# CURRENT PROGRAM Statistics

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Each month the Division of Family Development publishes its program statistics for: WFNJ/TANF, NJ SNAP, Emergency Assistance, General Assistance, and Child Support Services. When possible, information is provided separately for children and adults. Many tables also provide trend data with information broken down by county for readers to consider. This report is compiled and prepared by The Bureau of Research & Statistics.

#### WFNJ/TANF

- As of the end of May, the TANF caseload had decreased by 848 cases, from 40,890 in May 2011 to 40,042 in May 2012.
- The counties with the highest family caseload percentage increase since May 2011 include Passaic (12.5%), Ocean (5.1%), and Somerset (3.1%).
- The counties with caseloads that decreased since May 2011 were Salem (-9.0%), Cumberland (-10.9%), and Monmouth (-13.6%).
- Of the WFNJ/TANF cases, 8,855 or 22.1% were child-only in May 2012.
- The counties with the most child-only cases were Essex (1,425), Hudson (1,123), and Camden (1,153).
- Essex (20,928), Passaic (12,536), and Hudson (11,561) counties had the greatest number of persons receiving TANF in May 2012.

# NJ SNAP (formerly FOOD STAMPS)

- In May 2012, there were 405,623 households receiving NJ SNAP benefits. The number of NJ SNAP households increased by 34,342, or 9.2%, since May 2011.
- There were 813,889 persons receiving NJ SNAP benefits as of May 2012, an increase of 62,443 or 8.3% since May 2011.
- The three counties having the highest caseload increase since May 2011 are Middlesex (16.0%), Monmouth (14.5%), and Camden (14.3%).

#### **EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE**

- There were 6,838 families receiving Emergency Assistance (EA) in May 2012, a decrease of 79 or 1.1% since May 2011.
- In May 2012, EA payments were made for 1,630 SSI recipients.

# **GENERAL ASSISTANCE**

#### **GA Emergency Assistance**

- There were 7,017 Emergency Assistance payments made to GA cases in May 2012, a decrease of 1,691 or 19.4% since May 2011.
- The three counties that show an annual percent increase in emergency assistance payments are Mercer (18.8%), Middlesex (8.5%), and Union (8.2%).

#### **GA Program**

- The total numbers of cases receiving GA has decreased from 55,979 to 44,499 since May 2011, a decrease of 20.5%.
- There were 31,278 Employable GA and 13,221 Unemployable GA cases in May 2012.
- In May 2012, GA cases showed a 0.1 percent decrease since April 2012.

# CHILD SUPPORT SERVICES (Quarterly Report)

- The total collection for the Child Support Services Program was about \$332 million from January 2012 to March 2012, an increase of 3.5 percent over the same period for FFY 2011.
- Total distributions increased over 4.2% from March 2011.

# WORK FIRST NEW JERSEY (WFNJ)

- During the report month of May 2012, there were 4,300 families in which at least one member was employed and an additional 582 families whose WFNJ assistance cases were closed due to employment related earnings.
- The three counties with the greatest number of employed active WFNJ recipients were: Essex (978), Camden (507), and Hudson (487).





# WFNJ/TANF Work Participation Rates for 12-Month Period Ending with MAY 2012 Statewide










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# ACRONYMS

CASS: Consolidated Assistance and Support System

**EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE (EA)** - Payments to those eligible for WFNJ/TANF or WFNJ/GA, authorized during the 30 consecutive days immediately following the emergency (defined as a substantial loss of shelter, food, clothing, or household furnishings by fire, flood or other similar disaster) or if eligible individual or family is an imminent or actual state of homelessness.

**NJ SNAP** - Formerly the Food Stamp Program, now known as **NJ SNAP** (NJ Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program) authorized by Congress as a nutritional supplement program to provide low income households with more food of greater variety and better nutrition. Program eligibility is based on household income, resources, and expenses for medical, shelter, and dependent care. CWA staff refers certain recipients to the New Jersey Department of Labor for participation in the Food Stamp Employment and Training Program.

FAMIS: Family Assistance Management Information System

GAAS: General Assistance Automated System

NJKiDS: New Jersey Kids Deserve Support (Child Support Information Management System)

**NJ MMIS SHARED DATA WAREHOUSE**: The Shared Data Warehouse (SDW) is the repository for New Jersey's DFD and Medicaid data. Since 2003, OptumInsight has administered the SDW and provided access to the data through a reporting tool known as Business Objects.

OMEGA: Online Management of Economic Goal Achievement

SSI-EA: Supplemental Security Income-Emergency Assistance

**WFNJ**: Work First New Jersey - Fully implemented July 1, 1997, this is New Jersey's welfare reform program which responds to the requirements of the Federal Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act (**PRWORA**) of 1996. PRWORA established Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (**TANF**) as the replacement for AFDC cash assistance. WFNJ includes two segments, **WFNJ/TANF** for families with children, and **WFNJ/GA** (General Assistance) for single adults and couples without dependent children. WFNJ emphasizes achieving self-sufficiency and limits lifetime receipt of financial assistance to a total of five years.

# **EXPLANATORY NOTES**

The Department of Human Services Division of Family Development provides basic income and an opportunity to achieve self-sufficiency for individuals and families served by the Division's programs. The Division provides leadership, direction and supervision to those public agencies responsible for administering those programs and plans for and develops policies to promote self-sufficiency.
