Notice of Receipt of Petition for Rulemaking Workplace Violence Prevention, Training, and Accountability

Petitioner: Caleb L. McGillvary.

Take notice that on July 27, 2026, the Department of Human Services (Department) received a petition for rulemaking from Caleb L. McGillvary seeking new rules for Department-licensed facilities and employees regarding workplace violence prevention, training, and accountability, specifically, client-perpetrated workplace violence against social workers and healthcare workers. The rules would require enhanced workplace violence prevention requirements, reporting requirements, alarm and alert system provisions, behavioral expectation signs posted in Department-licensed facilities, anti-retaliation provisions, and annual audits.

In accordance with the provisions at N.J.A.C. 1:30-4.3 and 10:1-4.3, the Department will subsequently mail to the petitioner and file with the Office of Administrative Law a notice of action on the petition.

NEW JERSEY STATE COUNCIL ON THE ARTS

Notice of Applications Available for General Operating Support and General Program Support for Fiscal Years 2028 to 2030 (July 1, 2027 to June 30, 2030)

Take notice that the New Jersey State Council on the Arts, acting pursuant to the authority of P.L. 1966, c. 214, hereby announces the availability of the following grant program:

Name of program: Fiscal Year 2028 Organizational Grants Program, including grants in the following categories:

General Operating Support (multi-year support)

General Program Support (multi-year support)

Purpose: To stimulate and encourage the production and presentation of the arts in New Jersey and to foster public interest in and support of the arts in New Jersey through the award of grants to eligible organizations. Grants through this program are exclusively to support arts organizations and programs for fiscal years 2028 through 2030 (July 1, 2027 to June 30, 2030).

Eligible applicants: Must be a New Jersey incorporated, nonprofit organization that is tax exempt pursuant to section 501(c)3 by determination of the Internal Revenue Service and registered with the Charities Registration Bureau or be a unit of local government in New Jersey; an organization in "good standing," which includes compliance with current Arts Council requirements, if currently a New Jersey Department of State grantee; registered in the Federal System for Award Management and have its CAGE and UEI codes at the time of application; and must comply with all pertinent State and Federal regulations and laws. The applicant must also comply with GOS- or GPS-specific eligibility requirements as outlined in the respective guidelines.

Ineligible applicants: Organizations that are unincorporated, incorporated in another state, or incorporated as profit-making entities; organizations, agencies, institutions, or projects that do not have organizational goals related to the arts or a specific arts program to propose; and organizations that are local in public impact.

Grant size: Grants will range in size for General Operating Support and General Program Support, but will not exceed 25 percent of the program budget for General Program Support grants.

Amount of available funding for the program: Will depend on the finalization of the Council's legislative appropriation for FY28.

Match: There is no match for General Operating Support. The required match is 3:1 for General Program Support grants. In-kind contributions are not allowed as any part of the match. Indirect costs may not be included.

Deadline for submission: Complete applications for General Operating Support and General Program Support must be e-filed no later than November 19, 2026, at 12:00 P.M. (noon).

Decisions: All complete applications from eligible applicants will be evaluated according to the published criteria for evaluation by independent peer panels of experts appropriate to the category or arts discipline of the applicant. The results of the panel are further reviewed by the Council. The Council's final recommendations are voted on by the full Council at its annual meeting, tentatively scheduled for July 21, 2027. Applicants are notified in writing of the Council's decision immediately following the annual meeting.

Notice of Action on Petition for Plan Endorsement and Amendments to the State Plan Policy Map

Petitioner: City of Wildwood, Cape May County, New Jersey.

Take notice that on August 14, 2019, the New Jersey State Planning Commission (Commission) received a petition from the City of Wildwood (City), Cape May County, pursuant to N.J.A.C. 15:30-7, to seek Plan Endorsement of its planning documents and amend the State environmental justice, and social equity, the OPA prepared the Plan Implementation Agreement (PIA), which set forth the outstanding actions for relevant State agencies and the City to take, including the timeframe(s) for completion of those requirements. The PIA was negotiated and agreed upon between the relevant State agencies and the City pursuant to N.J.A.C. 15:30-7.15 (Exhibit B).

In reviewing the petition, the Commission concluded that the City made significant progress in their commitment to comprehensive planning and sustainable land use, which will be further advanced through receiving Plan Endorsement, the approval of requested amendments to the State Plan Policy Map, and the implementation of the PIA. The PIA was approved by resolution by the City on May 13, 2026. The requested amendments to the State Plan Policy Map were approved by resolution by the City on May 13, 2026.

The Commission adopted Resolution 2026-06 that granted Plan Endorsement on August 5, 2026, and modified the State Plan Policy Map and PIA.

A copy of this notice has been mailed to the petitioner, as well as those entities specified at N.J.A.C. 15:30-1.7. Development and Redevelopment Plan (State Plan) Policy Map. The petition and supporting documents were received and comprehensively reviewed by the Office of Planning Advocacy (OPA) and relevant State agencies represented by the Commission.

The City submitted a Municipal Self-Assessment report on March 9, 2022. The OPA and relevant State agencies achieved consensus with the City on consistency and mapping to create a regional center designation and a core designation, as shown in the Map, Exhibit A. To ensure consistency in achieving the goals and policies of the State Plan and several planning priorities of increased State emphasis, including enhanced measures to address climate resilience, sustainability, environmental justice, and social equity, the OPA prepared the Plan Implementation Agreement (PIA), which set forth the outstanding actions
