Thomas P. Canzanella Twenty First Century Responders Protection Act

Reporting Requirements

Governor Phil Murphy signed into law the "Thomas P. Canzanella Twenty First Century Responders Protection Act." This legislation was enacted to modernize the workers' compensation system in this State to ensure that all public safety workers' critical needs are met and assure that these workers are not denied a level of support which is commensurate to the sacrifices they and their families make for the safety and wellbeing of the citizens of this State and nation. Public safety workers are New Jersey's first line of defense in the event of catastrophic emergencies, epidemics and terrorist attacks. If a public safety worker can demonstrate that in the course of his or her employment, the worker is exposed to excretions, secretions, blood or other bodily fluids or airborne exposure to a serious communicable disease or any pathogen or biological toxin then all care or treatment of the public safety workers is compensable pursuant to NJSA 34:15-1, et seq. The employer has the right to rebut this allegation by a preponderance of the evidence showing that the exposure is not linked to the occurrence of the disease.

Pursuant to NJSA 34:15-31.10, the NJ Division of Workers' Compensation is required to report the following information on an annual basis to the NJ Legislature: a. the number of claim petitions with respect to which a determination was rendered by the Division of Workers' Compensation during the previous calendar year that an injury or illness falls in this category and is compensable and b. the total amount of workers' compensation benefits awarded by the Division of Workers' Compensation for the claim petitions counted under subsection a. of this section, including medical benefits, temporary total disability benefits, permanent partial benefits, and permanent total benefits.

Due to the reporting requirements, when a case pursuant to this act concludes, it is the responsibility of the petitioner's attorney to complete the Thomas P. Canzanella Twenty First Century First Respondent Protection Act Addendum (WC-156) and submit along with the settlement/judgment order for the Judge of Compensation's signature. The addendum is attached to this memorandum and can also be found on the Division's website.
