DECISION OF THE DIVISION OF GAMING ENFORCEMENT TO TEMPORARILY SUSPEND CASINO/HOTEL OPERATIONS PURSUANT TO N.J.S.A. 5:12-96

ORDER REINSTATING
CERTIFICATES OF
OPERATION OF THE
TWELVE CASINO LICENSEES

The Governor of the State of New Jersey, Chris Christie, having issued Executive Order 104 on October 27, 2012 declaring a State of Emergency due to severe weather conditions caused by Hurricane Sandy; and

Governor Chris Christie, through various state and local emergency management and law enforcement agencies, having authorized and issued additional orders to secure the safety of the citizens of New Jersey, including the mandatory evacuation of the residents of Atlantic City; and

The Division of Gaming Enforcement (Division) on its own motion, having initiated proceedings pursuant to the Casino Control Act, *N.J.S.A.* 5:12-1et seq., and more specifically Section 96 of that law, to temporarily suspend the operations of the 12 casino licensees which closed all hotel, casino and simulcast facilities to the public and suspended all gaming and simulcast wagering activity; and

The Governor having vacated the mandatory evacuation order for the residents of Atlantic City on November 2, 2012; and

The Division having reviewed and assessed the status and condition of each casino property, including the casino floor, its equipment, surveillance, security, gaming related computer systems and all related facilities;

IT IS on this 2nd day of November, 2012, at 10:00 am **ORDERED** that the Division's October 27, 2012 Order Temporarily Suspending Casino/Hotel Operations that suspended the Certificates of Operation held by the twelve casino licensees is vacated; and

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that all hotel, casino and simulcast facilities are authorized to be open to the public; and

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the twelve casino licensees are permitted to recommence casino gaming and wagering activities provided each has received specific authorization to do so by the Division.
