CURRENT PROGRAM STATISTICS

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Each month the Division of Family Development publishes its program statistics for: WFNJ/TANF, NJ SNAP, Emergency Assistance, General Assistance, and Child Support Services. When possible, information is provided separately for children and adults. Many tables also provide trend data with information broken down by county for readers to consider. This report is compiled and prepared by The Bureau of Research & Reporting.

WFNJ/TANF

- As of the end of March, the TANF caseload had decreased by 7,229 cases, from 30,288 in March 2015 to 23,059 in March 2016, a decrease of 23.9%.
- The counties with caseloads that decreased the most since March 2015 were Somerset (-32.3%), Sussex (-32.3%), Monmouth (-34.5%) and Warren (-34.6%).
- Of the WFNJ/TANF cases, 6,469 or 28.1% were child-only in March 2016.
- The counties with the most child-only cases were Essex (940), Camden (889) and Hudson (689).
- Essex (11,036), Passaic (7,375), Camden (6,523), Hudson (6,420) and Atlantic (4,209) counties had the greatest number of persons receiving TANF in March 2016.

NJ SNAP (formerly FOOD STAMPS)

- In March 2016, there were 437,103 households receiving NJ SNAP benefits. The number of NJ SNAP households decreased by 10,507 or 2.3%, since March 2015.
- There were 866,418 persons receiving NJ SNAP benefits as of March 2016, a decrease of 23,294 or 2.6% since March 2015.
- The two counties having the highest caseload increase since March 2015 are Middlesex (2.2%) and Bergen (2.1%).

EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE

- There were 3,366 families receiving Emergency Assistance (EA) in March 2016, a decrease of 2,413 or 41.8% since March 2015.
- In March 2016, EA payments were made for 784 SSI recipients.

GENERAL ASSISTANCE

GA Emergency Assistance

- There were 3,352 Emergency Assistance payments made to GA cases in March 2016, a decrease of 1,954 or 36.8% since March 2015.
- The counties that show the highest percent decrease in emergency assistance payments were Cumberland (55.7%), Warren (55.7%) and Salem (76.3%).

GA Program

- The total numbers of cases receiving GA has decreased from 27,501 to 20,034 since March 2015, a decrease of 27.2%.
- There were 10,449 Employable GA and 9,585 Unemployable GA cases in March 2016.
- The counties that showed the highest percent decrease for GA cases since March 2015 were Cumberland (42.0%), Monmouth (43.7%) and Somerset (44.3%).
- In March 2016, GA cases showed a 1.4 percent decrease since February 2016.

CHILD SUPPORT SERVICES (Quarterly Report)

- The total collection for the Child Support Services Program was about \$336 million from January 2016 to March 2016, an increase of 1.4 percent over the same period for FFY 2015.
- Total distributions increased 0.7% from March 2015.


WORK FIRST NEW JERSEY (WFNJ)

- During the report month of March 2016, there were 2,483 families in which at least one member was employed and an additional 457 families whose WFNJ assistance cases were closed due to employment related earnings.
- The three counties with the greatest number of employed active WFNJ recipients were: Essex (654), Passaic (284) and Camden (279).
- There were 3,318 former TANF cases receiving post-TANF support in the form of child care assistance.





Work Participation Rates Achieved Over 12 Month Period Ending With MARCH 2016








ACRONYMS

CASS: Consolidated Assistance and Support System

EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE (EA) - Payments to those eligible for WFNJ/TANF or WFNJ/GA, authorized during the 30 consecutive days immediately following the emergency (defined as a substantial loss of shelter, food, clothing, or household furnishings by fire, flood or other similar disaster) or if eligible individual or family is an imminent or actual state of homelessness.

NJ SNAP - Formerly the Food Stamp Program, now known as **NJ SNAP** (NJ Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program) authorized by Congress as a nutritional supplement program to provide low income households with more food of greater variety and better nutrition. Program eligibility is based on household income, resources, and expenses for medical, shelter, and dependent care. CWA staff refers certain recipients to the New Jersey Department of Labor for participation in the Food Stamp Employment and Training Program.

FAMIS: Family Assistance Management Information System

GAAS: General Assistance Automated System

NJKiDS: New Jersey Kids Deserve Support (Child Support Information Management System)

NJ MMIS SHARED DATA WAREHOUSE: The Shared Data Warehouse (SDW) is the repository for New Jersey's DFD and Medicaid data. Since 2003, OptumInsight has administered the SDW and provided access to the data through a reporting tool known as Business Objects.

OMEGA: Online Management of Economic Goal Achievement

SSI-EA: Supplemental Security Income-Emergency Assistance

WFNJ: Work First New Jersey - Fully implemented July 1, 1997, this is New Jersey's welfare reform program which responds to the requirements of the Federal Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act (PRWORA) of 1996. PRWORA established Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) as the replacement for AFDC cash assistance. WFNJ includes two segments, WFNJ/TANF for families with children, and WFNJ/GA (General Assistance) for single adults and couples without dependent children. WFNJ emphasizes achieving self-sufficiency and limits lifetime receipt of financial assistance to a total of five years.

EXPLANATORY NOTES

The Department of Human Services Division of Family Development provides basic income and an opportunity to achieve self-sufficiency for individuals and families served by the Division's programs. The Division provides leadership, direction and supervision to those public agencies responsible for administering those programs and plans for and develops policies to promote self-sufficiency.
