DEFINITION	Under the supervision of the Supervisor of Eye Health Services, Commission for the Blind and Visually Impaired, Department of Human Services, does the field and office work involved in the Amblyopia Program and the Glaucoma Program, and assists in promoting and organizing local community efforts throughout the state concerned with the prevention of blindness, with the particular emphasis upon Amblyopia detection and Glaucoma Control; does related work as required. EDUCATION	Graduation from an accredited college with a Bachelor's degree.						
EXPERIENCE							
	One (1) year of paid professional experience in prevention of blindness, Social Work, Public Health, or a Program for the Blind which shall have included interpretation of services and programs to agencies and the general public. <b>Note:</b> Applicants who do not possess the required education may substitute experience as indicated on a year for year basis.

NOTE FOR FOREIGN DEGREES	Degrees and/or transcripts issued by a college or university outside of the United States must be evaluated by a reputable evaluation service at your expense. The evaluation must be included with your submission. Failure to submit the required evaluation may result in an ineligibility determination.						
LICENSE	Appointees will be required to possess a driver's license valid in New Jersey only if the operation of a vehicle, rather than employee mobility, is necessary to perform the essential duties of the position.						
RESIDENCY	IMPORTANT NOTICE Effective 9/1/11, NJ PL 70 (NJ First Act), requires all State employees to reside in New Jersey, unless exempted under the law, or current employees who live out-of-state and do not have a break-in service of more than 7 calendar days, as they are "grandfathered." New employees or current employees who were not grandfathered and who live out-of-state have one year after the date of employment to relocate their residence to New Jersey or request an exemption. Current employees who reside in NJ must retain NJ residency, unless he/she obtains an exemption. Employees who fail to meet the residency requirements or obtain an exemption will be removed from employment.						
Νοτε	Applicable special re-employment list established as a result of a layoff will be used before any promotions are made. All State workers are required to be fully vaccinated or submit to weekly COVID testing as of October 18 <sup>th</sup> , 2021.
