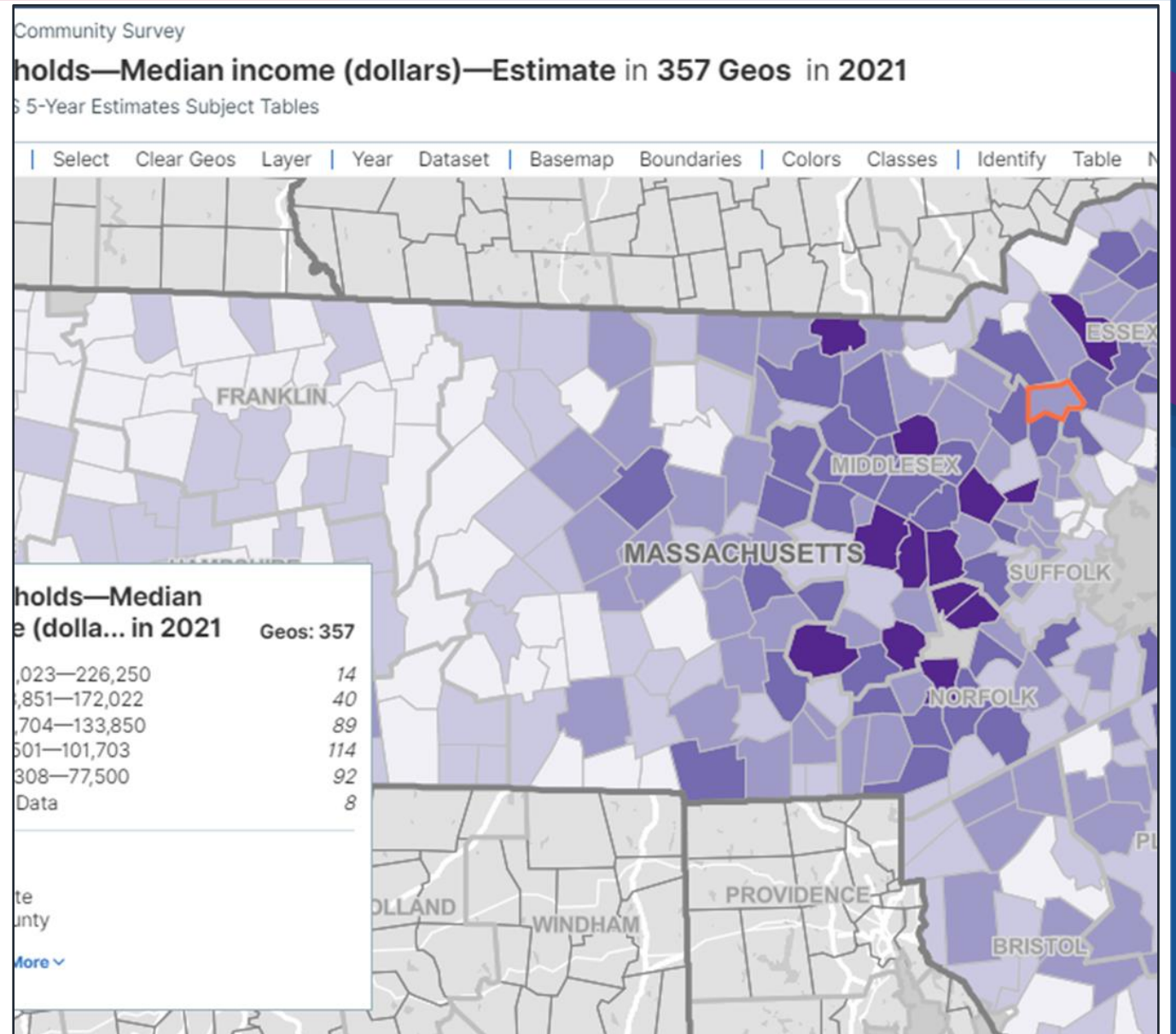

Community Survey, 5-year estimates

Community Survey (ACS) is an ongoing survey administered by the U.S. Census Bureau which provides information on people, economy, and housing. The interface maps some of the most in-demand data for cities and towns.

ACS provides data as 5-year estimates. This means that the data is collected over a 5-year interval; for 2020, this is between 2016 and 2020. The 2020 data release is the first that provides non-overlapping intervals, 2006-2010 (2010 5-year estimates), 2011-2015 (2015 5-year estimates), and 2016-2020 (2020 5-year estimates). 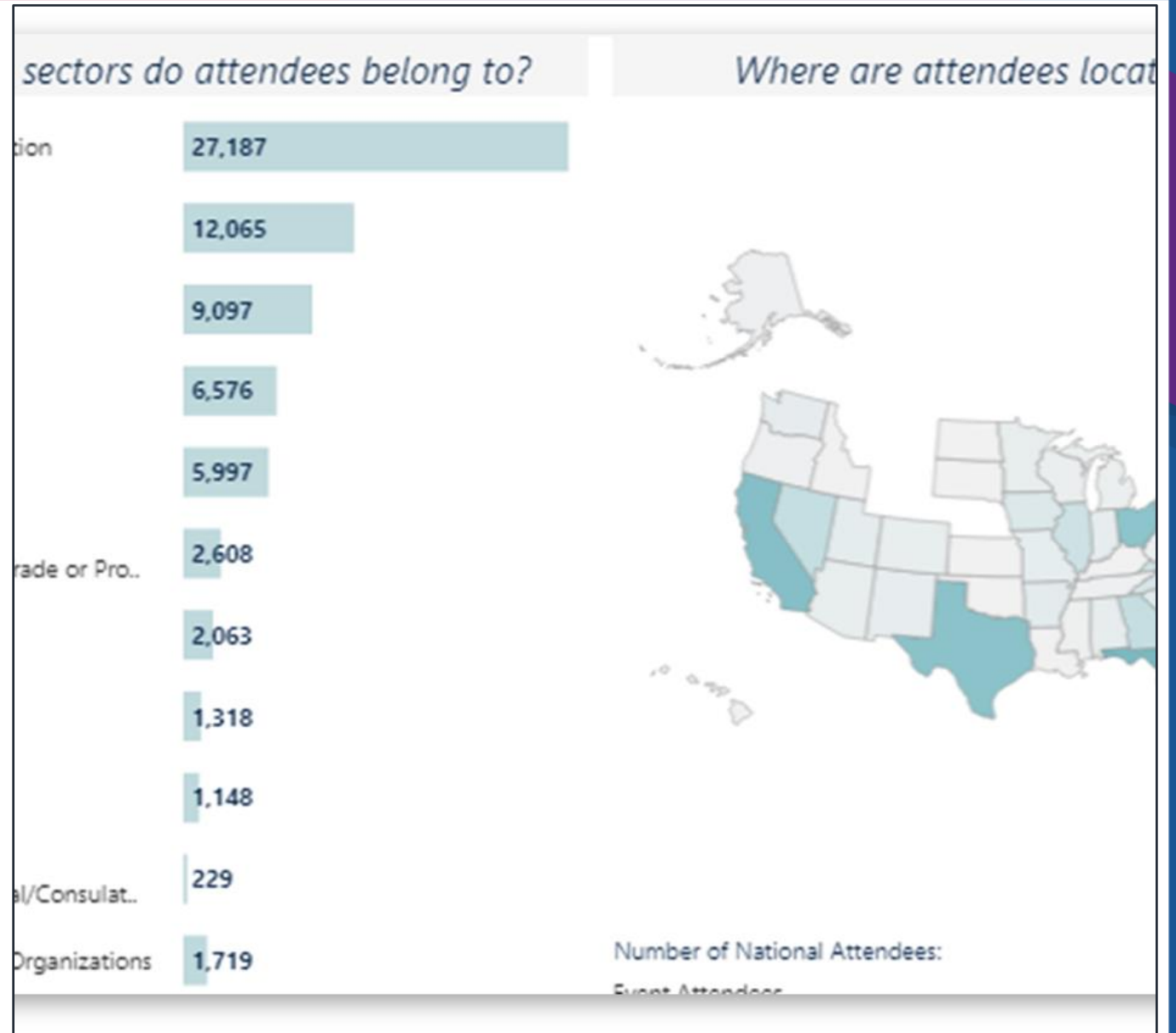
Bachelor Degree or Higher

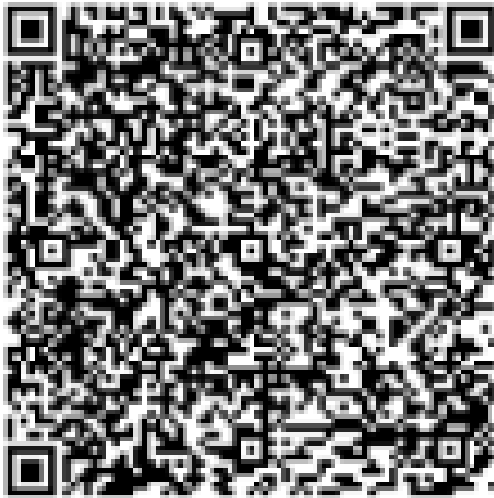
Data Dissemination & Training About Us
