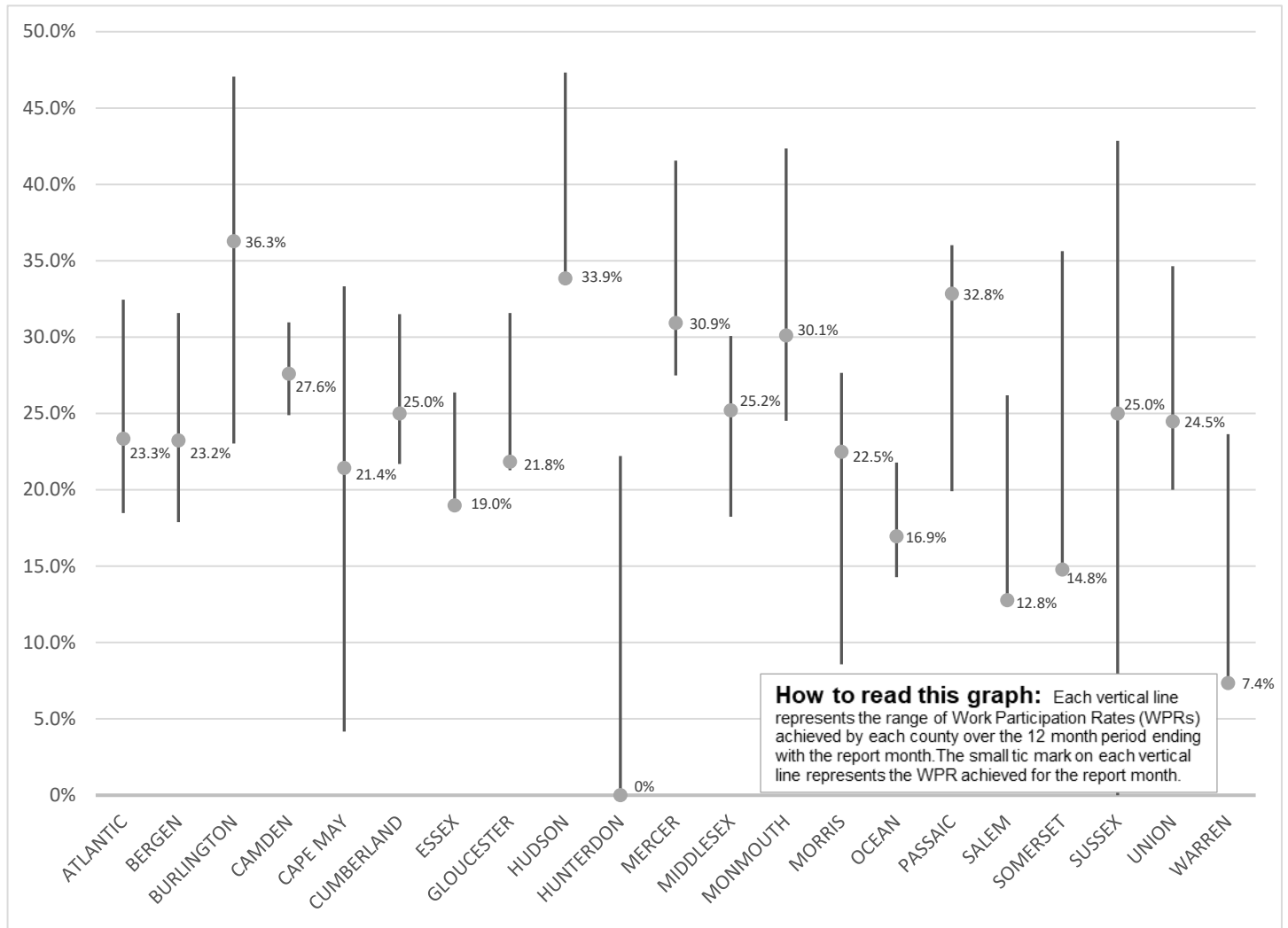

Ending with JUNE 2019

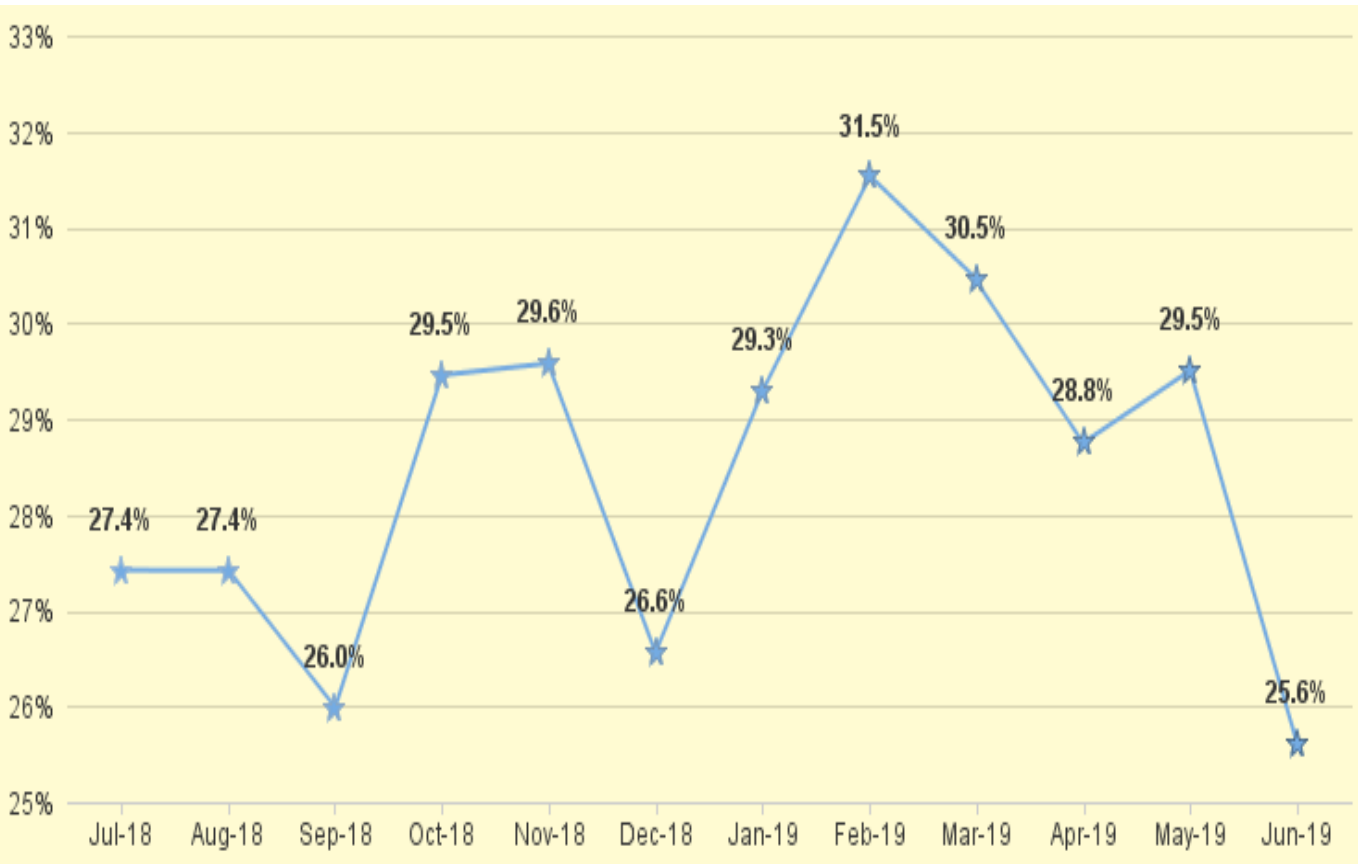

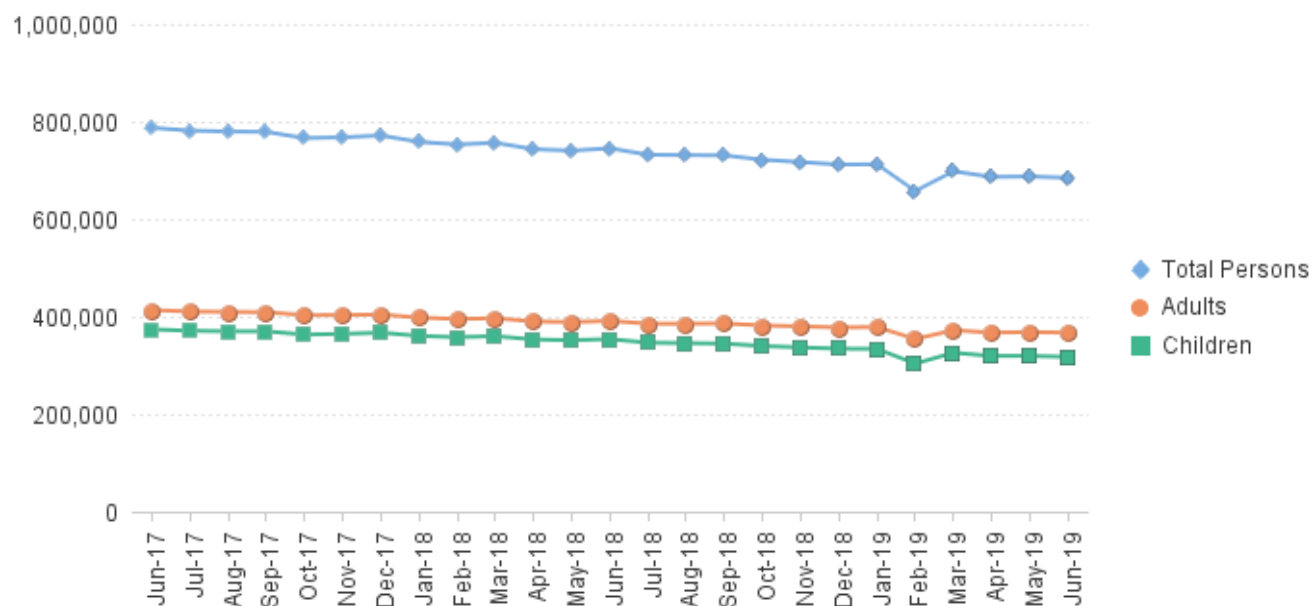

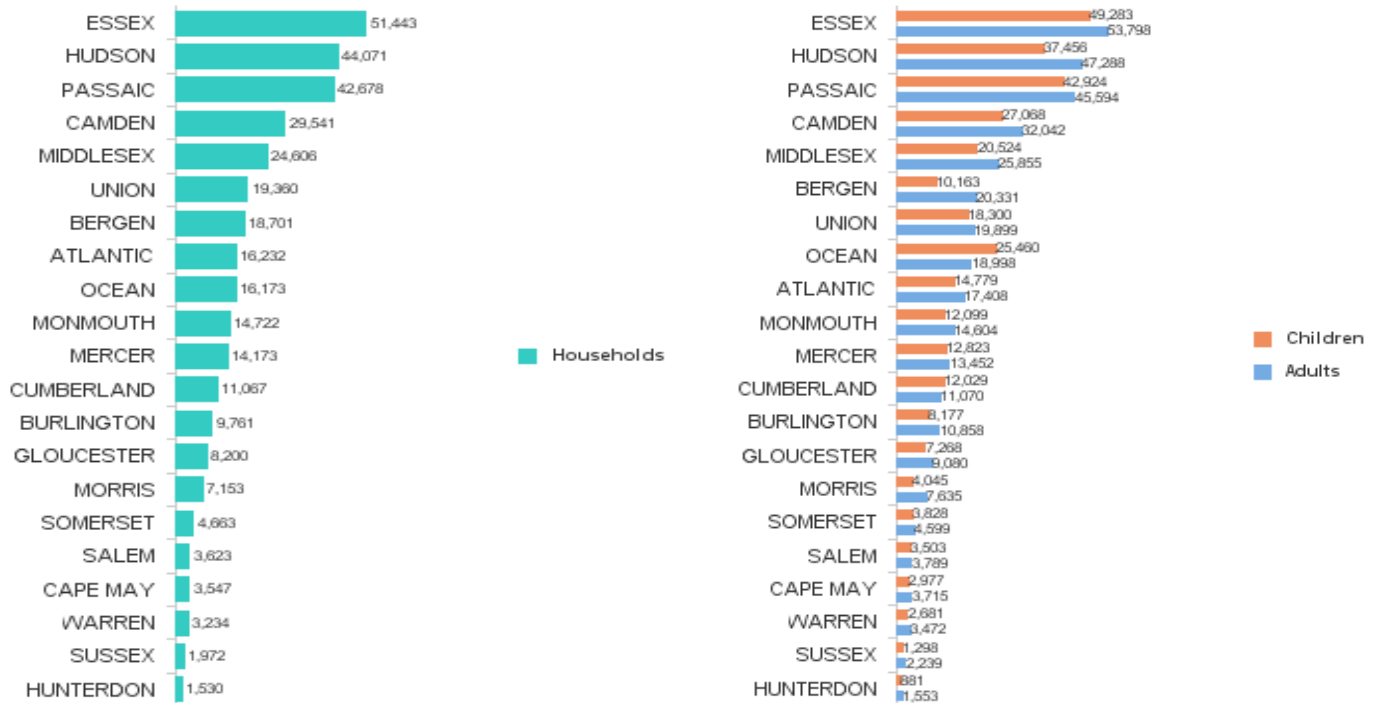

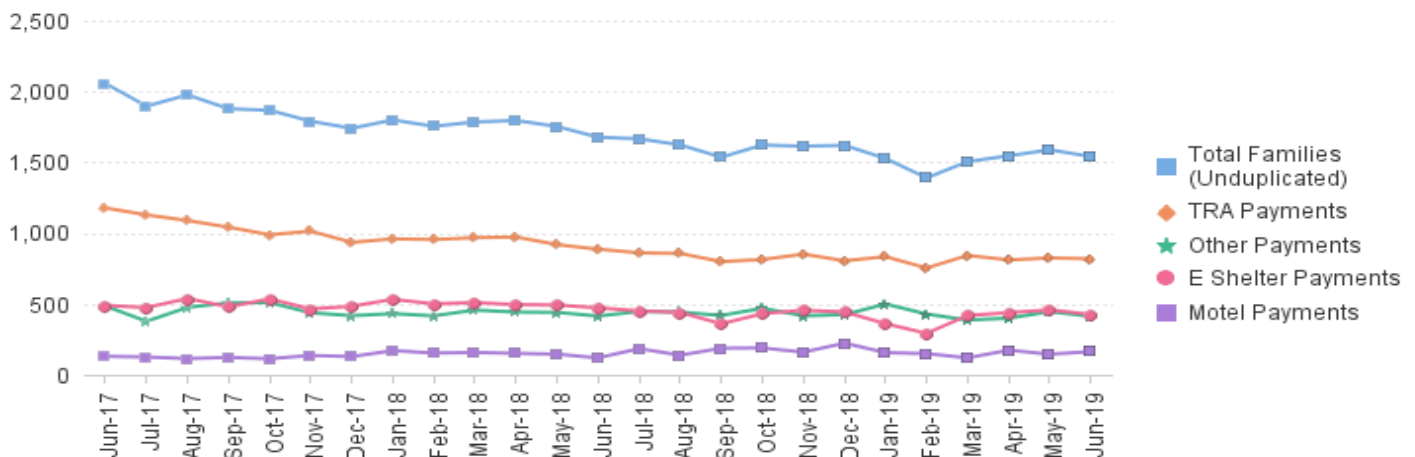

ACRONYMS

EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE (EA) - Payments to those eligible for WFNJ/TANF or WFNJ/GA, authorized during the 30 consecutive days immediately following the emergency (defined as a substantial loss of shelter, food, clothing, or household furnishings by fire, flood or other similar disaster) or if eligible individual or family is in an imminent or actual state of homelessness.

NJ SNAP - Formerly the Food Stamp Program, now known as **NJ SNAP** (NJ Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program) authorized by Congress as a nutritional supplement program to provide low income households with more food of greater variety and better nutrition. Program eligibility is based on household income, resources, and expenses for medical, shelter, and dependent care. CWA staff refers certain recipients to the New Jersey Department of Labor for participation in the Food Stamp Employment and Training Program.

FAMIS: Family Assistance Management Information System

GAAS: General Assistance Automated System

NJKIDS: New Jersey Kids Deserve Support (Child Support Information Management System)

NJ MMIS SHARED DATA WAREHOUSE: The Shared Data Warehouse (SDW) is the repository for New Jersey's DFD and Medicaid data. Since 2003, OptumInsight has administered the SDW and provided access to the data through a reporting tool known as Business Objects.

OMEGA: Online Management of Economic Goal Achievement

SSI-EA: Supplemental Security Income-Emergency Assistance

WFNJ: Work First New Jersey - Fully implemented July 1, 1997, this is New Jersey's welfare reform program which responds to the requirements of the Federal Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act (**PRWORA**) of 1996. PRWORA established Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (**TANF**) as the replacement for AFDC cash assistance. WFNJ includes two segments, **WFNJ/TANF** for families with children, and **WFNJ/GA** (General Assistance) for single adults and couples without dependent children. WFNJ emphasizes achieving self-sufficiency and limits lifetime receipt of financial assistance to a total of five years.
