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#### DIVISION OF FAMILY DEVELOPMENT CURRENT PROGRAM STATISTICS NOVEMBER 2016

Each month the Division of Family Development publishes its program statistics for: WFNJ/TANF, NJ SNAP, Emergency Assistance, General Assistance, and Child Support Services. When possible, information is provided separately for children and adults. Many tables also provide trend data with information broken down by county for readers to consider. This report is compiled and prepared by The Bureau of Research & Reporting.

#### WFNJ/TANF

- As of the end of November, the TANF caseload had decreased by 6,087 cases, from 25,709 in November 2015 to 19,622 in November 2016, a decrease of 23.7%.
- The county where the family caseload percentage increased since November 2015 was Warren (6.7%).
- The counties with caseloads that decreased the most since November 2015 were Burlington (-32.6%), Ocean (-37.3%) and Hunterdon (-45.8%).
- Of the WFNJ/TANF cases, 5,766 or 29.4% were child-only in November 2016.
- The counties with the most child-only cases were Essex (874), Camden (794) and Passaic (604).
- Essex (8,998), Passaic (6,524), Camden (5,891), Hudson (5,741) and Atlantic (3,472) counties had the greatest number of persons receiving TANF in November 2016.

#### **NJ SNAP (formerly FOOD STAMPS)**

- In November 2016, there were 418,730 households receiving NJ SNAP benefits. The number of NJ SNAP households decreased by 24,712 or 5.6%, since November 2015.
- There were 835,237 persons receiving NJ SNAP benefits as of November 2016, a decrease of 45,702 or 5.2% since November 2015.
- The three counties having the highest caseload decrease since November 2015 are Gloucester (10.2%), Salem (11.9%) and Burlington (14.0%).

#### **EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE**

- There were 2,569 families receiving Emergency Assistance (EA) in November 2016, a decrease of 1,278 or 33.2% since November 2015.
- In November 2016, EA payments were made for 521 SSI recipients.

#### **GENERAL ASSISTANCE**

#### **GA Emergency Assistance**

- There were 2,697 Emergency Assistance payments made to GA cases in November 2016, a decrease of 726 or 21.2% since November 2015.
- The counties that showed a percent increase in emergency assistance payments were Somerset (47.6%), Camden (53.2%) and Ocean (133.5%).
- The counties that showed the highest percent decrease in emergency assistance payments were Passaic (39.5%), Cumberland (40.9%) and Monmouth (61.7%).

#### **GA Program**

- The total numbers of cases receiving GA has decreased from 21,968 to 16,177 since November 2015, a decrease of 26.4%.
- There were 7,084 Employable GA and 9,093 Unemployable GA cases in November 2016.
- The county that showed a percent increase in GA cases was Ocean (13.0%).
- The counties that showed the highest percent decrease for GA cases since November 2015 were Atlantic (36.6%), Cape May (40.2%) and Passaic (44.3%).
- In November 2016, GA cases showed a 2.6 percent decrease since October 2016.

#### **CHILD SUPPORT SERVICES (Quarterly Report)**

- The total collection for the Child Support Services Program was about \$320 million from July 2016 to September 2016, a decrease of 0.2 percent over the same period for FFY 2015.
- Total distributions increased 0.7% from September 2015.

#### **WORK FIRST NEW JERSEY (WFNJ)**


- During the report month of November 2016, there were 2,124 families in which at least one member was employed and an additional 396 families whose WFNJ assistance cases were closed due to employment related earnings.
- The three counties with the greatest number of employed active WFNJ recipients were: Essex (516), Camden (286) and Hudson (239).
- There were 2,900 former TANF cases receiving post-TANF support in the form of child care assistance.





#### **ACRONYMS**

**EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE (EA) -** Payments to those eligible for WFNJ/TANF or WFNJ/GA, authorized during the 30 consecutive days immediately following the emergency (defined as a substantial loss of shelter, food, clothing, or household furnishings by fire, flood or other similar disaster) or if eligible individual or family is an imminent or actual state of homelessness.

**NJ SNAP** - Formerly the Food Stamp Program, now known as **NJ SNAP** (NJ Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program) authorized by Congress as a nutritional supplement program to provide low income households with more food of greater variety and better nutrition. Program eligibility is based on household income, resources, and expenses for medical, shelter, and dependent care. CWA staff refers certain recipients to the New Jersey Department of Labor for participation in the Food Stamp Employment and Training Program.

**FAMIS**: Family Assistance Management Information System

**GAAS**: General Assistance Automated System

**NJKiDS**: New Jersey Kids Deserve Support (Child Support Information Management System)

**NJ MMIS SHARED DATA WAREHOUSE**: The Shared Data Warehouse (SDW) is the repository for New Jersey's DFD and Medicaid data. Since 2003, OptumInsight has administered the SDW and provided access to the data through a reporting tool known as Business Objects.

**OMEGA**: Online Management of Economic Goal Achievement

**SSI-EA**: Supplemental Security Income-Emergency Assistance

**WFNJ**: Work First New Jersey - Fully implemented July 1, 1997, this is New Jersey's welfare reform program which responds to the requirements of the Federal Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act (**PRWORA**) of 1996. PRWORA established Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (**TANF**) as the replacement for AFDC cash assistance. WFNJ includes two segments, **WFNJ/TANF** for families with children, and **WFNJ/GA** (General Assistance) for single adults and couples without dependent children. WFNJ emphasizes achieving self-sufficiency and limits lifetime receipt of financial assistance to a total of five years.
