FINAL DECISION

Petitioner appeals from Respondent Agency's termination of his Work First New Jersey/General Assistance ("WFNJ/GA") benefits. The Agency terminated Petitioner's WFNJ/GA benefits, as it contended that Petitioner had exhausted his cumulative lifetime limit. Because Petitioner appealed, the matter was transmitted to the Office of Administrative Law for a hearing. On December 2, 2014, the Honorable W. Todd Miller, Administrative Law Judge ("ALJ"), held a plenary hearing, took testimony and admitted documents. On December 8, 2014, the ALJ issued his Initial Decision affirming the Agency's determination.

No Exceptions to the Initial Decision were filed.

As the Director of the Division of Family Development, Department of Human Services, I have considered the record in this matter and the ALJ's Initial Decision and hereby ADOPT the ALJ's Initial Decision and AFFIRM the Agency determination.

The goal of WFNJ is help the recipient achieve self-sufficiency through obtaining employment and removal from the program. See N.J.S.A. 44:10-62(a). Pursuant to N.J.A.C. 10:90-2.3(a), "eligibility for cash assistance benefits shall be limited to a lifetime total of 60 cumulative months for an adult individual recipient." See also N.J.A.C. 10:90-1.1(d) ("Assistance benefits provided under WFNJ are time-limited and considered a temporary cash subsidy"). However, an individual may receive additional months of cash assistance if he/she qualifies for an exemption to, or extension of, the time limit, as set forth at N.J.A.C. 10:90-2.4 and -2.5 respectively.

WFNJ/GA benefits and has not met the criteria for an exemption or an extension of the time limit as set forth in N.J.A.C. 10:90-2.4 and -2.5. Petitioner has received a total of 72 months of cash assistance, including 24 months under the Supportive Assistance to Individuals and Families ("SAIF") Program. See Initial Decision at 2; see also Exhibit R-1 at 10-11. Although Petitioner has been diagnosed with anxiety, asthma, and alcohol dependence, none of these diagnoses rise to the level to permit an additional hardship extension permitted under the regulations. Moreover, Petitioner has already surpassed the twelve cumulative months for a hardship extension beyond the 60 month limit. Id. at 3. Thus, I concur with the ALJ that the Agency's termination of WFNJ/GA benefits was appropriate.

Accordingly, the Initial Decision in this matter is ADOPTED and the Agency's action is hereby AFFIRMED.
