## SUPPLEMENTAL:

Except as to tapes which have already been released by the State, paragraphs 2 and 3 of the March 31, 2005, order is reversed. The State's claims of need to protect innocent third parties and criminal investigative methods and techniques, along with the motions to supplement the record, are remanded to the trial judge for an in camera proceeding limited to those claims. The proceeding shall consist of a review of the Vaughn indices and transcripts which have been provided by the State. We leave it to the discretion of the trial judge to determine the need to listen to some or all of the tapes, and/or to direct the State to provide more specific description of what is contained on the tapes supporting its innocent third party and criminal investigative methods and technique claims.

We do not retain jurisdiction. Upon completion of the in camera proceeding and the necessary findings of fact and conclusions of law,

the State may again seek leave to appeal. We express no view as to the outcome should further interlocutory appellate review be sought.
