She spoke of NJ 2-1-1's primary mission which is to reduce the confusion and frustration of finding resources by providing the best real-time information. Mrs. spoke about how her agency was able to address the vital human needs created as a result of Super Storm Sandy - from preparedness, through response and into recovery. 2-1-1 also provides the following services: The Home Energy Assistance Hotline; the Addiction Services Hotline; initial screening for the state's Kinship Navigator program; works closely with VOAD (Volunteer Organizations Active in Disasters) and NJ Office of Emergency Management in disaster preparedness, response and recovery; and so much more.

Email to come.</li> <li>Discussion: Purpose of the linkage event is to solicit and collect information from consumers and use the information to help reduce stigma associated with addiction and recovery. Discussions should also focus on Client-Centered Treatment.</li> <li>The event will be scheduled for sometime in October, preferably on a Friday morning from 9:30am to 1:30am. It was suggested that the event be held at the new Recovery Center in Voorhees.</li> <li>The CAC has agreed to commence getting information about appropriate speakers, and to recruit facilitators activities such as icebreakers. CAC members are urged to do their own research to identify who would are likely to be the best presenters. The recommended speakers will write a paper explaining their presentation and background, and then the members will decide if they'd be a good speaker.</li> <li>Some suggested topics should include: defining evidence-based client center treatment, and explaining that evidence-based is relevant to the people that you are servicing.</li> <li>The CAC members identified that the priority attendance for the event should focus on consumers rather than professionals.</li> <li>It was suggested that the event be promoted at outpatient/inpatient programs, residential facilities, and drug court.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Ann will send info about what is helpful in the planning</li> <li>Members of the CAC who are not in attendance are urged to suggest names of speakers via email.</li> <li>Ann to schedule conference call. Barbara noted that her unit received a total of 687 complaints and reportable events in 2012; about 520 were client complaints including 380 of outpatient clients.
