# CURRENT PROGRAM STATISTICS

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Each month the Division of Family Development publishes its program statistics for: WFNJ/TANF, Food Stamps, Emergency Assistance, General Assistance, and Child Support Services. When possible, information is provided separately for children and adults. Many tables also provide trend data with information broken down by county for readers to consider. This report is compiled and prepared by The Bureau of Research & Statistics.

### WFNJ/TANF

- At the end of October, the TANF caseload increased by 2,694 cases, from 38,125 in October 2009 to 40,819 in October 2010, a 7.1% increase.
- The counties with the highest family caseload percentage increase since October 2009 include Burlington (20.1%), Passaic (19.6%), and Ocean (18.4%).
- The counties that increased the least since October 2009 were Hudson (0.4%) and Middlesex (0.1%), the county that decreased since October 2009 was Cumberland (-4.5%).
- Of the WFNJ/TANF families, 9,849 or 24.1% were child-only cases in October 2010.
- The counties with the most child-only cases were Essex (1,740), Hudson (1,299), and Camden (1,144).
- Essex (22,980), Hudson (12,512), and Camden (11,152) counties have the greatest number of persons receiving TANF in October 2010.

### FOOD STAMP PROGRAM

- In October 2010, there are 341,116 households receiving food stamps. Food Stamp households increased by 66,659, or 24.3%, since October 2009.
- There were 694,925 persons receiving food stamps as of October 2010, an increase of 134,887 or 24.1% since October 2009.
- The three counties having the highest caseload increase since October 2009 are Ocean (42.7%), Hunterdon (37.9%), and Middlesex (34.2%).

### **EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE**

- There were 6,491 families receiving emergency assistance (EA) in October 2010, an increase of 727 or 12.6% since October 2009.
- In October 2010, EA payments were made for 1,780 SSI recipients.

### **GENERAL ASSISTANCE**

### **GA Emergency Assistance**

- There were 8,350 emergency assistance payments made to GA recipients in October 2010, a decrease of 76 or -0.9% since October 2009.
- The three counties that show an annual percent increase in emergency assistance payments are Hunterdon (51.9%), Salem (27.2%), and Union (24.5%).

### **GA Program**

- The total numbers of persons for GA has increased from 50,278 to 53,768 since October 2009, an increase of 6.9%.
- There were 35,896 Employable GA and 17,872 Unemployable GA recipients in October 2010.
- Middlesex (38.8%), Hudson (33.9%), and Ocean (26.2%) counties showed the highest percent increase for GA persons since October 2009.

### **CHILD SUPPORT SERVICES (Quarterly Report)**

- The total collection for the Child Support Services Program was about 300 million dollars from July 2009 to September 2010, a decrease of -0.6 percent over the same period for FFY 2009.
- Total distributions increased over 0.1 percent from September 2009.


### **WORK FIRST NEW JERSEY (WFNJ)**

- During the report month of October 2010, there were 4,068 families where at least one member is employed and an additional 592 families where WFNJ assistance cases were closed due to employment related earnings.
- The three counties with the greatest number of employed active recipients were: Essex (996), Hudson (457), and Camden (376).
- There were 3,195 former TANF cases receiving post-TANF support in the form of child care assistance.







# WFNJ/TANF Work Participation Rates for 12-Month Period Ending with OCTOBER 2010 Statewide









## **ACRONYMS**

ACSES: Automated Child Support Enforcement System

CASS: Consolidated Assistance and Support System

**EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE (EA)** - Payments to those eligible for WFNJ/TANF or WFNJ/GA, authorized during the 30 consecutive days immediately following the emergency (defined as a substantial loss of shelter, food, clothing, or household furnishings by fire, flood or other similar disaster) or if eligible individual or family is an imminent or actual state of homelessness.

**FOOD STAMP PROGRAM (FS)** - Now known as **SNAP** (Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program) authorized by Congress as a nutritional supplement program to provide low income households with more food of greater variety and better nutrition. Program eligibility is based on household income, resources, and expenses for medical, shelter, and dependent care. CWA staff refers certain recipients to the New Jersey Department of Labor for participation in the Food Stamp Employment and Training Program.

FAMIS: Family Assistance Management Information System

**GAAS**: General Assistance Automated System

NJKIDS: New Jersey Kids Deserve Support (Child Support Information Management System)

**NJ MMIS SHARED DATA WAREHOUSE**: The Shared Data Warehouse (SDW) is the repository for New Jersey's DFD and Medicaid data. Since 2003, Ingenix has administered the SDW and provided access to the data through a reporting tool known as Business Objects.

**OMEGA**: Online Management of Economic Goal Achievement

SSI-EA: Supplemental Security Income-Emergency Assistance

WFNJ: Work First New Jersey - Fully implemented July 1, 1997, this is New Jersey's welfare reform program which responds to the requirements of the Federal Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act (PRWORA) of 1996. PRWORA establishes Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) as the replacement for AFDC cash assistance. WFNJ includes two segments, WFNJ/TANF for families with children, and WFNJ/GA (General Assistance) for single adults and couples without dependent children. The emphasis is on achieving self-sufficiency and limits lifetime receipt of financial assistance to a total of five years.

# **EXPLANATORY NOTES**

The Department of Human Services Division of Family Development provides basic income and an opportunity to achieve self-sufficiency for individuals and families served by the Division's programs. The Division provides leadership, direction and supervision to those public agencies responsible for administering those programs and plans for and develops policies to promote self-sufficiency.
