

On the day of the scheduled hearing, Petitioner provided Hudson with paystubs which accurately reflect Petitioner's income, from March 2018. After reviewing the documents, Hudson concluded that Petitioner was eligible to continue receiving Medicaid benefits at the same level he was receiving before the termination. The parties entered into a settlement on the record whereby Hudson agreed that Petitioner's income did not exceed the eligibility limits and granted Petitioner eligibility effective April 1, 2018.


By Initial Decision dated May 4, 2018, the ALJ approved the Settlement Agreement because it was consistent with the law, fully disposed of all issues in controversy and was voluntarily entered into by both parties in accordance with N.J.A.C. 1:11-19.1.

Based on my review of the record, I concur with the ALJ's findings and hereby ADOPT the Settlement Agreement.
