- Letter Certifying Revised Housing Unit/Population Counts
- Affected Government Units can use the new official Census Count for all programs requiring official 2010 Census Data
- Corrected data will be used for creating Population Estimates for this decade
- Inventory of corrections will be posted on American FactFinder for Data Users.
