Alternative Approaches to Pain Management for Older Adults

TAKE NOTICE that, in compliance with N.J.S.A. 52:14-34.4, 34.5 and 34.6, the Division of Mental Health and Addiction Services (DMHAS) hereby announces the availability of the grant program funds described herein.

Program Name: Alternative Approaches to Pain Management for Older Adults

Purpose: This Request for Proposals (RFP) is issued by the New Jersey Department of Human Services (DHS), Division of Mental Health and Addiction Services (DMHAS) for educational programs regarding Alternative Approaches to Pain Management for Older Adults. This RFP is funded through the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration's (SAMHSA) State Opioid Repose (short title: SOR) grant. The SOR grant period is 9/30/18 to 9/29/20. Funding is available for FFY 2019 and may be available for FFY 2020. Total annualized funding is \$375,000 subject to Federal appropriations. DMHAS anticipates making up to five (5) awards of \$75,000 each.

Contracts were awarded to establish five (5) educational programs from an Alternative Approaches to Pain Management for Older Adults RFP issued in October 2017. This RFP is for five new educational programs from organizations that did not receive an award from the RFP issued in October 2017.

Growing awareness of the extent and dangers of misuse of prescription medications among all populations - especially painkillers—has led to a major public health effort to control access to these substances. These endeavors have led to some decline in the number of prescriptions being written, but the situation continues to be a serious problem. It is noteworthy that better pain management, which would vastly reduce the excessive use and/or addiction to prescription painkillers, does not appear to be on the agenda while efforts to control access to such medications make headlines. DMHAS seeks to fund programs that will provide education to older adults (age 60+) on alternatives to opioid analgesics as a means of dealing with acute or chronic pain.

Available Funding Amount: Total annualized funding is \$375,000 subject to Federal appropriations. DMHAS anticipates making up to five (5) awards of \$75,000 each. Funding is available for FFY 2019 and may be available for FFY 2020.

Who Can Apply/Bidder Qualifications: To be eligible for consideration for this RFP, the bidder must satisfy the following requirements:


- Must NOT be an awardee of DMHAS' Alternative Approaches to Pain Management for Older Adults RFP issued in October 2017;
- The bidder may be a non-profit or for-profit entity or governmental entity;
- For a bidder that has a contract with DMHAS in place when this RFP is issued, that bidder must have all outstanding Plans of Correction (PoC) for deficiencies submitted to DMHAS for approval prior to submission;
- The bidder must be fiscally viable based upon an assessment of the bidder's audited financial statements. If a bidder is determined, in DMHAS' sole discretion, to be insolvent or to present insolvency within the twelve (12) months after bid submission, DMHAS will deem the proposal ineligible for contract award;
- The bidder must not appear on the State of New Jersey Consolidated Debarment Report at <http://www.state.nj.us/treasury/revenue/debarment/debarsearch.shtml> or be suspended or debarred by any other State or Federal entity from receiving funds;
- The bidder shall not employ a member of the Board of Directors in a consultant capacity; and
- Pursuant to N.J.S.A. 52:32-44, a for-profit bidder and each proposed subcontractor must have a valid Business Registration Certificate on file with the Division of Revenue, i.e., this statutory requirement does not apply to non-profit organizations, private colleges and universities, or state and municipal agencies.

Proposal Procedure: Effective December 6, 2018, the Request for Proposal (RFP) is available at <https://www.state.nj.us/humanservices/providers/grants/>. A proposal must be submitted that comports with the RFP requirements and instructions.
