SUBJECT: Requirements for Admission to the New Jersey
Psychiatric Residency Program
Applicability: H

I. Three Year Psychiatric Residency Program

A. American Medical Graduate

1. The physician is a graduate of an AMA (American Medical Association) approved medical college.
2. The physician has an AMA approved internship or its equivalent. The types of training described below are considered to be equivalent to one year of internship.
 - a. One year of AMA training in Internal Medicine, Pediatrics or Family Practice or,
 - b. Clinical experience which comprises the "Essentials of Internship" acquired during the fourth year of medical school. This refers to certain medical schools in the United States where a special program has been developed combining the curriculum of the fourth year with the "Essentials of Internship".

This trend in medical education has been developed during recent years and it is approved by the AMA. The applicant who is a graduate of such a medical school must present a letter from the Dean of the school stating that there is such a program and that the graduate received the essentials of internship during the fourth year.

3. The physician has received the approval of the Residency Selection Committee and/or Credentials Committee.

B. American Osteopathic Graduate

1. The physician is a graduate of an osteopathic school in the United States.
2. The physician has one year of approved AMA or AOA (American Osteopathic Association) training.
3. The physician has received the approval of the Residency Selection Committee and/or Credentials Committee.
