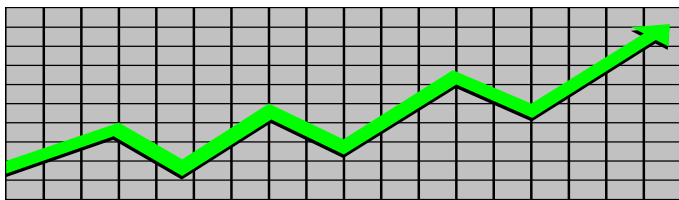

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## **DIVISION OF FAMILY DEVELOPMENT CURRENT PROGRAM STATISTICS MARCH 2015**

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Each month the Division of Family Development publishes its program statistics for: WFNJ/TANF, NJ SNAP, Emergency Assistance, General Assistance, and Child Support Services. When possible, information is provided separately for children and adults. Many tables also provide trend data with information broken down by county for readers to consider. This report is compiled and prepared by The Bureau of Research & Reporting.

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### **WFNJ/TANF**

- As of the end of March, the TANF caseload had decreased by 3,960 cases, from 34,248 in March 2014 to 30,288 in March 2015, a decrease of 11.6%.
- The county where the family caseload percentage increased since March 2014 was Burlington (7.2%).
- The counties with caseloads that decreased the most since March 2014 were Hunterdon (-36.5%), Monmouth (-29.2%), and Warren (-28.3%).
- Of the WFNJ/TANF cases, 7,352 or 24.3% were child-only in March 2015.
- The counties with the most child-only cases were Essex (1,128), Camden (999), and Hudson (810).
- Essex (16,179), Passaic (8,939), Hudson (8,480), Camden (7,857), and Atlantic (5,464) counties had the greatest number of persons receiving TANF in March 2015.

### **NJ SNAP (formerly FOOD STAMPS)**

- In March 2015, there were 447,610 households receiving NJ SNAP benefits. The number of NJ SNAP households increased by 15,479, or 3.6%, since March 2014.
- There were 889,712 persons receiving NJ SNAP benefits as of March 2015, an increase of 25,862 or 3.0% since March 2014.
- The three counties having the highest caseload increase since March 2014 are Bergen (10.5%), Burlington (10.3%), and Atlantic (8.7%).

### **EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE**

- There were 5,779 families receiving Emergency Assistance (EA) in March 2015, a decrease of 786 or 12.0% since March 2014.
- In March 2015, EA payments were made for 1,595 SSI recipients.

**GENERAL ASSISTANCE**

**GA Emergency Assistance**

- There were 5,306 Emergency Assistance payments made to GA cases in March 2015, a decrease of 206 or 3.7% since March 2014.
- The three counties that show an annual percent increase in emergency assistance payments are Somerset (102.3%), Burlington (56.9%), and Cumberland (47.2%).

**GA Program**

- The total numbers of cases receiving GA has decreased from 32,524 to 27,501 since March 2014, a decrease of 15.4%.
- There were 16,131 Employable GA and 11,370 Unemployable GA cases in March 2015.
- Bergen (21.9%), Burlington (15.9%) and Atlantic (11.9%) counties showed the highest percent increase for GA cases since March 2014.
- In March 2015, GA cases showed a 0.6 percent decrease since February 2015.

**CHILD SUPPORT SERVICES (Quarterly Report)**

- The total collection for the Child Support Services Program was about \$331 million from January 2015 to March 2015, an increase of 2.1 percent over the same period for FFY 2014.
- Total distributions increased 1.2% from March 2014.

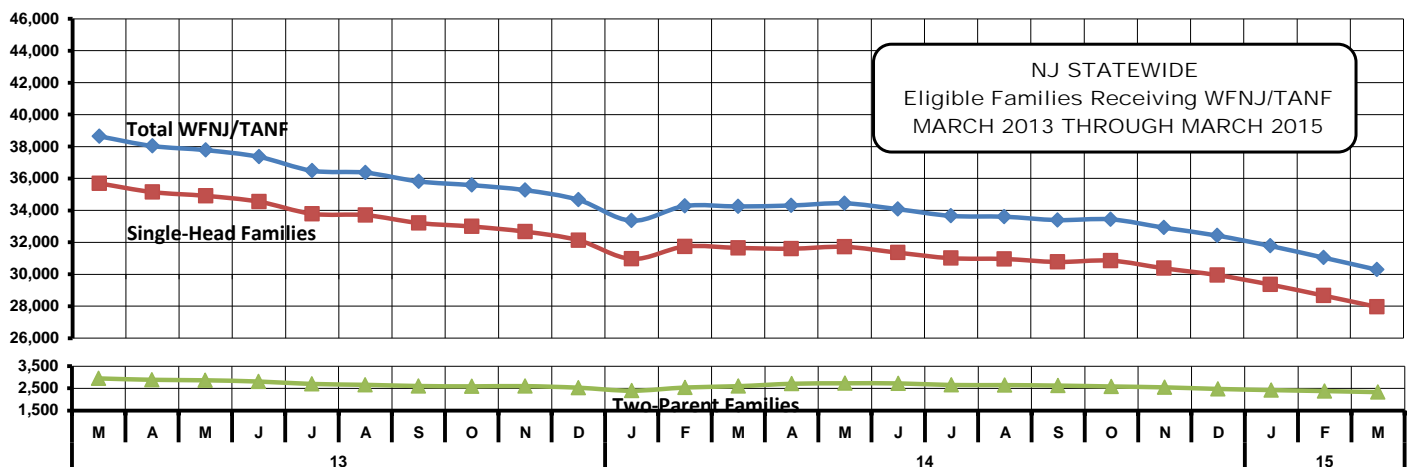
**WORK FIRST NEW JERSEY (WFNJ)**

- During the report month of March 2015, there were 3,359 families in which at least one member was employed and an additional 463 families whose WFNJ assistance cases were closed due to employment - related earnings.
- The three counties with the greatest number of employed active WFNJ recipients were: Essex (940), Hudson (374), and Camden (286).
- There were 3,190 former TANF cases receiving post-TANF support in the form of child care assistance.

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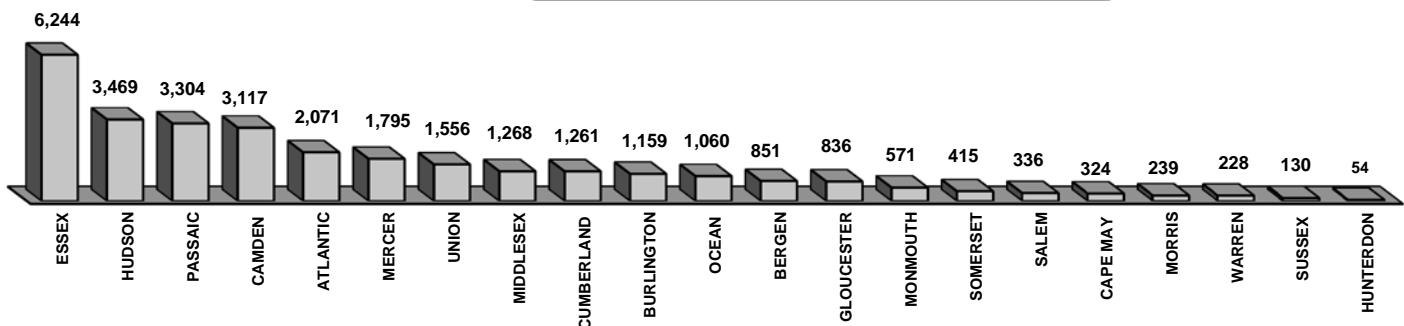

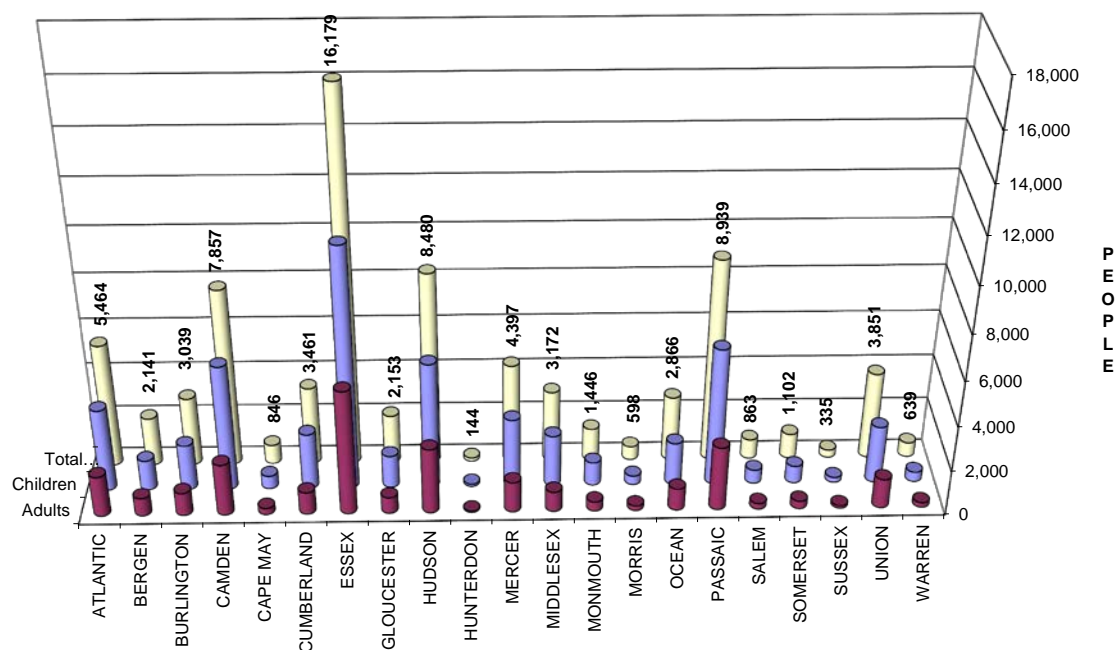

Ending With MARCH 2015**

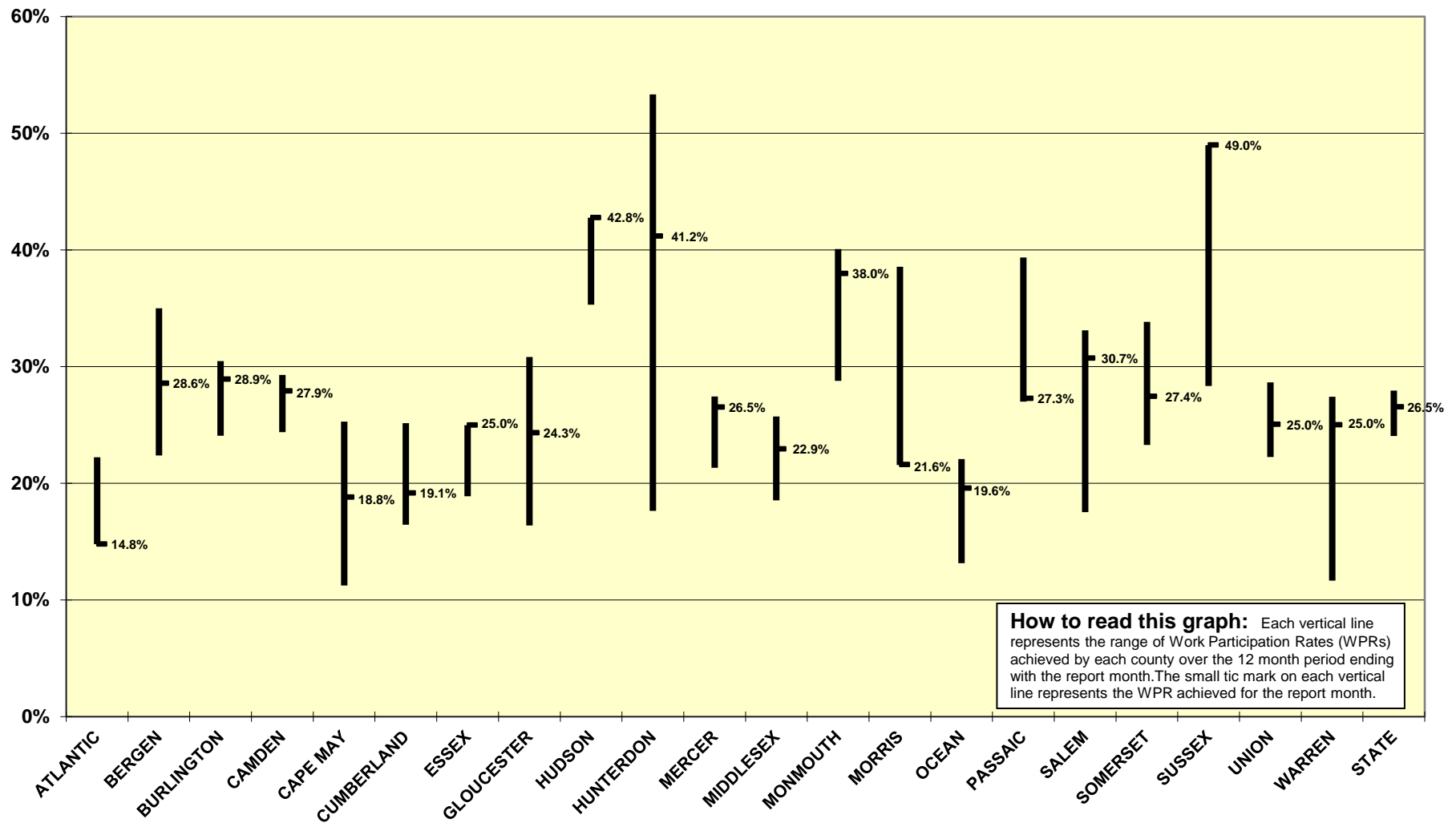
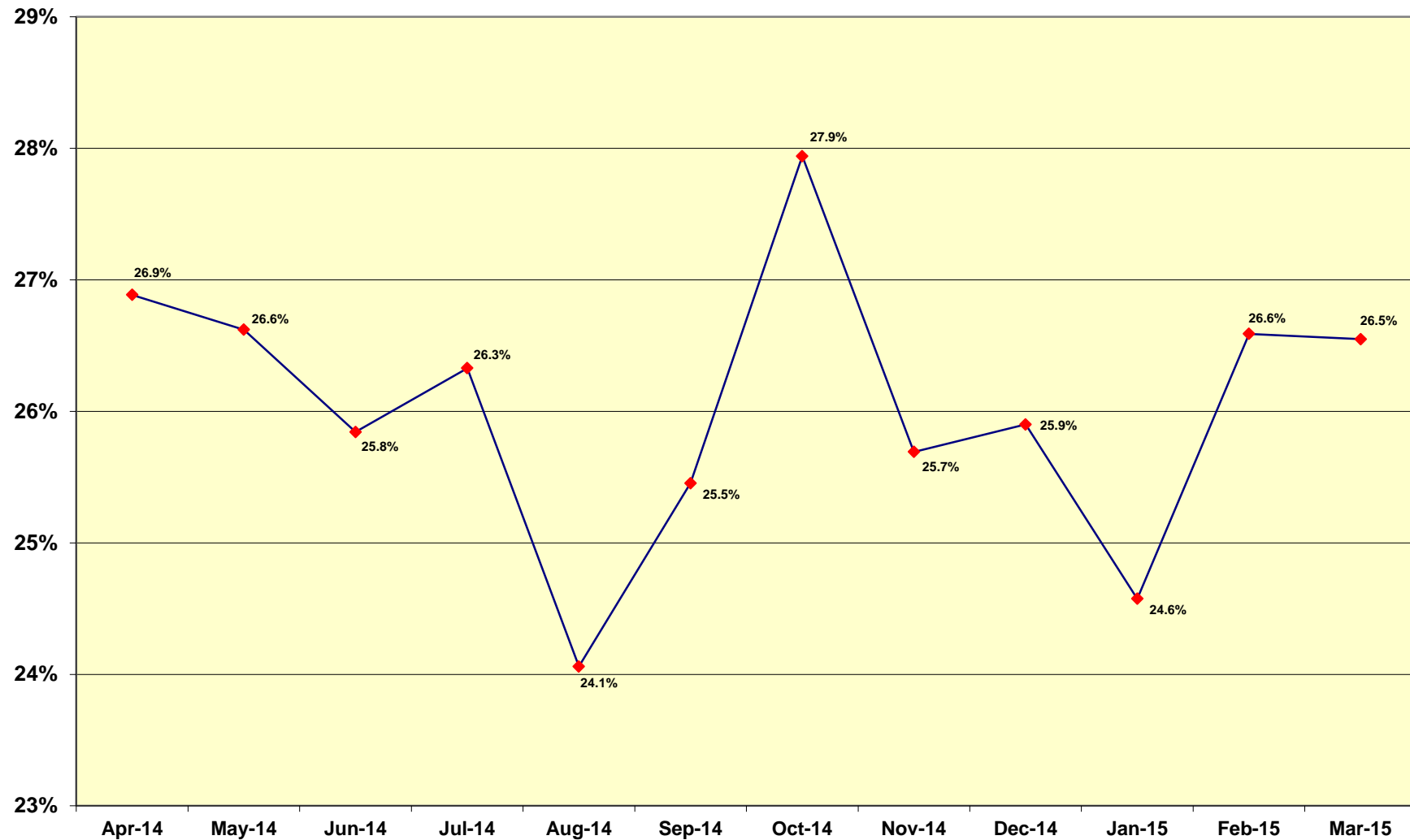

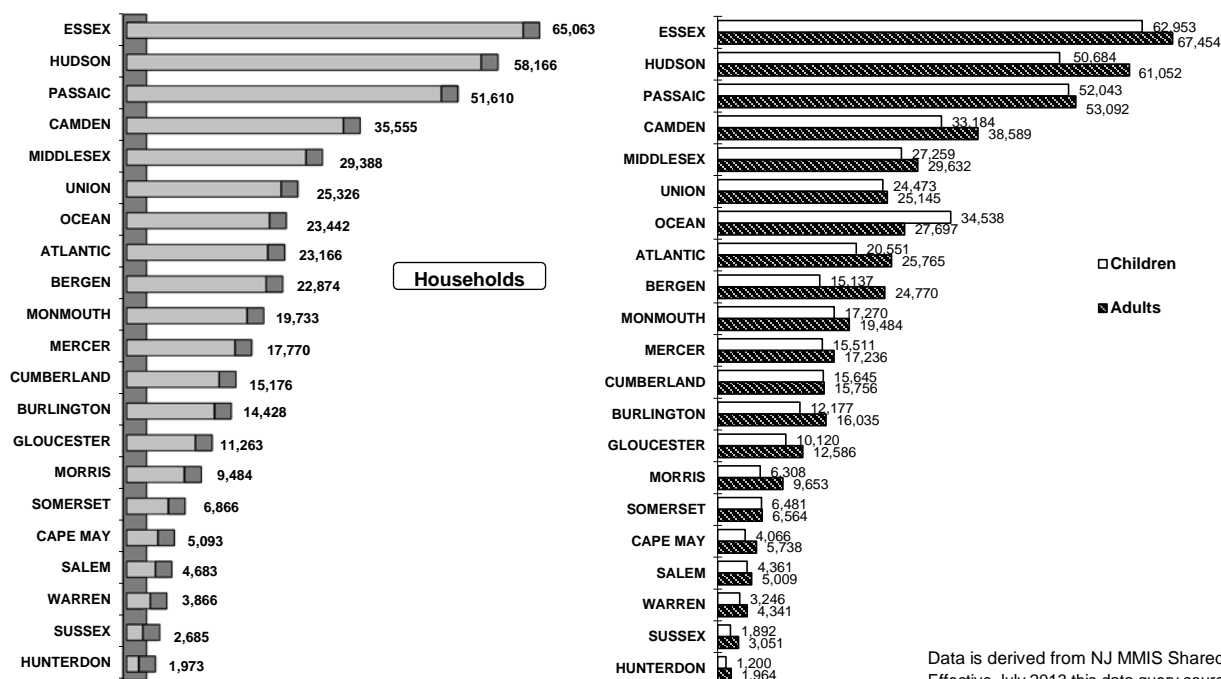
**TABLE 6: NJ SNAP (FOOD STAMPS)

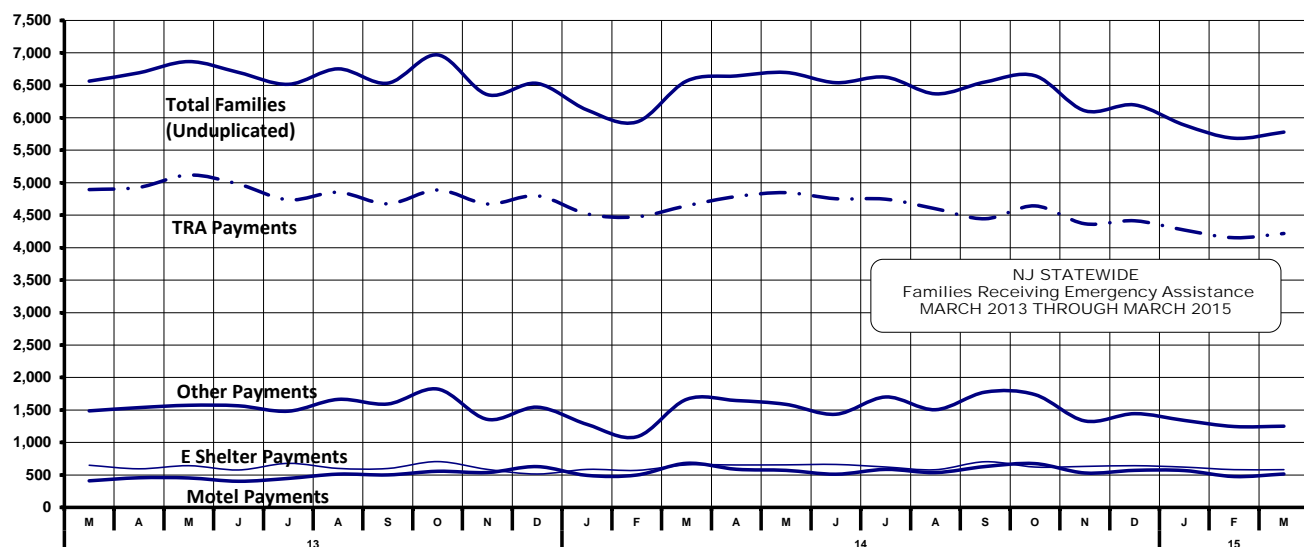

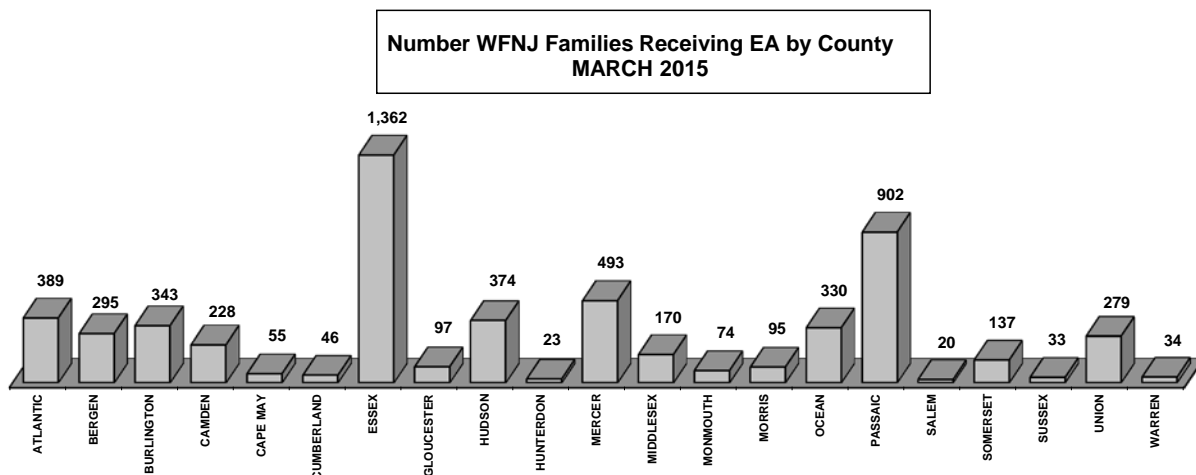
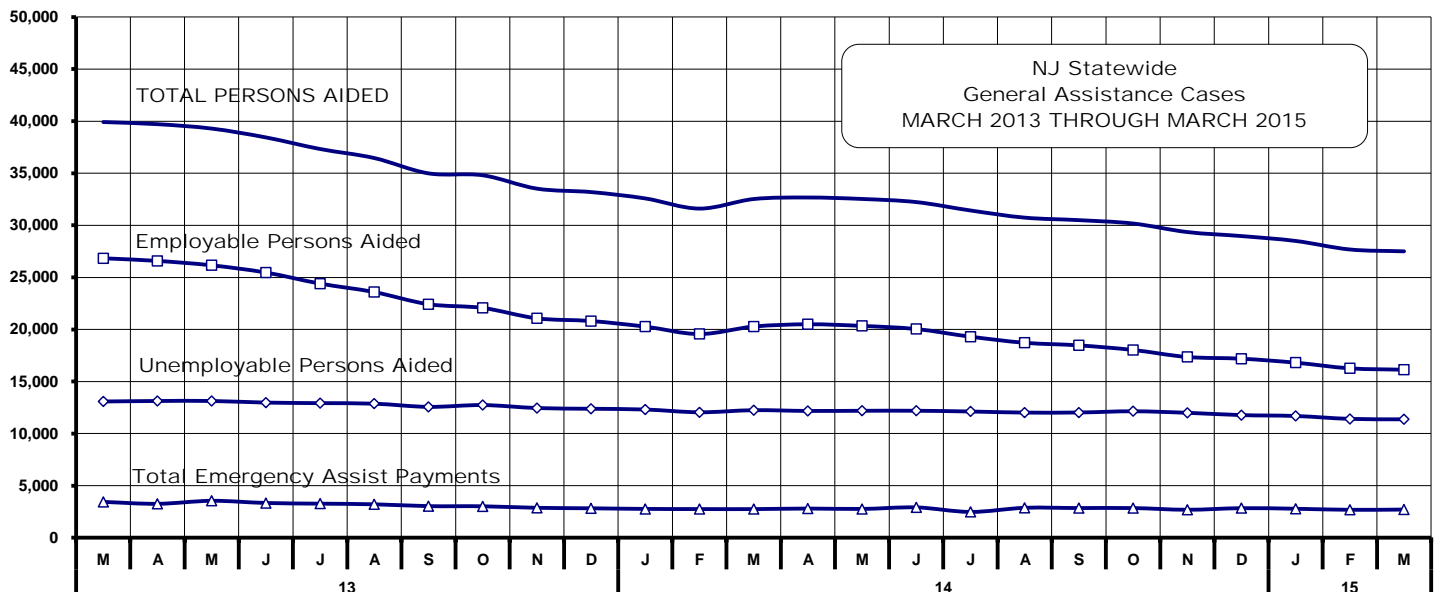

## **ACRONYMS**

**CASS:** Consolidated Assistance and Support System

**EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE (EA)** - Payments to those eligible for WFNJ/TANF or WFNJ/GA, authorized during the 30 consecutive days immediately following the emergency (defined as a substantial loss of shelter, food, clothing, or household furnishings by fire, flood or other similar disaster) or if eligible individual or family is in an imminent or actual state of homelessness.

**NJ SNAP** - Formerly the Food Stamp Program, now known as **NJ SNAP** (NJ Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program) authorized by Congress as a nutritional supplement program to provide low income households with more food of greater variety and better nutrition. Program eligibility is based on household income, resources, and expenses for medical, shelter, and dependent care. CWA staff refers certain recipients to the New Jersey Department of Labor for participation in the Food Stamp Employment and Training Program.

**FAMIS:** Family Assistance Management Information System

**GAAS:** General Assistance Automated System

**NJKiDS:** New Jersey Kids Deserve Support (Child Support Information Management System)

**NJ MMIS SHARED DATA WAREHOUSE:** The Shared Data Warehouse (SDW) is the repository for New Jersey's DFD and Medicaid data. Since 2003, OptumInsight has administered the SDW and provided access to the data through a reporting tool known as Business Objects.

**OMEGA:** Online Management of Economic Goal Achievement

**SSI-EA:** Supplemental Security Income-Emergency Assistance

**WFNJ:** Work First New Jersey - Fully implemented July 1, 1997, this is New Jersey's welfare reform program which responds to the requirements of the Federal Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act (**PRWORA**) of 1996. PRWORA established Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (**TANF**) as the replacement for AFDC cash assistance. WFNJ includes two segments, **WFNJ/TANF** for families with children, and **WFNJ/GA** (General Assistance) for single adults and couples without dependent children. WFNJ emphasizes achieving self-sufficiency and limits lifetime receipt of financial assistance to a total of five years.
