Approved Trainings for Enrollment as a NJ FamilyCare Community Doula

Under NJ FamilyCare (Medicaid), doula services will be delivered by providers with community doula training from an approved training program. ¹ Community doulas are equipped to meet the needs of our NJ FamilyCare members and other under-served communities.

Doula training programs must be approved by the New Jersey Department of Human Services (NJ-DHS)—in consultation with the NJ Department of Health (NJ-DOH). Approved community doula training programs must include:

- core competency training that includes evidence-based perinatal education, birth plan development, continuous support during labor, comfort measures, and infant feeding
- practical (hands-on) experience, including prenatal, labor, birth and postpartum observation/support
- community-based/cultural competency training that includes delivering person-centered and trauma-informed care, and facilitating access to NJ-specific community-based resources
- HIPAA training
- adult/infant CPR certification
- relevant readings associated with classroom hours, cultural competency, HIPAA and CPR training, and practical experience

Doula applicants must submit documentation of completed training(s) with provider applications.

Resources for Enrollment as a Fee-for-Service NJ FamilyCare community doula

Enrollment is required to receive reimbursement for doula services provided to NJ FamilyCare members.

Doula Guides work for NJ-DHS and support doulas through fee-for-service enrollment—including answering questions, sending reminders, requesting required documentation, and providing next steps.
