

Petitioner's prior residences, her bank accounts and transfers she made during the look-back period. Petitioner, through her authorized representative Future Care Consultants, failed to provide the information and, after a second request for information was sent on October 9, 2018, the application was denied. Petitioner then provided the information and Monmouth County discovered that Petitioner had active coverage with NJ Family Care. Petitioner provided no information about this application to Monmouth County. Pursuant to N.J.A.C. 10:71-1.6(a)(3) Petitioner cannot have duplicative coverage and the case was denied.

Petitioner is represented by counsel for the nursing home at the hearing. She no longer resides there. As evidenced by the production of claims denials, the only issue counsel is seeking to resolve is to have the facility paid for services prior to September 2018.


The Initial Decision found that Monmouth County should have processed the case including reviewing Petitioner's assets for transfers which would not be considered in her NJ FamilyCare application. I agree with this determination and hereby RETURN the matter to Monmouth County.
