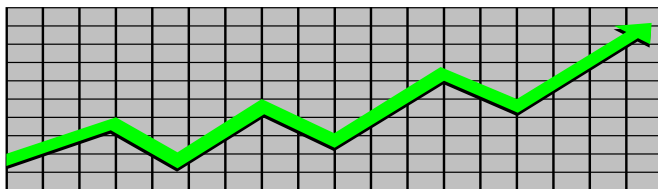

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## **DIVISION OF FAMILY DEVELOPMENT CURRENT PROGRAM STATISTICS**

### **OCTOBER 2024**

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Each month the Division of Family Development publishes its program statistics for: WFNJ/TANF, NJ SNAP, Emergency Assistance, General Assistance, and Child Support Services. When possible, information is provided separately for children and adults. Many tables also provide trend data with information broken down by county for readers to consider. This report is compiled and prepared by The Bureau of Research & Reporting.

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#### **WFNJ/TANF**

- As of the end of October, the TANF caseload had increased by 41 cases, from 11,522 in October 2023 to 11,563 in October 2024; an increase of 0.4%.
- The counties with caseloads that increased the most since October 2023 were Gloucester (13.5%), Cumberland (11.6%), and Middlesex (10.5%).
- The counties with caseloads that decreased the most since October 2023 were Sussex (-16.7%), Bergen (-14.3%), and Essex (-11.8%).
- Of the WFNJ/TANF cases, 2,352 or 20.3% were child-only in October 2024.
- The counties with the most child-only cases were Camden (392), Hudson (335), and Essex (233).
- Hudson (5,502), Essex (4,200), and Camden (4,154) counties had the greatest number of persons receiving TANF in October 2024.

#### **NJ SNAP (Formerly FOOD STAMPS)**

- In October 2024, there were 447,677 households receiving NJ SNAP benefits. The number of NJ SNAP households increased by 36,152 or 8.8%, since October 2023.
- There were 837,471 persons receiving NJ SNAP benefits as of October 2024; an increase of 50,229 or 6.4% since October 2023.
- The counties having the highest SNAP caseload increase since October 2023 were Essex (18.5%), Union (13.8%), and Morris (12.9%).

#### **EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE**

- There were 1,864 TANF families receiving Emergency Assistance (EA) in October 2024; an increase of 369 or 24.7% since October 2023.
- In October 2024, EA payments were made for 635 SSI recipients.

## **DIVISION OF FAMILY DEVELOPMENT CURRENT PROGRAM STATISTICS OCTOBER 2024**

- There were 2,337 GA cases with Emergency Assistance payments in October 2024; an increase of 545 or 30.4% since October 2023.
- The counties that showed the highest percent increase in Emergency Assistance payments were Salem (400%), Sussex (366.7%), and Passaic (310.5%).
- The counties that showed the highest percent decrease in Emergency Assistance payments were Union (-58.6%), Ocean (-16.5%), and Atlantic (-15.7%).

### **GENERAL ASSISTANCE**

- The total numbers of cases receiving GA has increased from 12,828 to 16,272 since October 2023; an increase of 26.8%.
- There were 12,182 Employable GA and 4,090 Unemployable GA cases in October 2024.
- The counties that showed a percent increase for GA cases were Passaic (63.7%), Salem (58.8%), and Burlington (47%) since October 2023.
- The counties that showed the highest percent decrease for GA cases since October 2023 was Hunterdon (-19.3%).
- In October 2024, GA cases showed a 3.52% increase since September 2024.

### **CHILD SUPPORT SERVICES (QUARTERLY REPORT)**

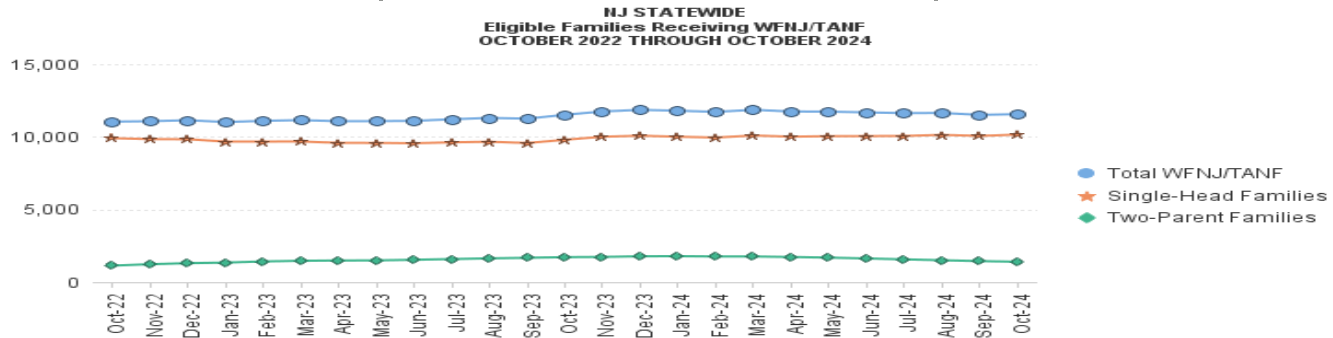
- The total collection for the Child Support Services Program was about \$258 million from July 2024 to September 2024; a decrease of -0.67% over the same period from FFY 2023.
- Total distributions decreased -1.6% from September 2023.

### **WORK FIRST NEW JERSEY (WFNJ)**

- During the report month of October 2024, there were 642 families in which at least one member was employed and an additional 171 families whose WFNJ assistance cases were closed due to employment - related earnings.
- The three counties with the greatest number of employed active WFNJ recipients were: Hudson (125), Essex (110), and Mercer (65).
- There were 244 former TANF cases receiving post-TANF support in the form of child care assistance.

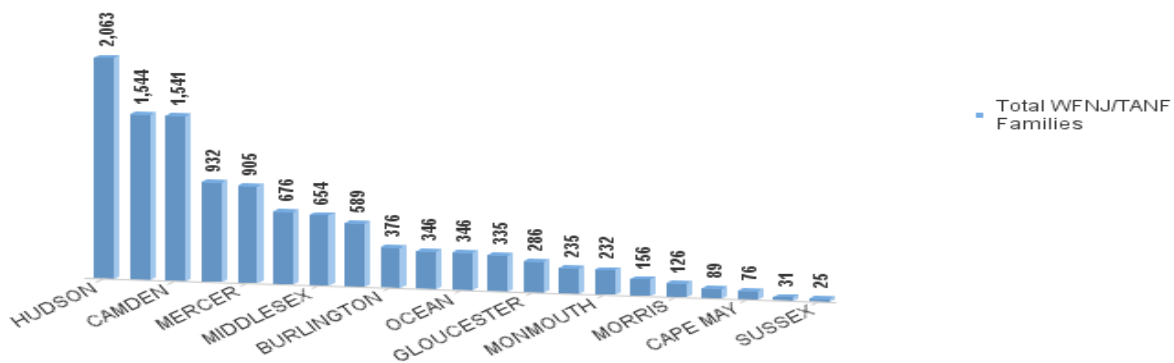

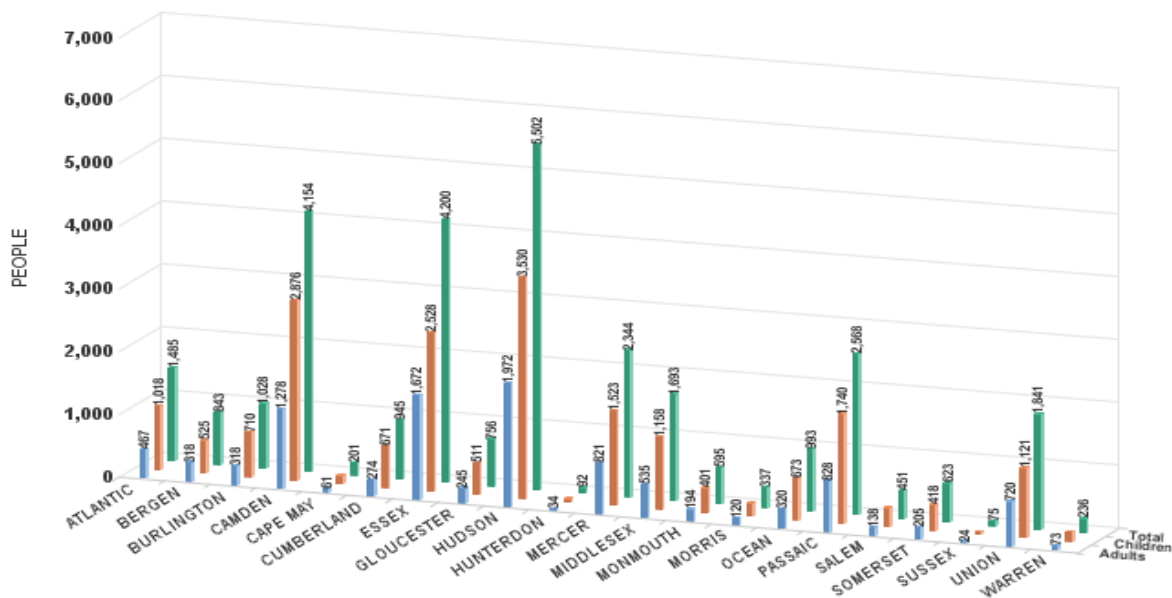

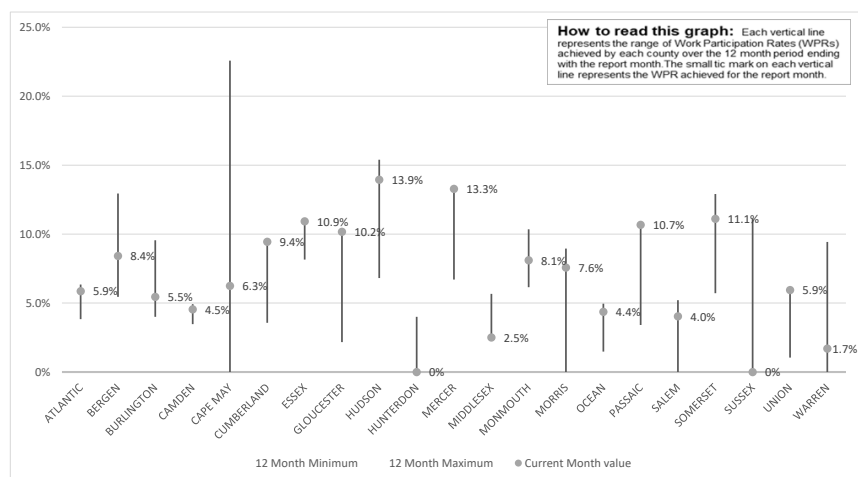

Ending with OCTOBER 2024**

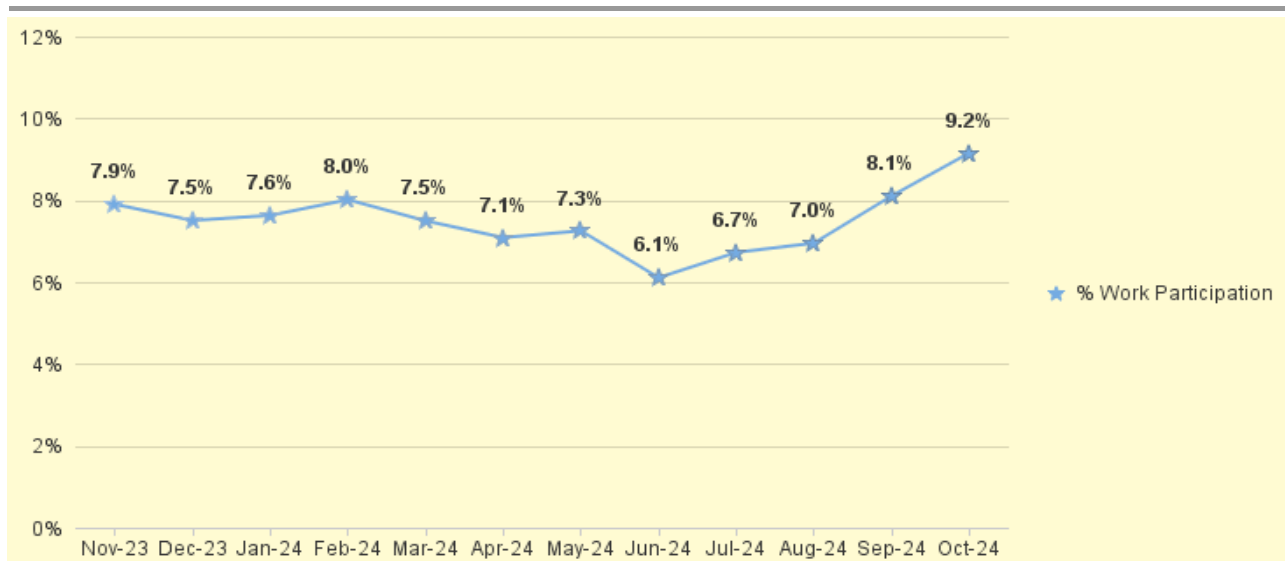

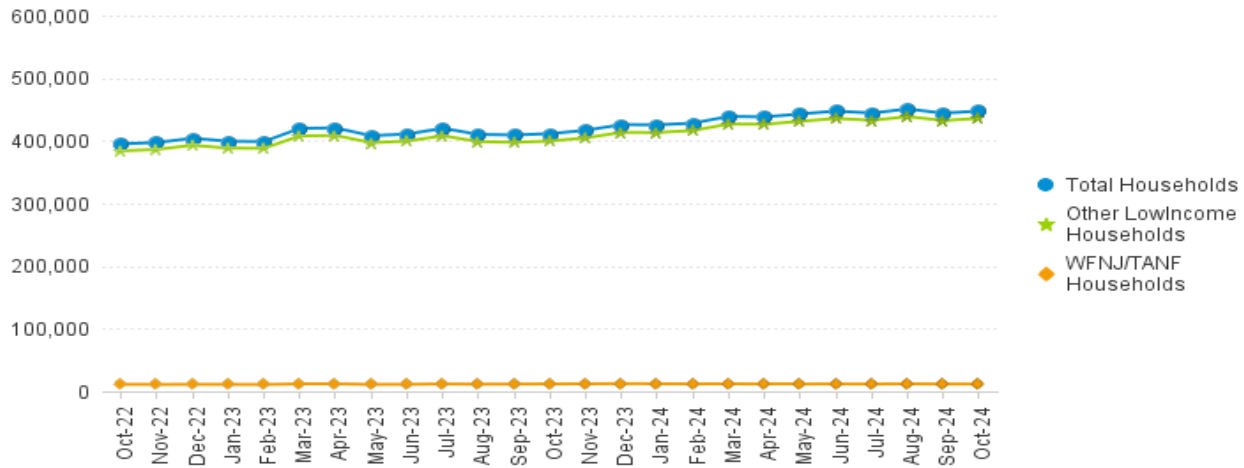

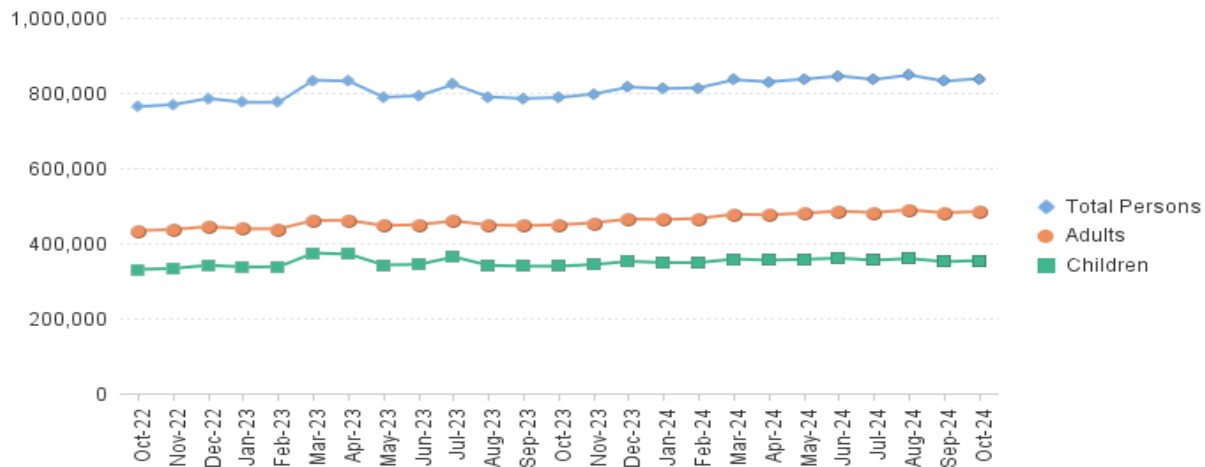

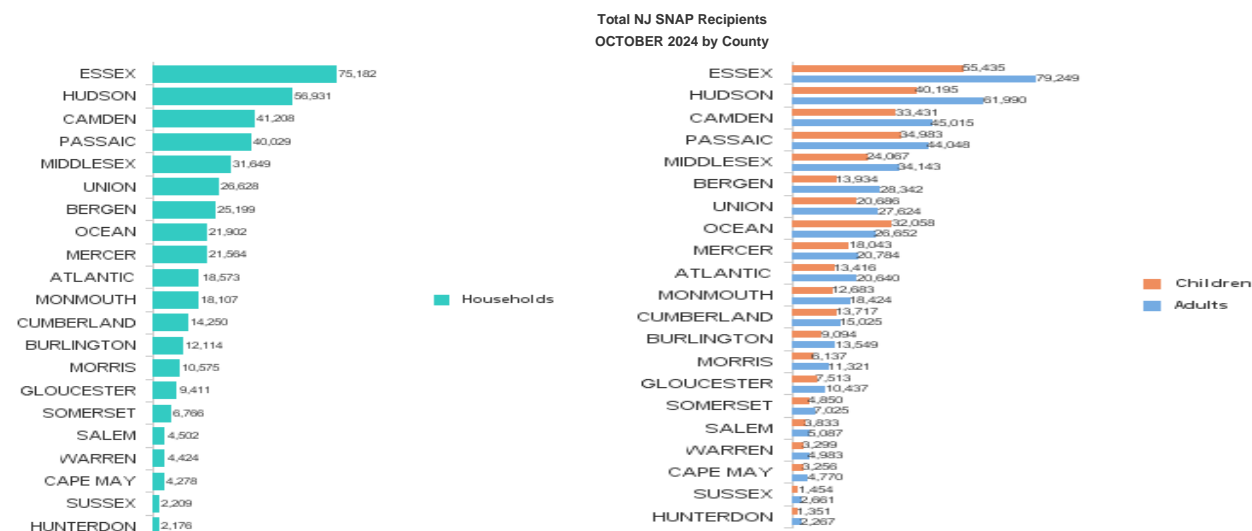

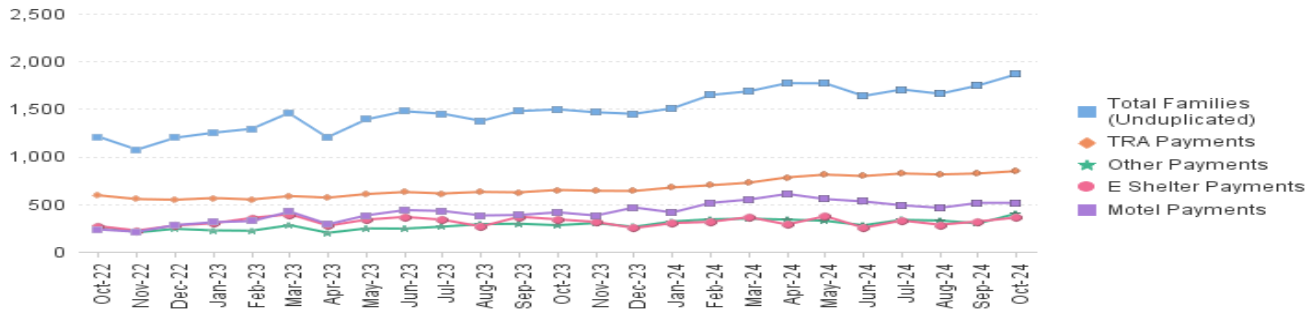

## **ACRONYMS**

**EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE (EA)** - Payments to those eligible for WFNJ/TANF or WFNJ/GA, authorized during the 30 consecutive days immediately following the emergency (defined as a substantial loss of shelter, food, clothing, or household furnishings by fire, flood or other similar disaster) or if eligible individual or family is in an imminent or actual state of homelessness.

**NJ SNAP** - Formerly the Food Stamp Program, now known as NJ SNAP (NJ Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program) authorized by Congress as a nutritional supplement program to provide low income households with more food of greater variety and better nutrition. Program eligibility is based on household income, resources, and expenses for medical, shelter, and dependent care. CWA staff refers certain recipients to the New Jersey Department of Labor for participation in the Food Stamp Employment and Training Program.

**FAMIS:** Family Assistance Management Information System

**GAAS:** General Assistance Automated System

**NJKIDS:** New Jersey Kids Deserve Support (Child Support Information Management System)

**NJ MMIS SHARED DATA WAREHOUSE:** The Shared Data Warehouse (SDW) is the repository for New Jersey's DFD and Medicaid data. Since 2003, OptumInsight has administered the SDW and provided access to the data through a reporting tool known as Business Objects.

**OMEGA:** Online Management of Economic Goal Achievement

**SSI-EA:** Supplemental Security Income-Emergency Assistance

**WFNJ:** Work First New Jersey - Fully implemented July 1, 1997, this is New Jersey's welfare reform program which responds to the requirements of the Federal Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act (**PRWORA**) of 1996. PRWORA established Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (**TANF**) as the replacement for AFDC cash assistance. WFNJ includes two segments, **WFNJ/TANF** for families with children, and **WFNJ/GA** (General Assistance) for single adults and couples without dependent children. WFNJ emphasizes achieving self-sufficiency and limits lifetime receipt of financial assistance to a total of five years.
