1.	Does DMHAS have any guidance on what the anticipated length of stay would be for these individuals for this initiative?	No. It depends on the client. Some clients may be ready to move on after 3 months and be able to support themselves; others may take longer. Funding ends September 29, 2026.		
2.	Would DMHAS consider a seasonal program, where young adults being discharged from WM/STR this spring could enter into this program for 5-6 months and live and work in a shore community?	Yes. The program ends September 29, 2026. If there is recovery housing in shore communities, that is fine. There needs to be a sustainability plan as to what happens next with the client.		
3.	On page 3 of the RLI, the project term is listed as operating through September 29, 2026. On page 9 of the RLI, it indicates that the contract may be renewable for four additional one-year terms. Can you please provide clarification on whether these option years will be offered and factors that influence that possibility?	Funding is subject to the availability of federal funding and is currently available until September 29, 2026.
